RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

COMMENTS REQUESTED ON ISSUES RELATING TO FLEXIBLE PREMIUM VARIABLE LIFE INSURANCE

The Commission is requesting written comments on issues raised by a petition for rulemaking relating to a new type of insurance product known as flexible premium variable life insurance. Petitioner, an insurance industry representative, has asked that the Commission adopt a rule which would exempt separate accounts offering this product from various provisions of the Investment Company Act of 1940. To aid public discussion of the issues raised under the Act, the Commission is publishing petitioner's suggested exemptive rule. However, the Commission takes no position on the merits of the suggested rule.

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

EASTERN UTILITIES ASSOCIATES

An order has been issued authorizing Eastern Utilities Associates (EUA), a registered holding company, to issue and sell up to 1.2 million shares of its common stock, \$5.00 par value, on or before December 31, 1983. EUA proposes to use the proceeds to make capital contributions to its subsidiaries, Eastern Edison Company and Blackstone Valley Electric Company. Eastern proposes to make a capital contribution to its subsidiary, Montaup Electric Company. (Rel. 35-23125 - Nov. 22)

SYSTEMS FUELS, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 19 to request a hearing on a proposal by System Fuels, Inc. (SFI), a jointly owned subsidiary of Arkansas Power & Light Company, Louisiana Power & Light Company, Mississippi Power & Light Company, and New Orleans Public Service Inc., each an operating subsidiary of Middle South Utilities Inc., relating to the financing of SFI's 1984 fuel supply programs for the benefit of the operating subsidiaries. SFI proposes to make additional borrowings from the operating subsidiaries during 1984 of up to \$125 million. The maximum aggregate amount of the borrowings, including the amount outstanding on December 31, 1983, will not exceed an estimated \$227 million. (Rel. 35-23126 - Nov. 22)

COLUMBUS AND SOUTHERN OHIO ELECTRIC COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing Columbus and Southern Ohio Electric Company, subsidiary of American Electric Power Company, Inc., to sell three, 2.5 megawatt diesel-driven generating units to a nonaffiliated company. (Rel. 35-23127 - Nov. 22)

THE CONNECTICUT LIGHT AND POWER COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 19 to request a hearing on a proposal of The Connecticut Light and Power Company (CL&P) and Western Massachusetts Electric Company (WMECO), subsidiaries of Northeast Utilities (NU). CL&P and WMECO propose to guarantee payment of any and all liability, claims, or obligations Northeast Utilities Service Company and/or Northeast Nuclear Energy Company, subsidiaries of NU, may have in their self-insured workers' compensation programs under the workers' compensation laws of the State of Connecticut. MONONGAHELA POWER COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 19 to request a hearing on a proposal by Monongahela Power Company, The Potomac Edison Company, and West Penn Power Company, subsidiaries of Allegheny Power System, Inc. The companies propose to issue short-term notes to banks and to a commercial paper dealer in a combined amount of \$209 million outstanding at any one time through June 30, 1985. An exception from competitive bidding has been requested for the sale of commercial paper notes. (Rel. 35-23129 - Nov. 22)

CENTRAL AND SOUTH WEST CORPORATION

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 19 to request a hearing on proposals by: (1) Central and South West Corporation to make capital contributions during 1984 and 1985 to three of its subsidiaries in amounts up to \$60 million for West Texas, \$150 million for Central Power & Light Company (CP&L), and \$20 million for Southwestern Electric Power Company (SWEPCO); and (2) four subsidiaries to issue and sell during the same period long-term debt and preferred stock (\$100 par value) in these amounts - West Texas, up to \$40 million of debt and 300,000 shares of stock; CP&L, up to \$300 million of debt and 500,000 shares of stock; SWEPCO, up to \$100 million of debt and 400,000 shares of stock; Public Service of Oklahoma, up to \$60 million of debt and 400,000 shares of stock. West Texas and SWEPCO also propose to increase the number of their authorized preferred shares from 310,000 to 810,000 and from 1,460,000 to 1,860,000, respectively. (Rel. 35-23130 - Nov. 22)

ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission has approved, on an accelerated basis, a proposed rule change filed by The New York Stock Exchange, Inc. The rule change (SR-NYSE-83-56) will address the requirements applicable to when-issued transactions in customers' accounts in AT&T and the issues created as a result of the AT&T divestiture. The proposed rule change includes specific procedures and requirements for cash transactions in "exempt accounts" under NYSE Rule 431(d)(3)(B). (Rel. 34-20401)
