## CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

### FINANCIAL NEWS ASSOCIATES, OTHERS PERMANENTLY ENJOINED

The Washington Regional Office announced that on April 24 Judge James C. Cacheris, U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Virginia, issued an order permanently enjoining Financial News Associates, doing business as Center for Strategic Investing, and Brian Warner Smith from future violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the Investment Advisers Act of 1940 and of the Commission's advertising rule. Patrick William Hope Garrard consented, without admitting or denying the complaint's allegations, to an October 23, 1984 Final Judgment permanently enjoining him from future violations of the same provisions. The Court found that defendants failed to register with the Commission as investment advisers while advertising for and publishing "Investment Intelligence," an investment advisory newsletter, and disseminated false and misleading advertisements for the newsletter to prospective subscribers. (SEC v. Financial News Associates, d/b/a Center for Strategic Investing, et al., USDC, EDVA, Civil Action No. 84-0878-A). (LR-10736)

### OIL PROMOTERS ENJOINED

The Fort Worth Regional Office announced that on April 26 the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Texas entered orders of permanent injunction against Kodiak Energy Corporation and Charles F. Jones, both of Dallas, Texas. The orders permanently enjoin the defendants from further violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws. The defendants consented to the orders without admitting or denying the complaint's allegations.

The April 26 complaint alleged that the defendants violated the registration provisions through the offer and sale of fractional undivided interests in oil and gas wells to approximately 235 investors in 23 states, raising over \$2.5 million. The complaint also alleged that the defendants violated the antifraud provisions by omitting to state material facts and misrepresenting material facts concerning, among other things, the amounts of production to be realized from the wells, drilling test results of the wells drilled, and the success of prior drilling programs. (SEC v. Kodiak Energy Corporation and Charles F. Jones, NDTX, No. CA 3-85-0800-G). (LR-10737)

### ORDER OF CIVIL CONTEMPT ENTERED AGAINST CHAROLETTE GARRITY

The Chicago Regional Office announced that on April 15 Judge Robert A. Grant, U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Indiana, South Bend Division, entered an Order of Civil Contempt against Charolette Garrity. The Order directed Garrity to disgorge to the Court, by April 29, 1985, \$581,810 collected from investors in violation of the August 9, 1984 Temporary Restraining Order and the October 5, 1984 Order of Preliminary Injunction previously entered against Charolette and Edward Garrity and their programs, Investments International and Executive I, II, III. The Order of Civil Contempt also provides for Garrity's imprisonment if she fails to make the required disgorgement and cannot show compliance or partial compliance is impossible.

The Commission's January 22, 1985 Notice and Motion For an Order to Show Cause alleged that Garrity violated the freeze placed on her assets by the Temporary Restraining Order and the Preliminary Injunction as well as the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws by selling, since August 9, 1984, \$1 million in securities in a program she operated known as Collectables. (SEC v. Charolette Garrity, et al., NDIN, No. 884-0484, filed August 9, 1984). (LR-10738)

### YOSHINAGA ORDERED TO TURN OVER \$933,933.15 TO THE SEC

The Denver Regional Office announced that on April 22 Chief Judge Sherman G. Fine-silver, U.S. District Court for the District of Colorado, ordered David Ken Yoshinaga to turn over \$933,933.15 belonging to clients of himself and his companies, Investments Management Co., Inc. and G. N. E. Financial Associates, Inc.

On May 1, 1984, a permanent injunction, by consent, had been entered against Yoshinaga and his companies enjoining them from further violations of the antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and the Investment Advisers Act of 1940. (SEC v. Investments Management Company, Inc., et al., USDC CO, Civil Action No. 84-F-901). (LR-10740)

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## CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

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### ANTHONY J. PIVIROTTO AND JOHN ROBERT WOODS SENTENCED

The Washington Regional Office announced that on April 12 the federal court in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, sentenced Anthony J. Pivirotto to three years imprisonment and John Robert Woods to two years imprisonment and placed them both on five years probation, which is to begin upon their release from imprisonment. Both defendants had entered pleas to an indictment alleging that they engaged in a fraudulent scheme whereby investor monies would be placed in a purported mortgage loan business. The Court also ordered the defendants to make restitution of \$989,219 to defrauded investors. (U.S. v. Anthony J. Pivirotto and John Robert Woods, USDC WDPa, Criminal No. 84-184). (LR-10733)

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## INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

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### DBL TAX-FREE CASH FUND INC.

An order has been issued exempting DBL Tax-Free Cash Fund Inc. from Section 12(d)(3) of the Investment Company Act to permit its Limited Term Portfolio to acquire puts from brokers or dealers. (Rel. IC-14495 - May 1)

### BAKER, FENTRESS & COMPANY

An order has been issued granting an exemption from the provisions of Section 2(a)(3) (D) of the Investment Company Act in the proposed purchases by Baker, Fentress & Company of less than five percent of limited partnership interests in various limited partnerships. (Rel. IC-14496 - May 1)

### SOURCE CAPITAL, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until May 27 to request a hearing on an application of Source Capital, Inc. for an order to permit it to repurchase shares of its common and preferred stock from those shareholders who own less than 40 shares at a premium of up to \$1.00 per share in excess of the market price of such shares. # SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

## NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The American Stock Stock Exchange, Inc. filed a proposed rule change under Rule 19b-4 (SR-Amex-85-8) to establish an electronic linkage between the Amex and the Toronto Stock Exchange. The primary objective of the linkage is to provide a mechanism for the direct flow of orders between the two trading floors, providing greater liquidity for issues traded in both markets and affording investors in both Canada and the U.S. an opportunity to obtain the best price available in either country. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of May 6. (Rel. 34-22001)

## ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Commission approved, on an accelerated basis, proposed rule changes by the American, New York, Philadelphia and Pacific Stock Exchanges, and the Chicago Board Options Exchange (SR-Amex-85-10, NYSE-85-10, Phlx-85-8, PSE-85-7, and CBOE-85-12), which amend the Options Allocation Plan. ## ACQUISITIONS OF SECURITIES

Companies and individuals must report to the Commission within ten days on Schedule 13D if after the acquisition of equity securities of a public company their beneficial interest therein exceeds five percent. Persons eligible to use the short form (Schedule 13G) may in lieu of filing a Schedule 13D file a Schedule 13G within 45 days after the end of the calendar year in which the person became subject to Section 13(d)(1). Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
