## U.S. SECURITIES AND EXCHANGE COMMISSION

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### PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO RULE 206(3)-2

The Commission is proposing for public comment amendments to Rule 206(3)-2 under the Investment Advisers Act of 1940. The proposed amendments would eliminate the requirement that an investment adviser obtain at least annually from a client written renewal of the client's consent to agency cross transactions. Comments should be submitted in triplicate to George A. Fitzsimmons, Secretary, Securities and Exchange Commission, 450 Fifth Street, N.W., Stop 6-9, Washington, DC 20549, on or before June 28, and should refer to File No. S7-974. All submissions will be available for public inspection at the Commission's Public Reference Room. (Rel. IA-860)

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## ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

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### ORDER DISMISSING PROCEEDINGS AND ACCEPTING UNDERTAKINGS

The Commission announced that in connection with an administrative proceeding, In the Matter of Edith C. Alter, it has accepted respondent's Offer of Settlement as being in the public interest. Respondent, formerly a registered investment adviser, has consented to the entry of an Order without admitting or denying the allegations in the Order for Proceedings. The Commission's Order which dismisses these administrative proceedings requires that respondent comply with certain voluntary undertakings regarding the steps she will take before seeking future association in the securities industry. Those undertakings are as follows: (1) not to apply for registration as an investment adviser or a broker or dealer without obtaining the prior written permission of the Commission; (2) not to seek to become associated with an investment adviser or broker or dealer without obtaining the prior written permission of the Commission; and (3) not to seek to become an affiliated or control person of an investment company without the prior written permission of the Commission. 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## CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

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### RIVER ENTERTAINMENT, INC., OTHERS ENJOINED

The Chicago Regional Office announced that on May 3 the Honorable Ann Aldrich, Judge of the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Ohio, Eastern Division, entered Final Judgments of Permanent Injunction against Robert W. Shufelt, Jr., a resident of Ravenna, Ohio; River Entertainment, Inc., an Ohio corporation controlled by Shufelt; and Michael W. Rosenberg, a practicing attorney in Warren, Ohio. All three defendants, without admitting or denying the allegations in the Commission's complaint, consented to the entry of the Judgments which enjoin them from violating the antifraud and registration provisions of the securities laws.

The complaint, which was filed on April 22, alleged that Shufelt and River Entertainment engaged in fraudulent conduct in the offer and sale of unregistered securities of River Entertainment and two predecessor entities. The Judgment against Rosenberg was based on allegations in the complaint that he aided and abetted Shufelt and River Entertainment's antifraud violations in an offering of common stock in Betsy Ann Corporation, an Ohio corporation which eventually merged into River Entertainment. The complaint also alleged that Rosenberg aided and abetted violations of the registration provisions with respect to an offering of promissory notes issued by River Entertainment. (SEC v. River Entertainment, Inc., et al., N.D. Ohio, Civil Action No. C83-1728). (LR-9996)

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## INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

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### HUTTON MUNICIPAL FUND INC.

An order has been issued pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act of 1940 on an application by Hutton Municipal Fund Inc., et al., granting exemptions from Section 22(d) and from Section 12(d)(3) to permit the acquisition of rights to sell portfolio securities to brokers or dealers. ### MUNICIPAL FUND FOR CALIFORNIA INVESTORS, INC.

An order has been issued on an application filed pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act of 1940 by Municipal Fund for California Investors, Inc., an open-end, diversified, management investment company, and Henry M. Watts, Jr., a director of the Fund, declaring that Mr. Watts shall not be deemed an "interested person" of the Fund within the meaning of Section 2(a)(19) of the Act solely by reason of his status as an officer, director and employee of Mitchel, Schreiber, Watts & Co., Inc., a broker-dealer registered under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. ### NATIONAL WESTMINSTER BANK OF CANADA

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until June 6 to request a hearing on an application of National Westminster Bank of Canada (Applicant), a Canadian chartered bank which presently proposes to make an offering of commercial paper in the United States, for an order pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act of 1940 exempting it from all provisions of the Act. ### THE BENCHMARK FUND MONEY MARKET AND GOVERNMENT PORTFOLIOS

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until June 6 to request a hearing on an application filed by The Benchmark Fund Money Market and Government Portfolios (BF) and The Benchmark Tax-Exempt Fund (BTF), registered under the Investment Company Act of 1940 as open-end, diversified, management investment companies, for an order pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Act exempting BTF from the provisions of Section 12(d)(3) of the Act to the extent necessary to permit BTF to acquire rights to sell its portfolio securities to brokers and dealers and exempting both BF and BTF from the provisions of Section 2(a)(41) of the Act and Rules 2a-4 and 22c-1 thereunder to permit them to compute their respective net asset values per unit using the amortized cost method of valuation.
