ELIMINATION OF LEGAL SIZE PAPER

The Commission has determined to publish for comment amendments to 17 CFR 201.22(e), 230.403(a), 240.12b-12(a) and (b), 250.22(d), 260.7a-17, 260.7a-18(a), 270.0-2(b), 270.8b-12(a) and (b), and 275.04(b) to require the use of 8-1/2 x 11 inch paper for all documents filed with the Commission. The adoption of a uniform size for all such documents will achieve maximum cost-efficiency in the Commission's micrographics filing system.

All comments should be submitted in triplicate and addressed to George A. ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

GRAN-PARK SECURITIES, INC., OTHERS SANCTIONED

The Commission has issued an Order Instituting Proceedings and Imposing Remedial Sanctions pursuant to Section 15(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 against Gran-Park Securities, Inc., a registered broker-dealer located in Lighthouse Point, Florida, Edward Granville-Smith, Jr. of Boca Raton, Florida, and Michael D. Parker of Silver Spring, Maryland. The Commission's Order: (1) revoked the broker-dealer registration of Gran-Park, (2) barred Granville-Smith from association with any broker, dealer, investment company or investment adviser, and (3) suspended Parker from association with any broker, dealer, investment company or investment adviser for a period of 60 days.

The sanctions are based upon findings that Gran-Park, Granville-Smith and Parker wilfully violated the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws in the offer and sale of interests in J&J Coal Mining Partnership and Maidsville Coal Mining Partnership. In selling these unregistered securities in 1976 and 1977, Gran-Park, Granville-Smith and Parker failed to disclose material facts concerning, among other things, the quantity and quality of coal to be mined. Gran-Park, Granville-Smith and Parker consented to the entry of the Commission Order without admitting or denying the findings therein. (Rel. 34-18779)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

COMPLAINT NAMES, TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER ENTERED AGAINST OTC NET INCORPORATED, OTHERS; RECEIVER APPOINTED

The Denver Regional Office announced that on June 3 a complaint and application for temporary restraining order was filed in the U.S. District Court for the District of Colorado alleging that OTC Net Incorporated, Juan Carlos Schidlowski, president, and Joseph V. Pignatiello, vice president, all of Denver, Colorado, violated and aided and abetted violations of various provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934.

On the same day, a temporary restraining order, expiring at 2:00 p.m. on June 9, 1982, was entered by consent by the Honorable Zita Weinshienk, Judge, U.S. District Court for the District of Colorado, enjoining the defendants in the Commission's complaint. Pursuant to an application by the Securities Investor Protection Corporation (SIPC), filed in the same action, OTC Net was ordered to show cause at 2:00 p.m. on June 9, 1982 why the Court should not enter an Order adjudicating that the

customers of OTC Net are in need of the protection afforded by the Securities Investor Protection Act of 1970 and appointing a trustee and counsel for the trustee for the liquidation of the business and property of OTC Net. Pending a determination upon SIPC's application, Glen E. Keller, Jr. was appointed as the temporary receiver of all the assets and property of OTC Net.

The Commission's six count complaint, in addition to seeking the appointment of a Receiver, alleges that OCT Net, aided and abetted by Schidlowski and Pignatiello, violated the net capital and customer reserve protection rules of the Exchange Act. The application for a temporary restraining order stated, among other things, that the net capital and books and records violations resulted from, among other things, subordinated loan agreements between Pignatiello and OTC Net in April and May 1982 which provided for the infusion of \$900,000 in cash to OTC Net in the form of three checks drawn by Pignatiello on the Cavendish Bank of London, England, all of which were dishonored. INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

R.C. BROWN MONEY MARKET FUND

An order has been issued pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act of 1940 exempting R.C. Brown Money Market Fund from the provisions of Section 2(a)(41) of the Act and Rules 2a-4 and 22c-1 thereunder to the extent necessary to permit it to value its assets by means of the amortized cost method of valuation. (Rel. IC-12466 - June 7)

MERRILL LYNCH VARIABLE ANNUITY ACCOUNT

An order has been issued pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act of 1940 on an application filed on March 18, 1982, and an amendment thereto on April 28, 1982, by Family Life Insurance Company (FLIC), Merrill Lynch Variable Annuity Account (the Account), and Merrill Lynch, Pierce, Fenner & Smith Incorporated (MLPF&S) (together, Applicants), exempting Applicants from the provisions of Sections 22(e), 27(c)(1), and 27(d) of the Act to the extent necessary to permit Applicants to offer certain variable annuity contracts in Texas. FLIC, a stock life insurance company organized under the laws of Washington, is the depositor of the Account which is registered under the Act as a unit investment trust. MLPF&S is the principal underwriter for the Account. (Rel. IC-12467 - June 7)

CALVERT TAX-FREE RESERVES

An order, pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act of 1940, has been issued on an application of Calvert Tax-Free Reserves (CTFR) and First Variable Rate Fund (FVRF), registered under the Act as open-end, diversified, management investment companies (Funds), and their respective investment advisers, Calvert Municipal Management Company (CMMC) and Government Securities Management Company, Inc. (GSMC), and Scott D. Paseltiner, a trustee of CTFR and a director of FVRF, declaring that Mr. Paseltiner shall not be deemed an interested person of the Funds, CMMC, GSMC, or of any other investment company which may be managed by CMMC or GSMC in the future, within the meaning of Section 2(a)(19) of the Act, solely by reason of his being a general partner of Capital Investments, Ltd., a broker-dealer registered under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. NATIONAL GOVERNMENT RESERVES, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until July 6 to request a hearing on an application filed by National Government Reserves, Inc. (Applicant), an open-end, diversified, management investment company, requesting a Commission order pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Act, exempting Applicant from the provisions of Section 2(a)(41) of the Act and Rules 2a-4 and 22c-1 thereunder, to the extent necessary to permit Applicant to use the amortized cost valuation method for the purpose of valuing its assets.
