CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

COMMONWEALTH SECURITIES OF UTAH PERMANENTLY ENJOINED

The Denver Regional Office and the Salt Lake Branch Office announced the filing of a civil injunctive action on April 26, 1985 in the U.S. District Court for the District of Utah against Commonwealth Securities, Inc., a Salt Lake City broker-dealer. Commonwealth consented to the entry of a permanent injunction without admitting or denying the allegations contained in the Commission's complaint. The Honorable Aldon J. Anderson enjoined Commonwealth from future violations of the Commission's rules and regulations regarding net capital, books and records, special operating reports (Focus reports), and telegraphic notices of financial problems (early warning notice). (SEC v. Commonwealth Securities of Utah, USDC, UT. (85-C-0518A)) (LR-10754)

PARR SECURITIES AND GREGORY HERBERT PERMANENTLY ENJOINED

The New York Regional Office announced that on May 6, 1985, the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York, simultaneously with the filing of the Commission's complaint, and with the consent of the defendants, issued an Order finding that defendants, Parr Securities Corp., a registered broker-dealer located in New York, and Gregory Herbert, its president and sole owner, had violated the antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws. The Court permanently enjoined the defendants from further violations of Section 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933 and Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5 thereunder. The Court also granted the Commission's request that a temporary receiver be appointed for Parr; that Parr's assets and accounts be frozen; and that Herbert provide an accounting of his personal assets.

The Court further found, as alleged by the Commission and admitted by the defendants, that the defendants had engaged in securities fraud by, among other things, engaging in fraudulent repurchase agreements and converting customers' fully paid-for government securities to their own use. At the time the complaint was filed, Parr owed its customers and certain creditors at least \$16.1 million as a result of the aforesaid transactions and had cash and cash equivalents of approximately \$750,000. (SEC v. Parr Securities Corp. and Gregory Herbert, 85 Civ.3451 (EW) (SDNY) (LR-10755))

BRENTWOOD SECURITIES, INC. AND CHRISTOPHER J. DELAHUNTY PERMANENTLY ENJOINED

The Los Angeles Regional Office announced that on April 18, 1985, the U.S. District Court for the Central District of California entered a permanent injunction against Brentwood Securities, Inc. (Brentwood) and Christopher J. Delahunty (Delahunty) based upon a complaint by the Commission alleging violations of the antifraud, net capital and record-keeping provisions of the federal securities laws. Brentwood and Delahunty consented to the injunction without admitting or denying the allegations in the complaint.

The Commission's complaint filed on February 7, 1985, alleged that Brentwood and Delahunty, its sole shareholder and president, engaged in unauthorized transactions using clients' funds and converted some of these funds to Delahunty's use. The complaint also alleged that Brentwood operated in violation of the net capital and record-keeping rules, and that the firm did not telegraphically notify the Commission as required of its failure to meet the requirements of the net capital rule. (SEC v. Brentwood Securities, Inc. and Christopher J. Delahunty, USDC, C.D., CA. Civil Action No. 85-906 RJK(Bx) (LR-10756))

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

NORTH AMERICAN SECURITY LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until June 10, 1985, to request a hearing on an application filed by North American Security Life Insurance Company, NASL Variable Account, and NASL Financial Services, Inc. for an order pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Act granting exemptions from the provisions of Section 26(a) and 27(c)(2) of the Act in connection with the issuance of certain flexible premium deferred variable annuity contracts. (Rel. IC-14520 - May 16)

STEWARDSHIP MONEY FUND, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until June 10, 1985 to request a hearing on an application filed pursuant to Section 8(f) of the Act, and Rule 8f-1 thereunder by Stewardship Money Fund, Inc. registered under the Act as a diversified open-end, management company, for an order declaring that Stewardship has ceased to be an investment company. (Rel IC-14521- May 16)

COMPANION INCOME FUND, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until June 10, to request a hearing on an application filed pursuant to Section 8(f) of the Act and Rule 8f-1 thereunder by Companion Income Fund, Inc., registered under the Act as a diversified, open-end management company, for an order declaring that Companion has ceased to be an investment company. (Rel. IC-14522 - May 16)

AARP INSURED TAX FREE INCOME TRUST, ET AL.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until June 10, 1985, to request a hearing on an application of AARP Insured Tax Free Income Trust and AARP Money Market Trust, for an order pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Act, exempting applicants from Section 12(d)(3) of the Act to permit the acquisition of puts from broker-dealers. (Rel IC-14523 - May 16)

TECHNOLOGY FUND, INC., ET AL

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until June 6, 1985 to request a hearing on an application filed by Technology Fund, Inc., and other funds advised by Kemper Financial Services, Inc. or its affiliates. The application requests an order pursuant to Sections 6(c) and 17(b) of the Act exempting the Funds from the provisions of Sections 17(a)(1), 17(a)(2) and 17(e)(1) of the Act with respect to certain securities transactions with affiliated banks. (Rel. IC-14524 - May 16)

UNLISTED TRADING NOT SOUGHT

On May 6, 1985, the Commission issued notice of an application of the Cincinnati Stock Exchange for unlisted trading privileges in six issues currently designated national market system securities and not listed or registered on any national securities exchange (Securities Exchange Act Release No. 22017, May 6, 1985). Such notice was issued by the Commission inadvertently.
