COMMENTS REQUESTED ON AMENDMENTS TO FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY RULES

The Commission approved the publication of a release proposing for public comment amendments to the Commission's financial responsibility rules involving the treatment of repurchase and reverse-repurchase agreements by registered broker-dealers. The proposed amendments would affect Securities Exchange Act Rules 15c3-1, 15c3-3, 17a-3 and 17a-13.

RULE 202(a)(1)-1 ADOPTED

The Commission adopted Rule 202(a)(1)-1 under the Investment Advisers Act of 1940 which deems a transaction not resulting in a change of actual control or management of an investment adviser not to be an "assignment" requiring approval of the adviser's clients. (Rel. IA-1034)

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AGAINST JAMES MASSA

The Commission instituted public administrative proceedings against James Massa under Section 15(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The Order for Proceedings alleges that Massa, on August 28, 1983, was convicted of conspiracy, mail fraud, wire fraud, securities fraud and aiding and abetting a broker-dealer in maintaining false books and records. These convictions arose out of Massa's involvement in the \$16 million looting of Stix & Co., Inc., formerly a St. Louis broker-dealer, for which a trustee was appointed in 1981 under the provisions of the Securities Investor Protection Act of 1970. PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AGAINST THOMAS R. BRIMBERRY

The Commission instituted public administrative proceedings against Thomas R. Brimberry under Section 15(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The Order for Proceedings alleges that Brimberry, on May 25, 1983, was convicted of obstructing justice in connection with grand jury proceedings. Also, in April 1984, Brimberry was convicted of making false, material declarations to the federal grand jury and converting Stix & Co., Inc. assets to his personal benefit after the appointment of a SIPC trustee.

A SIPC trustee was appointed to take control of Stix, formerly a St. Louis broker-dealer, in 1981 after the \$16 million looting of Stix was uncovered by federal authorities. (Rel. 34-23580)

PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AGAINST LEONARD G. BEDNAR

The Commission instituted public administrative proceedings against Leonard G. Bednar under Section 15(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The Order for Proceedings alleges that Bednar, on February 4, 1983, was convicted of making false, material declarations to the federal grand jury and making false entries in the books and records of Stix & Co., Inc.

A SIPC trustee was appointed to take control of Stix, formerly a St. Louis broker-dealer, in 1981 after the \$16 million looting of Stix was uncovered by federal authorities. (Rel. 34-23581)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

ANTIFRAUD VIOLATIONS ALLEGED IN VISTA OIL & GAS OFFERINGS

The Commission announced that on August 12 a civil complaint was filed in the U.S. District Court in Charleston, West Virginia seeking to enjoin Tom W. Smith of Phoenix, Arizona, Russell T. Poole of Santa Cruz, California, and James R. Brundige, Jr. of Parkersburg, West Virginia, for alleged violations of registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws. Without admitting or denying the complaint's allegations, the defendants consented to an order permanently enjoining them from violations of the registration and antifraud provisions.

The complaint alleges that from 1982 through 1985, the defendants sold \$11.8 million of unregistered Vista Oil & Gas Corp. limited partnership interests to over 600 investors residing in 27 states. It is also alleged that the defendants obtained \$2.8 million in secret profits from investors; that they diverted production revenues to unauthorized uses, and that they failed to drill certain wells.

[The Commission acknowledges the substantial assistance provided by the West Virginia State Auditors Office, Division of Securities in the investigation of this matter.] (SEC v. Tom W. Smith, et al., USDC SD WVA, Civil Action No. A-86-0886). (LR-11211)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

PB-SB 1983 INVESTMENT PARTNERSHIP I

A notice has been issued giving interested person until September 30 to request a hearing on an application filed by certain employees' securities companies sponsored by Salomon Inc. (SI) and its affiliates, requesting an order amending certain previous orders so that relief would be granted all such companies (both present and future) from all provisions of the Investment Company Act, other than Sections 9, 17(a), 17(d) (subject to certain exceptions), 36(a), 36(b), and 38 through 53 of the Act. All of the companies would be able to open customer brokerage accounts with the broker-dealer subsidiary of SI and thereby earn interest on temporarily uninvested funds, and certain of the companies would be able to engage in certain joint transactions with the persons who sponsor and manage them. E. F. HUTTON & COMPANY, INC.

A permanent order has been issued conditionally exempting E. F. Hutton & Company, Inc. and The E. F. Hutton Group, Inc. from the provisions of Section 9(a) of the Investment Company Act respecting the circumstances described in the application. This order was issued after a hearing, limited to written submissions, on the application. (Rel. IC-15287 - Sept. 5)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

SOUTHERN COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing a proposal by The Southern Company, a registered holding company, and its subsidiaries, Alabama Power Company, Georgia Power Company, Gulf Power Company, Mississippi Power Company, Southern Company Services, Inc., Southern Electric Generating Company, and Southern Electric International, Inc. Southern Company will issue up to a maximum of \$6 million in value of its authorized

but unissued shares of common stock in order to provide common stock to fund the Employee Stock Ownership Plan of the Southern Company System (Plan), adopted by the subsidiaries, for the Plan year 1985 by direct purchase of common stock from Southern. (Rel. 35-24185 - Sept. 5)
