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## COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

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### JOHN F. RADIGAN APPOINTED ASSISTANT DIRECTOR

Kathryn B. McGrath, Director of the Division of Investment Management, announced the appointment of John F. Radigan as an Assistant Director of the Division.

In his new position, Mr. Radigan will direct the operations of the Division's Office of Disclosure Policy and Review which is responsible for the review and processing of registration statements and other disclosure documents filed by investment companies.

Mr. Radigan has extensive experience with the securities laws and disclosure matters. He joined the Commission staff in 1961 as a financial analyst in the Division of Corporate Regulation and was promoted to Branch Chief in 1969. Since 1976, he has served as a Branch Chief in the Division of Investment Management.

A 1959 graduate of Le Moyne College in Syracuse, NY, Mr. Radigan received his M.B.A. degree from Cornell University in 1961.

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## ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

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### BOENNING & SCATTERGOOD, INC. AND FRANCIS W. KELLY CITED

The Commission instituted and settled administrative proceedings under Sections 15(b) and 19(h) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 against Boenning & Scattergood, Inc. (B&S), a registered broker-dealer in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, and Francis W. Kelly, an officer of B&S. The Order for Proceedings alleges that: B&S and Kelly wilfully violated the antifraud provisions of the securities laws in excessive markups and markdowns charged customers; B&S violated the antifraud provisions in purchases and sales of over-the-counter securities from salesmen's personal accounts; and B&S violated the recordkeeping provisions by failing to disclose to customers that it was making a market in a particular security, and through failure to properly time stamp order tickets. The Commission accepted the respondents Offer of Settlement in which they consented to the aforesaid allegations. (Rel. 34-20246)

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## CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

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### RICHARD J. GREENLAW ENJOINED

The Boston Regional Office announced that on October 5 Judge Martin F. Laughlin, U.S. District Court for the District of New Hampshire, entered a preliminary injunction, and an order freezing assets and preventing the destruction of records against Richard J. Greenlaw of Henniker, New Hampshire. The defendant consented to the Order without admitting or denying the allegations of the complaint.

The Commission filed a complaint on September 15 against Greenlaw alleging violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws in the offer and sale of at least \$600,000 worth of profit-sharing agreements and promissory notes to residents of New England, Canada and several states throughout the United States. According to the Commission's papers, Greenlaw engaged in undisclosed, risky options trading, paid investors with funds received from other investors, and used investor funds for personal expenses. On the same day, the Commission obtained a temporary restraining order. (SEC v. Richard J. Greenlaw, D.C.N.H., CA 83-557-1). (LR-10165)

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## CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

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### RONALD F. SANFORD CONVICTED

Gene S. Anderson, U.S. Attorney for the Western District of Washington and The Seattle Regional Office announced that on September 26 Ronald F. Sanford of Bellevue, Washington entered pleas of guilty to a three-count Information charging securities, bank, and mail fraud. U.S. District Judge Walter T. McGovern scheduled sentencing for November 16, 1983. (U.S. v. Ronald F. Sanford, USDC WD WA, No. CR 83-295 M). (LR-10166)

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## INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

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### L.F. ROTHSCHILD EXEMPT FUND, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until November 7 to request a hearing on an application by L.F. Rothschild Exempt Fund, Inc., for an order exempting it from the provisions of Section 12(d)(3) of the Investment Company Act to permit it to acquire rights to sell its portfolio securities to brokers or dealers. ### TDP&L BOND ACCOUNT, INC.

The Commission has permanently approved amendments to the National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc.'s "National Market System (NMS) Securities Designation Plan with respect to NASDAQ Securities", that: (1) limit the number of securities to 50 per month that can be designated as NMS Securities under the voluntary designation criteria of Rule 11Aa2-1 under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934; and (2) allow the NASD to designate an eligible security previously reported in the consolidated transaction reporting system as an NMS Security immediately upon the security's transfer to the over-the-counter market.
