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ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AGAINST VAN CLEEF, JORDAN & WOOD (OF CONNECTICUT) AND RICHARD F.F. NICHOLS

The Commission instituted public administrative proceedings against Van Cleef, Jordan & Wood (of Connecticut) (VCJW), a registered investment adviser located in New York City, and Richard F.F. Nichols. The alleged violations resulted from their operation of the Greenfield Fund, Inc. (the Fund), a registered investment company located in New York City. VCJW is the adviser to the Fund and Nichols is the president and chief executive officer of the Fund, as well as the owner of VCJW.

The Order for Proceedings alleges that: VCJW violated the registration provisions of the Investment Advisers Act of 1940 and the pricing and recordkeeping provisions of the Investment Company Act of 1940; VCJW and Nichols engaged in transactions prohibited under the Investment Company Act; VCJW was not registered as an investment adviser when it became the adviser to the Fund in July 1981; beginning in July 1981, the Fund's calculation of net asset value for its customers who redeemed shares or who received dividends from the Fund was incorrect; the Fund purchased a bond issued by a company which earned more than 15% of its gross revenues from the business of being a broker, dealer or underwriter in violation of applicable provisions of the Investment Company Act; and the Fund's financial books and records were deficit.

A hearing will be scheduled to determine whether the allegations are true, and what, if any, remedial action should be ordered by the Commission. (Rel. 34-13560)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

JAMES B. VANTREESE, III ENJOINED

The Fort Worth Regional Office announced that on September 29 Judge Robert M. Hill, U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Texas, Dallas Division, entered an order permanently enjoining James B. VanTreesse, III of Paris, Texas, from engaging in further violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws. VanTreesse consented to the order without admitting or denying the allegations in the September 6 complaint. (SEC v. Frontier Resources Corp., et al., N.D. Tex., Civil Action No. CA 3-83-1528D). (LR-10163)

H.L.S. ENTERPRISES, INC. AND HOWARD L. STRAHAN ENJOINED

The Fort Worth Regional Office announced that on September 30 Judge Joe Fish, U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Texas, Dallas Division, entered orders of permanent injunction against H.L.S. Enterprises, Inc. and Howard L. Strahan, both of Dallas, Texas. The complaint alleged that the defendants violated the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws. Both defendants consented to the order without admitting or denying the allegations in the September 29 complaint.

The complaint alleged that: from about August 1981 through March 1982, HLS and Strahan, in violation of the registration provisions, offered and sold fractional undivided working interests in oil, gas and mineral leases located in Texas to investors throughout the United States, raising approximately \$1 million; and in connection with the offer and sale of these interests, HLS and Strahan misrepresented certain material facts and omitted to disclose material facts concerning Strahan's background, the use of investors' funds, the cost of oil and gas leases, the extent of oil and gas production on wells drilled by HLS and Strahan, and other facts related to HLS' operations. (SEC v. H.L.S. Enterprises, Inc. and Howard L. Strahan, N.D. Texas, Civil Action No. CA 3-83-1668G). (LR-10164)

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

HERBERT E. OTTO CONVICTED

The U.S. Attorney for the Western District of Pennsylvania and the Washington Regional Office announced that on September 22 a jury in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania found Herbert E. Otto of Pittsburgh guilty of three counts of a six-count indictment alleging mail fraud. The indictment charged Otto with carrying out a fraudulent scheme from 1976 to 1979 in the nature of a "Ponzi" whereby investors were promised that their monies would earn high returns from trading in stock options. The indictment further charged that Otto used investor monies for his personal expenses and to repay other investors, contrary to his representations made to investors. Otto is to be sentenced on October 26. (U.S. v. Herbert E. Otto, W.D. Pa., Criminal No. 83-43). (LR-10161)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

THE MERCANTILE BANK OF CANADA

An order has been issued exempting The Mercantile Bank of Canada from all provisions of the Investment Company Act so that it can issue in the United States its commercial paper, letters of credit and guarantees in support of debt securities issued in the United States by Mercantile's subsidiaries, customers, and other affiliated and unaffiliated issuers. (Rel. IC-13570 - Oct. 12)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

DIAMOND CHEMICALS COMPANY

An order has been issued declaring Diamond Chemicals Company not to be a gas utility company under Section 2(a)(4) of the Public Utility Holding Company Act of 1935. (Rel. 35-23084 - Oct. 12)

NATIONAL FUEL GAS COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until November 8 to request a hearing on a proposal by National Fuel Gas Company, a registered holding company, and one of its subsidiaries, National Fuel Gas Distribution Corporation, whereby National will issue and sell up to \$50 million of debentures and acquire up to \$50 million of long-term notes from Distribution Corporation. SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

Proposed rule changes filed by the following have become effective under Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934: The Midwest Securities Trust Company (SR-MSTC-83-17) which revises MSTC's charges for imprinting Depository Delivery Instruction (DDI) forms. In its filing MSTC states the increased charges for DDI forms reflect increased MSTC printing costs and that these charges are passed on to participants purchasing DDI forms from MSTC. (Rel. 34-20268); and Philadelphia Depository Trust Company (SR-Philadep-83-7) which amends Philadep's procedures for the affirmation of trades in the National Institutional Delivery System (NIDS) and reduces by \$0.05 the fee Philadelp charges its participants for confirmation of a NIDS trade. Philadelp's revised procedures require that all trades through NIDS must be affirmed by T+3 for automatic book-entry settlement on T+5. (Rel. 34-20267)
