Providing high quality child care is a key factor in reaching that goal.

Registered Apprenticeship programs for child development are specifically designed to increase the education and competency level of those entrusted with our young children. The benefits are far reaching.

Childcare providers and centers have greater access to qualified workers who possess the knowledge and skills to nurture, educate, and care for children in the early, vital stages of development. Also, employee retention rates are higher in organizations that sponsor apprenticeship training.

Companies that sponsor child care centers staffed with committed, well-trained personnel are better able to recruit and retain employees.



Children receive high quality care from a well-trained staff and have a safe, appropriate early learning environment in which to learn and grow.

Parents know their children receive consistent, high quality care from a knowledgeable and committed staff, and they feel connected to the care givers.

Apprentices receive valuable technical and practical instruction that elevates their stature in the child care profession and rewards them with increased compensation.

Caring, Confident, Committed

People interested in a career in child development are caring individuals. But being prepared to handle the challenges of child care takes more than a concern for children; it takes extensive training and experience. Apprentices receive instruction that directly applies to their work with children and families. Course content includes:

- Child growth and development
- Health, safety, and nutrition
- Developmentally appropriate and inclusive practices
- Child observation, record keeping, and assessment
- Classroom design

- Guidance and discipline
- Culturally relevant curriculum
- Family and community relationships
- Administration and supervision
- Leadership skills

As apprentices progress, they are able to take on greater responsibility and their confidence builds. With experience and opportunity for advancement comes increased commitment to their jobs, their profession, and the children.



What is Apprenticeship?

R egistered Apprenticeship is a formalized, structured program combining on-the-job learning and related instruction in which paid employees receive technical and practical training in a highly skilled occupation. Apprenticeship is industry-driven career training. Industry determines the skills that are essential to sustain a quality workforce.

The time requirements and substance of an apprenticeship training program are occupation dependent. In each program, apprentices work and learn under the direction of qualified mentors/journeyworkers who are experienced in their professional field. Over time, apprentices are provided diverse and complex training that leads to becoming highly skilled in their chosen occupations.
