RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

INDUSTRY GUIDE AND RULES ADOPTED

The Commission is adopting rules and authorizing an industry guide to improve disclosures concerning the underwriting and claims reserving experience of property-casualty insurance underwriters. The disclosures are intended to assist investors in understanding and evaluating companies' reserving practices and the effect on reported income of adjustments to reserves established in prior periods and in comparing those practices and adjustments among entities. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

FIRST JERSEY SECURITIES, INC. AND ROBERT E. BRENNAN ENJOINED

The New York Regional Office announced that on November 20 Judge Milton Pollack, U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York, entered Orders permanently enjoining First Jersey Securities, Inc., a registered broker-dealer, and Robert E. Brennan, president and registered principal of First Jersey, from violating the anti-fraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934.

The Consents of First Jersey and Brennan resolve both SEC v. First Jersey Securities, Inc., et al. (83 Civil 0483), the "Geosearch" case as to First Jersey and Brennan, and the administrative proceeding entitled In the Matter of First Jersey Securities, Inc., et al. (3-5739), as to all respondents.

The injunction entered into by First Jersey and consented to by Brennen orders the appointment of a consultant to review, report upon and make recommendation upon First Jersey's existing sales practices, business operations and supervisory procedures to ensure that they are in compliance with the securities laws, Commission regulations and self-regulatory organization guidelines. The consultant is responsible to Judge Pollack. (SEC v. First Jersey Securities, Inc., et al., 83 civil 0483, MP). (LR-10616)

COMMISSION FILES FIRST COMPLAINT SEEKING CIVIL PENALTY UNDER INSIDER TRADING SANCTIONS ACT

The Commission filed a complaint on November 27 in the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York against Federico Ablan, Cesar Duque, Macrofin International S.A. Panama and Unisoft Systems Enhancements, Inc. for insider trading in violation of the antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. In addition to disgorgement of illegal profits (approximately \$138,000) and an injunction against future violations, the Commission is seeking to hold the defendants jointly and severally liable for a penalty of three times their illegal profits from certain trades which occurred after the passage of the Insider Trading Sanctions Act of 1984 (a maximum penalty of approximately \$210,000).

The complaint alleges that, in their capacity as agents of and advisors to a Monchik-Weber director, Ablan and Duque were made privy to material, non-public information as to The Monchik-Weber Corporation's involvement in negotiations concerning its acquisition by McGraw-Hill and that Ablan and Duque engaged in a fraudulent scheme to trade on that information through the securities account of Macrofin and with funds wholly or partially provided by Unisoft. INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

C-U FUNDING CORP.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 17 to request a hearing on an application by C-U Funding Corp. for an order exempting C-U from all provisions of the Investment Company Act to permit it to issue and sell bonds and loan the proceeds as part of the long-term financing of an electric generating plant and related facilities of Colorado-Ute Electric Association, Inc. (Rel. IC-14250 - Nov. 26)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

CONSOLIDATED NATURAL GAS COMPANY

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing Consolidated Natural Gas Company, a registered holding company, to extend until December 31, 1985 the issuance and sale of 220,391 remaining shares of common stock under its dividend reinvestment plan. (Rel. 35-23497 - Nov. 26)

LISTING, DELISTING AND UNLISTED TRADING ACTIONS

UNLISTED TRADING GRANTED

An order has been issued granting the applications of the Cincinnati Stock Exchange for unlisted trading privileges in the common stocks of 146 issues which are listed and registered on one or more other national securities exchange and are reported in the consolidated transaction reporting system. SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Commission approved the following proposed rule changes filed under Rule 19b-4 by The Philadelphia Stock Exchange, Inc.: (SR-Phlx-84-21) to permit the listing of series of foreign currency options that expire in 12 months. (Rel. 34-21512); (SR-Phlx-84-19)

to trade options on the Value Line Average Stock Index. (Rel. 34-21513); and (SR-Phlx-84-20) to permit specialists, market makers and customers to enter opening transactions against closing cabinet bids or offers in cases where there is no matching closing cabinet order. (Rel. 34-21515)

TRUST INDENTURE ACT RELEASES

ALLIED CORPORATION

An order has been issued under the Trust Indenture Act of 1939 on an application of Allied Corporation. The order states that the trusteeship of The Chase Manhattan Bank (National Association) under the following indentures is not so likely to involve a material conflict of interest as to make it necessary to disqualify The Bank from acting as trustee: (1) an indenture of The Bendix Corporation, as supplemented by a supplemental indenture under which Allied assumed, jointly and severally with Bendix, certain obligations of Bendix; (2) an indenture dated April 1, 1966 relating to Allied's 5.20% debentures, due November 1, 1991; (3) an indenture dated September 1, 1971 relating to Allied's 7-7/8% debentures, due September 1, 1996; and (4) an indenture dated October 1, 1983 relating to securities to be issued by Allied from time to time and a supplement thereto dated August 15, 1984.
