NOTICE OF COMMISSION MEETINGS

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

CIVIL ACTION FILED AGAINST AMERICAN PRINCIPALS HOLDINGS, INC.

The Los Angeles Regional Office filed a complaint on June 7 seeking injunctive and ancillary relief in the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of California against American Principals Holdings, Inc. (APHI) located in Del Mar, California. The complaint alleges that from 1979 through March 31, 1984, APHI, a holding company, through seven wholly-owned subsidiaries, engaged in an integrated interstate offering of non-exempt unregistered securities in the form of limited partnership interests and debentures purportedly providing substantial tax advantages as well as long-term

capital gains and current income to investors. Through this offering, which involved interests in real estate, windmills, horsebreeding and equipment leasing, APHI raised approximately \$70 million from over 2,500 investors nationwide. Further, the complaint alleges that APHI made material misrepresentations and omissions concerning: the use of investors' funds; that investors' funds in certain limited partnerships were commingled with other funds in other limited partnerships; that investors' funds were loaned to principals of APHI for their personal expenses and to general partners of other limited partnerships; that existing partnerships depended upon the influx of new investors' funds into other partnerships; that downpayments required for real estate and other acquisitions were less than disclosed; and that required financing for these acquisitions would be greater than disclosed. Finally, the complaint seeks appropriate ancillary relief. (SEC v. American Principals Holdings, Inc., SD CA, Civil Action No. 84-1383-N(M)). (LR-10419)

DALHAR CORPORATION ENJOINED

The Seattle Regional Office announced that on May 30 the U.S. District Court in Boise, Idaho granted a decree of permanent injunction by default permanently enjoining Dalhar Corporation, an Oklahoma corporation, from further violations of various anti-fraud, reporting and proxy provisions of the securities laws and rules. (SEC v. Sierra Life Insurance Co., et al., Civil Action No. 78-1016, D. Idaho). (LR-10420)

EASTMAN AND NORTH AMERICAN INTERNATIONAL CORP. ENJOINED

The Seattle Regional Office announced that on June 7 the U.S. District Court in Boise, Idaho granted a consent decree permanently enjoining Gerald Lee Eastman of Orem, Utah and North American International Corporation, a Utah corporation, from future violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws and Rule 10b-5 under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. (SEC v. North American International Corp., et al., Civil Action No. 83-4164, D. Idaho). (LR-10421)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

ALLEGHENY POWER SYSTEM, INC.

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing Allegheny Power System, Inc., a registered holding company, to issue and sell from time to time not more than 2,270,110 shares of common stock under its Dividend Reinvestment and Stock Purchase Plan and its Employee Stock Ownership and Savings Plan. (Rel. 35-23333 - June 19)

CONSOLIDATED NATURAL GAS COMPANY

An order has been issued approving a proposal of Consolidated Natural Gas Company, a registered holding company, and its 13 subsidiaries for Consolidated to incur short-term debt and for Consolidated and the subsidiaries to engage in intrasystem financing. Consolidated proposes to make short-term borrowings of up to \$175 million from banks and issue and sell up to \$175 million of commercial paper and/or notes to banks. The intrasystem financing would consist of open account advances aggregating up to \$408.5 million by Consolidated to its subsidiaries; the issuance of \$131 million of long-term notes by the subsidiaries to Consolidated and the acquisition of such notes by Consolidated; revolving credit advances by Consolidated to four subsidiaries of up to \$100 million and the issuance by five subsidiaries, and acquisition by Consolidated, of \$51.1 million common stock at par value. LISTING, DELISTING AND UNLISTED TRADING ACTIONS

UNLISTED TRADING GRANTED

An order has been issued granting the application of the Philadelphia Stock Exchange for unlisted trading privileges in the common stock (\$1 par value) of U.S. Air Group, Inc. which is listed and registered on one other national securities exchange and is reported in the consolidated transaction reporting system. (Rel. 34-21060)

UNLISTED TRADING SOUGHT

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until July 9 to comment on the applications of the Midwest Stock Exchange, Inc. for unlisted trading privileges in four issues which are listed and registered on one or more other national securities exchange and are reported in the consolidated transaction reporting system. DELISTING GRANTED

An order has been issued granting the application of the Midwest Stock Exchange, Inc. to strike the common stock (\$5 par value) of Modine Manufacturing Company from listing and registration thereon. (Rel. 34-21066)

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Chicago Board Options Exchange, Inc. filed a proposed rule change under Rule 19b-4 (SR-CBOE-83-62) to amend Article VI (Board of Directors), Sections 6.1 and 6.3(d) of the CBOEs Constitution to provide that the terms of office of directors will expire at the first regular meeting of the Board of Directors following the annual meeting as well as to provide procedures for filling floor director vacancies when the number of floor directors on the Board falls below six. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of June 18. (Rel. 34-21059)

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Commission approved proposed rule changes filed under Rule 19b-4 by: The American Stock Exchange, Inc. (SR-Amex-84-9) to implement on a 12-month pilot basis an optional procedure permitting a newly listed company to choose the specialist unit in its stock from a list of seven specialist units selected by the Exchanges' Committee on Equities Allocation. The procedures also provide that, whether or not a newly listed company chooses to participate in the selection of the specialist unit, if a newly listed company becomes dissatisfied for any reason with its specialist unit within the first year of listing, it would be permitted to request a change. (Rel. 34-21062); and The Chicago Board Options Exchange, Incorporated (SR-CBOE-84-13) to permit the Board Broker or Order Book Official to withhold, on the opening or after a trading halt, bids and offers from display that are materially away from the expected market, and to treat such orders as market orders. (Rel. 34-21064)

ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved, on an accelerated basis, a proposed rule change filed by The American Stock Exchange, Inc. (SR-Amex-84-16) which would allow offerors of option products to include certain explanatory information in advertisements in conformance with recent amendments on Rule 134a under the Securities Act. (Rel. 34-21063)

Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
