RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

PERMANENT ADOPTION OF SHELF REGISTRATION RULE

The Commission adopted a revised shelf registration rule. Rule 415 relates to the registration of securities to be offered or sold on a delayed or continuous basis. As revised, the Rule is available for traditional shelf offerings and for offerings of securities which may be registered on Form S-3 or F-3, the short form registration statements. (Rel. 33-6499)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

INJUNCTIONS ENTERED AGAINST NITRON, INC.

The Commission announced the settlement of a civil injunctive action filed on September 29 against Nitron, Inc. of Cupertino, California (see LR-10147 - Sept. 30). Nitron, without admitting or denying any of the allegations in the complaint, consented to an order permanently enjoining it from violating certain reporting and antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934.

The complaint charged that Nitron and Samuel Nissim, a director of Nitron who served as Nitron's president and chairman until 1983, filed or caused to be filed with the Commission and released or caused to be released to the public, materially false and misleading statements. These statements concerned the revenues to be derived by Nitron under a contract to manufacture video game arcades and cassettes for Astrocade, Inc., a privately-held seller of home video games, concerning the substance and purpose of certain agreements between Nitron and Astrocade and the financial condition of Nitron and Astrocade. Nitron was also charged with failing to timely file an annual report and several periodic reports with the Commission during 1982 and 1983.

The action is still pending respecting Nissim, against whom the Commission seeks a permanent injunction from violations of the antifraud and reporting provisions of the securities laws. (SEC v. Nitron, Inc. and Samuel Nissim, U.S.D.C. D.C., Civil Action No. 83-2872). (LR-10202)

GREAT LAKES HOUSING LIMITED PARTNERSHIP

An order has been issued on an application of Great Lakes Housing Limited Partnership and Winthrop Financial Co., Inc. exempting Great Lakes from all provisions of the Investment Company Act. (Rel. IC-13628 - Nov. 17)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

THE COLUMBIA GAS SYSTEM, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 13 to request a hearing on a proposal of The Columbia Gas System, Inc., a registered holding company, and certain of its subsidiaries whereby the subsidiaries will issue and sell, and Columbia will acquire, installment notes in an amount of \$70.2 million and common stock aggregating \$16.1 million. Columbia will also make short-term advances to certain of its subsidiaries in an amount of \$903.9 million. The proceeds of these

transactions will be used by the subsidiaries in their construction and gas supply programs. Columbia proposes to issue and sell commercial paper and/or notes to banks aggregating up to \$525 million outstanding at any one time. Also, the subsidiaries will temporarily prepay installment notes with excess cash and borrow on open account from the intrasystem money pool. (Rel. 35-23123 - Nov. 17)

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Cincinnati Stock Exchange has filed a proposed rule change which became effective under Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (SR-CSE-83-5) to increase fees to its access participant members and to modify other fee provisions. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of November 21. (Rel. 34-20382)

APPROVAL OF AMENDMENTS TO THE CTA AND CQ PLANS

The participants in the Consolidated Tape Association Plan (CTA Plan) and the Consolidated Quotation Plan (CQ Plan) submitted amendments that establish a "non-professional" category of subscriber fees for market information offered by the CTA and CQ Plan participants. The Commission has approved these amendments. Publication is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of November 21. (Rel. 34-20385)

NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The American Stock Exchange, Inc. has filed a proposed rule change under Rule 19b-4 (SR-Amex-83-28. The rule change amends Section 125 of the Amex Company Guide to apply only to indentures not qualified under the Trust Indenture Act of 1939, and Section 710 of the Amex Company Guide to rescind the clause requiring that the shareholder vote cast represent over 50% in interest of all securities entitled to vote. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of November 21. (Rel. 34-20392)
