COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

REGULATORY FLEXIBILITY AGENDA AND RULES SCHEDULED FOR REVIEW

The Commission has published, pursuant to the Regulatory Flexibility Act, an agenda of open and anticipated rulemaking actions, a listing of rules scheduled for review in the next 12 months and a listing of completed rulemaking actions and reviews since the publication of the October 1982 agenda.

The agenda, including the text of the individual entries, will be published in the Federal Register on or before April 30 as part of a government-wide Unified Agenda of Federal Regulations.

The Commission seeks comment on the various subject areas, on particular items, and on the identified rules scheduled for review. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

CYLINDER TECHNOLOGY, OTHERS ENJOINED

The Commission announced that on March 15 the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia entered an order permanently enjoining Cylinder Technology, Ltd., a Florida limited partnership, Dale B. Finfrock and Michael H. Lameyer, both of whom reside in Palm Beach, Florida and were promoters of Cylinder Technology, from future violations of Section 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933. The Court further ordered Cylinder Technology to comply with its undertaking to mail to all of its partners a statement summarizing the Complaint, Judgments and Consents and Undertakings filed in this matter, and Finfrock and Lameyer to comply with their undertakings that for a period of five years they will not become officers, directors or general partners of Cylinder Technology or any newly formed entity which may succeed Cylinder Technology and will not act as underwriters in connection with the offer or sale of securities of Cylinder Technology or any entity which may succeed Cylinder Technology. Simultaneous with the filing of the Complaint, the defendants, without admitting or denying the allegations in the Complaint, consented to the entry of the Judgments.

The Commission's complaint alleged that Cylinder Technology was structured to provide tax benefits to its individual partners through the amortization of the purchase price of a patent which the partnership and the partners would acquire from Finfrock and Lameyer for a total purchase price in excess of \$12 million. The Commission alleged that Finfrock and Lameyer circulated offering materials, including a proposed tax opinion, to potential investors in Cylinder Technology which contained false and misleading information concerning the status and underlying facts of the tax opinion and the identity of those who had an ownership interest in the patent. The Options Clearing Corporation has filed a proposed rule change pursuant to Rule 19b-4 (SR-OCC-83-4) that would amend OCC Rule 1106 to require that OCC close-out segregated long positions carried by a suspended participant. NOTICE OF EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

A proposed rule change filed by the Stock Clearing Corporation of Philadelphia (SCCP) pursuant to Rule 19b-4 (SR-SCCP-83-3) has become effective in accordance with Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The proposed rule change would add a Demand Withhold capability to SCCP's OTC Equity Comparison System. In addition, the proposed rule change would make several minor enhancements to SCCP's current comparison processing systems, including permitting partial acceptances by participants of Regular Advisories generated in respect of certain uncomparated trades.
