NOTICE OF COMMISSION MEETINGS

Following is a schedule of Commission meetings which will be conducted under provisions of the Government in the Sunshine Act. In general, the Commission expects to follow a schedule of holding closed meetings on Tuesdays, and open meetings on Thursday morning. Meetings on Wednesday, and if necessary on Thursday afternoons, will be either open or closed according to the requirements of agenda items under consideration.

Visitors are welcome at all open meetings, insofar as space is available.

Meetings will be held in the Commission Meeting Room, Room 1C30, at the Commission's headquarters building, 450 Fifth Street, NW, Washington, DC. Persons wishing to photograph or videotape Commission meetings must obtain permission in advance from the Secretary of the Commission. Persons wishing to tape record a Commission meeting should notify the Secretary's office 48 hours in advance of the meeting.

OPEN MEETING - TUESDAY, MAY 27, 1986 - 2:30 p.m.

The subject matter of the May 27 open meeting will be:

(1) Consideration of whether to endorse the the Investment Advisers Amendments Act of 1986 which would: (a) respond to the U.S. Supreme Court's decision in Low v. SEC; (b) facilitate sharing of adviser investigation and inspection information with state and federal law enforcement officials; (c) increase fees for registrants; (d) grant the Commission explicit statutory authority to prescribe the form of any records or filings required under the Act; and (e) make minor revisions to clarify that advisers exempt from registration by rule are treated on the same terms as those exempt by statute. (2) Consideration of whether to issue an order authorizing: (a) Middle South Energy, Inc. (MSE), a public utility subsidiary of Middle South Utilities, Inc. (MSU), a registered holding company, under the Public Utility Holding Company Act of 1935, to issue and sell up to \$300 million of first mortgage bonds; (b) the operating utility subsidiaries of MSU to consent to the assignment of the Availability Agreement by MSE as security for the bonds; and (c) MSU to consent to the assignment of the Capital Funds Agreement by MSE as security for the bonds. The Commission will also consider the comments and request for a hearing in this matter filed by Arkansas Public Service Commission. FOR FURTHER INFORMATION, PLEASE CONTACT William C. (3) Consideration of whether to propose for comment (a) new Rule 14b-2, relating to banks' obligations in connection with forwarding communications to beneficial owners; (b) corresponding and clarifying amendments to Rules 14a-1, 14a-13, 14b-1, 14c-1 and 14c-7; (c) amendments to Rules 14a-13 and 14c-7 that would permit registrants to request from both brokers and banks beneficial owner lists that exclude persons who purchased securities through an employee benefit plan; and (d) amendments to Rules 14a-3 and 14c-2 regarding when and under what conditions registrants are no longer obligated to deliver annual reports or proxy or information statements to security holders. ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

STOP ORDER ISSUED AS TO REGISTRATION STATEMENT OF CLOSE OUTS PLUS, INC.

The Commission issued an Order Instituting Proceedings under Section 8(d) of the Securities Act of 1933 and Findings and Stop Order suspending the effectiveness of the registration statement of Close Outs Plus, Inc., which became effective on January 15. Close Outs consented to the Order without admitting or denying the opinion, findings or allegations contained therein.

In the Order, the Commission found that while Close Outs disclosed some information concerning the financial condition of its controlling shareholder, it failed to identify the precarious financial condition of the shareholder and the potential consequences to Close Outs. The Commission found that the registration statement included untrue statements of material facts and omitted to state material facts required to be stated therein in order to make the statements therein not misleading.

In its Offer of Settlement, Close Outs undertook to file an amendment to the registration statement in accordance with the Stop Order. The Commission ordered that if and when such amendment is filed, the Stop Order shall cease to be effective. (Rel. 33-6643)

The net proceeds from the sale of the preferred stock will be used to repurchase for cash the outstanding shares of WTU's 10.16% preferred stock obtained through a tender offer

to the holders thereof. Any proceeds not used for the repurchase of the 10.16% preferred stock will be used for the payment of outstanding short-term borrowings incurred and expected to be incurred to finance construction expenditures and other corporate purposes. (Rel. 35-24097 - May 16)

Persons eligible to use the short form (Schedule 13G) may in lieu of filing a Schedule 13D file a Schedule 13G within 45 days after the end of the calendar year in which the person became subject to Section 13(d)(1). Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
