CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

U.S. SECURITIES AND
EXCHANGE COMMISSION

COMPLAINT NAMES THE TELEMINE COMPANY, INC.

On October 19 the Commission filed a civil injunctive action in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia against The Telemine Company, Inc. of New York, New York. The complaint alleges violations of the reporting provisions of the federal securities laws and seeks a Judgment of Permanent Injunction and Other Equitable Relief.

The Commission alleges that Telemine failed to file: its Annual Report on Form 10-K for its fiscal quarter ended March 31, 1983, required to have been filed by June 29, 1983; its Quarterly Report on Form 10-Q for its quarter ended June 30, 1983, required to have been filed by August 15, 1983; various required periodic reports in a timely manner; and required Notifications of Late Filing on Form 12b-25. The Commission requests that the Court order Telemine to file its delinquent Annual and Quarterly Reports and enjoin Telemine from further violations of the reporting provision of the federal securities laws. (SEC v. The Telemine Company, Inc., D.D.C., Civil Action No. 83-3078.) (LR-10175)

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

ACCOUNTANT PLEADS GUILTY TO CRIMINAL CONTEMPT CHARGES

The New York Regional Office announced that on October 3 Gerald Greenspan, an accountant from Union City, New Jersey, pled guilty to Criminal Contempt of Court for violation of two Permanent Injunctions entered against him on November 10, 1960 and July 8, 1975 and an Amended Order of Permanent Injunction entered against him on February 22, 1980. At the allocation before Judge Edward Weinfeld, U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York, Greenspan pled to having engaged in fraudulent "free-riding" activities at Prudential-Bache Securities in December 1982. He did this by: purchasing stock using an alias, without intent to pay; and failing to disclose to the broker the prior injunctions and a prior conviction, or to report his purchases to the SEC, as required by the Court's 1980 Amended Order of Permanent Injunction. Greenspan is required to appear before the Court for sentencing on November 18. (U.S. ex rel. SEC v. Gerald Greenspan, 83 Cr. Misc. #1, S.D.N.Y., EW). (LR-10177)

LIFE INSURANCE INVESTORS, INC.

An order has been issued declaring that Liife Insurance Investors, Inc. has ceased to be an investment company. (Rel. IC-13590 - Oct. 20)

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The following have filed proposed rule changes under Rule 19b-4: The New York Stock Exchange, Inc. (SR-NYSE-83-51) to permit an options specialist, his member organization, or any other member, allied member, approved person, officer or employee of such organization to popularize, either orally or in writing, any option in which the specialist is registered. (Rel. 34-20313); and the Pacific Securities Depository Trust Company (SR-PSDTC-83-10) that would amend its recently approved participants fund By-laws. The proposal would require (1) each PSDTC participant to make appropriate substitutions for a letter of credit securing the non-cash portion of its participants fund contribution within ten days prior to the letter of credit's expiration date, and (2) PSDTC to repay fully any loans, secured by participants

fund assets, that are made to cover PSDTC losses or liabilities. The proposal would require full repayment within 30 days after such loans are made. (Rel. 34-20315)

Publication of the proposals are expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of October 24.

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Commission approved the following proposed rule changes: Midwest Securities Trust Company (SR-MSTC-83-15) to prohibit MSTC participants from reclaiming a delivery of securities in registered form to the delivering participant solely because the delivery was effected by book-entry, unless the parties agree, at the time of execution, to settle the trade by physical delivery. (Rel. 34-20308); and American Stock Exchange (SR-Amex-83-19) to amend Amex Rule 343 to alter the qualification examination requirements for supervisory analysts. (Rel. 34-20309)

ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission has approved, on an accelerated basis, a proposed rule change filed by the Chicago Board Options Exchange, Incorporated (SR-CBOE-83-40) to allow CBOE permit holders in non-equity (i.e., debt) options to act as floor brokers as well as market makers. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of October 24. (Rel. 34-20314)

Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
