COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

THE 1984 SEC GOVERNMENT-BUSINESS FORUM ON SMALL BUSINESS CAPITAL FORMATION

The Commission will hold its Third Annual SEC Government-Business Forum on Small Business Capital Formation on September 12-14, 1984 at the Sheraton National Hotel in Washington, DC. The conference will provide a forum for small businesses, government regulatory agencies, and private sector organizations concerned with small business issues to discuss, in small groups, solutions to the existing impediments to small business capital formation, particularly in the areas of taxation, securities, financial services and state capital formation.

Members of the public interested in being considered for active participation at the Forum should promptly complete and return an information card available from the Office of Small Business Policy, Division of Corporation Finance, SEC, 450 Fifth Street, NW, Stop 3-12, Washington, DC 20549. The information card will facilitate the selection of small businesspersons, lawyers, accountants and others who are knowledgeable in small business issues and who could make the most meaningful contribution to the Forum. SUBPOENAS IN WPPSS INVESTIGATION NO LONGER PUBLIC

The Supreme Court in SEC v. Jerry T. O'Brien, Inc. (6/18/84) has reversed a Ninth Circuit decision which required notification to "targets" of subpoenas issued in Commission investigations. Prior to the reversal of that Ninth Circuit decision, the Commission adopted a procedure in its investigation In the Matter of Transactions in Washington Public Power Supply System Securities (HO-1556) of making copies of subpoenas issued in that investigation available for public review at its headquarters and its Seattle Regional Office. The procedure had been adopted because of the Ninth Circuit decision. The Commission's normal practice is not to disclose subpoenas issued in its private investigations. In light of the Supreme Court decision, the Commission will resume the use of normal procedures in this investigation and will no longer make subpoenas available for public review.

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

COMPLAINT NAMES STEVEN R. BABBIDGE AND ASSOCIATES AND STEVEN R. BABBIDGE

The Los Angeles Regional Office announced that on June 4 a complaint was filed in the U.S. District Court for the Central District of California against Steven R. Babbidge and Associates (Babbidge and Associates) and Steven R. Babbidge (Babbidge) alleging violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws.

The complaint alleges that: Babbidge and Associates and its sole proprietor, Babbidge, are engaged in selling securities in the form of limited partnership interests; in the sale of interests in a limited partnership called Midland Associates, the defendants misstated and omitted to state material facts regarding the risks involved in the investment, the use of proceeds from the sale of the securities, the financial condition of Babbidge and Associates, the compensation paid to the defendants from the sale of the securities, and the amount of profit that the investors could expect from the investment; and no registration statement respecting the securities sold by the defendants was filed with the Commission. (SEC v. Steven R. Babbidge and Associates and Steven R. Babbidge, USDC CD CA, Civil Action No. 84-4130[IH]). (LR-10430)

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

STEPHEN L. WALLIS AND SHARON WILLEY PLEAD GUILTY

The New York Regional Office announced that on June 21 Stephen L. Wallis and Sharon Willey pled guilty in Federal District Court in Manhattan to an indictment charging them with participation in an insider trading scheme involving the misappropriation of material non-public information from the New York City law firm of Skadden, Arps, Slate, Meagher & Flom. Wallis and Willey also face related charges in a civil injunction action [SEC v. Stephen G. Karanzalis, et al., 84 Civil 2070, SDNY (CLB)].

Wallis, a New York City taxicab driver, and Willey, a close personal friend, pleaded guilty to conspiring with others, including former employees of Skadden Arps and fellow defendants in the SEC action, to trade in securities based upon information regarding potential tender offers and business combinations stolen from Skadden Arps. Wallis also pleaded guilty to one count of securities fraud and one count of mail fraud. (U.S. v. Stephen L. Wallis and Sharon Willey, 84 Cr. 342, SDNY). (LR-10432)

NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

Proposed rule changes have been filed under Rule 19b-4 by: The Options Clearing Corporation (SR-OCC-84-4) to add Section 1(b) to its by-laws. The proposal would enable OCC's Board of Directors to invest funds in excess of OCC's working capital in a new, wholly-owned subsidiary organized to engage in the clearance and settlement of commodity options and futures contracts. OCC anticipates that the new subsidiary, the Intermarket Clearing Corporation, will clear cash-settled commodity and futures options contracts. (Rel. 34-21039); and The Pacific Stock Exchange, Inc. (SR-PSE-84-11) to amend Sections 75 and 79 of Rule VI and Options Floor Procedure Advice B-5,

Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
