U.S. SECURITIES AND
EXCHANGE COMMISSION

PERMANENT INJUNCTIONS ENTERED AGAINST GRAN-PARK SECURITIES, INC. AND EDWARD GRANVILLE-SMITH, JR.

The Washington Regional Office announced that on April 15 the Honorable Gerhard A. Gesell of the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia, issued final judgments of permanent injunction against Gran-Park Securities, Inc. and Edward Granville-Smith, Jr. enjoining them from further violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws. The defendants consented to the entry of the final judgments without admitting or denying the allegations of the Commission's complaint.

The Commission's complaint, filed on April 1, 1982, alleged that Gran-Park, a broker-dealer registered with the Commission, and Granville-Smith engaged in a scheme to fraudulently induce investors to purchase approximately \$14 million in unregistered limited partnership interests in three coal mining limited partnerships syndicated during 1976-1979. The Options Clearing Corporation has filed a proposed rule change pursuant to Rule 19b-4 (SR-OCC-82-6) authorizing OCC to implement its pilot Escrow Receipt Depository (ERD) program on a full-scale basis. ERD automates the processing of escrow deposits and allows premium settlements between clearing members and participating banks to be effected through OCC's facilities.
