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ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AGAINST JOHN LATSHAW

The Commission today issued an order instituting administrative proceedings, making findings and imposing remedial sanctions against John Latshaw of Kansas City, Missouri. The Commission found that Latshaw, while an officer of a broker-dealer firm, wilfully violated Section 7 of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and of Regulation T. The order cites certain transactions involving the extension and arranging of credit in violation of Regulation T by Latshaw during the period December 19, 1975 through March 14, 1981. The Commission determined to place limitations on the activities of Latshaw as set forth in his undertakings made in connection with the resolution of the proceedings and ordered him to comply with such undertakings. Latshaw consented to the issuance of the order without admitting or denying the allegations or findings contained in the order. (Rel. 34-19903)

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDING INSTITUTED AGAINST HOWARD GOODSTEIN

The Commission announced the institution of public administrative proceedings under Sections 15(b) and 19(h) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 against Howard Goodstein of North Miami Beach, Florida, a former vice president, branch manager, and registered representative at Thomson McKinnon Securities, Inc. The Order for Proceedings alleges that Goodstein wilfully violated Section 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933 and Section 10(b) of the Exchange Act and Rule 10b-5 thereunder in that he employed a scheme to defraud, made untrue statements of material fact, and engaged in a fraudulent practice and course of conduct in the handling of customers' brokerage accounts. Among other things, Goodstein allegedly obtained money from customers by falsely representing the securities he intended to purchase with such funds; falsely represented the nature and profitability of trading activities, and the securities positions and portfolio valuation in customer accounts; and misapplied funds and securities of customers. As a part of this scheme, Goodstein allegedly sent customers fictitious confirmations and other statements which misrepresented and materially misstated the securities allegedly held by the brokerage firms in behalf of the customers as well as the value of said securities, and misrepresented the source of interest and dividends received. Goodstein allegedly had genuine confirmations of securities transactions and monthly statements mailed to post office boxes he controlled.

A hearing will be scheduled to determine whether the allegations against Goodstein are true and, if so, to decide what, if any, remedial sanctions should be ordered by the Commission. (Rel. 34-19873)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

KENNETH C. FREITAG AND FREITAG REALTY, INC. ENJOINED

The Chicago Regional Office announced that on June 16 the Honorable Prentice H. Marshall, Judge of the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Illinois, Eastern Division, entered an Order of Permanent Injunction against Kenneth C. Freitag, a resident of Olympia Fields, Illinois, and Freitag Realty, Inc., an Illinois corporation. Freitag and Freitag Realty, without admitting or denying the allegations in the Commission's complaint, consented to the entry of the Order which enjoins them from violating the antifraud and registration provisions of the federal securities laws.

The Order is based on the defendants' activities in connection with the offer and sale of investment contracts involving agricultural land ventures. Through these sales, the complaint alleged, the defendants raised at least \$1.25 million from over 125 investors residing in Illinois and other states. The complaint alleged that the defendants misrepresented to investors the anticipated return from the ventures, the

value of the ventures' farm properties, and the risks inherent in these investments. Further, the complaint stated that the defendants failed to fully disclose to investors the compensation that the defendants received on venture sales.

Additionally, the complaint alleged, the defendants in some instances organized a new venture to purchase land held by an already existing old venture. In connection with this scheme, described by the complaint as a "Reventure", the defendants failed to disclose to new investors that they were purchasing another venture's farm property. The complaint also alleged that the defendants failed to disclose that they set new ventures' purchase prices at amounts which had no reasonable basis, in order to give old ventures' investors a return on their investments.

It was also alleged that the defendants informed investors that part of the business was registered with the SEC and with the National Association of Securities Dealers (NASD). In fact, the complaint stated, the defendants were never registered with the SEC, nor were they members of the NASD. (SEC v. Kenneth C. Freitag, N.D. Ill., Civil Action No. 83 C 4156.) (LR-10044)

ACQUISITIONS OF SECURITIES

Companies and individuals must report to the Commission within ten days on Schedule 13D if after the acquisition of equity securities of a public company their beneficial interest therein exceeds five percent. Persons eligible to use the short form (Schedule 13G) may in lieu of filing a Schedule 13D file a Schedule 13G within 45 days after the end of the calendar year in which the person became subject to Section 13(d)(1). Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
