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## RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

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### ADOPTION OF FORMS N-3, N-4 AND RELATED RULE AMENDMENTS

The Commission adopted two new registration forms for use by insurance company separate accounts that offer variable annuity contracts. Form N-3 is for separate accounts that are organized as management investment companies under the Investment Company Act, and Form N-4 is for separate accounts that are organized as unit investment trusts. The Commission also adopted rule amendments related to use of the forms and determined to retain Rule 22d-2 under the Investment Company Act, which permits separate accounts offering variable annuity contracts to establish variations in their sales loads and administrative charges. The Commission had previously requested comment on whether Rule 22d-2 should be rescinded. (Rel. IC-14575)

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## ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

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### JEFFREY ALLAN FISCHER BARRED

The Commission instituted administrative proceedings against Jeffrey A. Fischer, a former registered representative with E.F. Hutton & Co., a registered broker-dealer. Simultaneously with the institution of these proceedings, Fischer submitted an Offer of Settlement which the Commission accepted.

Fischer consented to the Commission's Order Instituting Proceedings, Making Findings, and Imposing Sanctions, without admitting or denying the allegations contained therein. The Order found that Fischer wilfully violated the antifraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 by misrepresenting to customers that he was purchasing securities for their accounts when in fact no securities were purchased, and by misappropriating customers' funds from their securities brokerage accounts. The Commission's Order barred Fischer from association with any broker, dealer, investment adviser, investment company, municipal securities broker or municipal securities dealer. (Rel. 34-22109)

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## **CIVIL PROCEEDINGS**

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### **CRIME CONTROL, INC., OTHERS ENJOINED**

The Chicago Regional Office announced that on June 4 Judge James E. Noland, U.S. District Court for the Southern District of Indiana, permanently enjoined Crime Control, Inc., its former president, James W. Clark, Jr., and its former controller, J. Jeffrey Berty, from further violations of the securities laws. The defendants consented to the Orders without admitting or denying the complaint's allegations.

The complaint alleged that the defendants violated the antifraud, reporting and books and records provisions of the securities laws by overstating Crime Control's revenues and income for fiscal years 1980-1983 and first and second quarters 1984 in filings with the Commission. The complaint further alleged that the overstated figures were due to the improper utilization of certain capital lease accounting methods and the failure to accrue for and write off, in a timely manner, certain uncollectible accounts. In addition, the complaint alleged that Berty, a former audit manager for the accounting firm that examined Crime Control's 1980-1982 financial statements, failed to, among other things, adhere to generally accepted auditing standards relating to the accountant's unqualified opinion issued on, among others, Crime Control's 1982 financial statements. 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## **INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES**

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### **CHICAGO PACIFIC CORPORATION**

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until July 2 to request a hearing on an application filed by Chicago Pacific Corporation for an order exempting it from all provisions of the Investment Company Act, or in the alternative, for an order declaring that it is primarily engaged in a business other than investing or trading in securities. (Rel. IC-14572 - June 11)

### **IDS MUTUAL FUND GROUP**

An order has been issued on an application filed by the IDS Mutual Fund Group and Anne P. Jones declaring that Ms. Jones shall not be deemed to be an interested person within the meaning of Section 2(a)(19)(B) of the Investment Company Act by reason of her being a partner of the law firm of Sutherland, Asbill & Brennan solely for purposes of determining compliance with Section 15(f)(1)(A) of the Act. ### **DREXEL SERIES TRUST**

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until July 8 to request a hearing on an application by Drexel Series Trust for an order exempting it from the provisions of Section 17(f) of the Investment Company Act to permit it to maintain excess variation margin with its futures commission merchant in transactions in futures contracts. 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## HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

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### MAINE YANKEE ATOMIC POWER COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until July 8 to request a hearing on a proposal by Maine Yankee Atomic Power Company, subsidiary of New England Electric System (NEES) and Northeast Utilities (NU), and New England Power Company, subsidiary of NEES, Montaup Electric Company, subsidiary of Eastern Utilities Associates, Connecticut Power and Light Company and Western Massachusetts Electric Company, both subsidiaries of NU. The ten sponsor companies of Maine Yankee will issue guarantees to MYA Fuel Company wherein each sponsor company will guarantee its respective percentage of Maine Yankee's payment obligations as security for an existing Loan Agreement between Maine Yankee and MYA. The Loan Agreement is for \$50 million principal amount of loans for use in the acquisition by Maine Yankee of nuclear fuel and other operating related purposes. (Rel. 35-23730 - June 13)

### SOUTHERN COMPANY SERVICES, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until July 5 to request a hearing on a proposal by Southern Company Services, Inc., subsidiary of The Southern Company, to extend its short-term borrowing authority through June 30, 1986. (Rel. 35-23731 - June 13)

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## SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

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### IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

A rule change filed by the National Securities Clearing Corporation became effective under Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The rule change (SR-NSCC-85-5) sets a uniform fee of \$.25 for all types of processing and modifies NSCC's Automated Stock Borrow Procedures to charge \$.25 if instructions are submitted in paper format. ### NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Pacific Clearing Corporation filed a proposed rule change (SR-PCC-85-4) that would enable it to provide services to participants of Pacific Securities Depository Trust Company in connection with a proposed program for the deposit and safekeeping of municipal bonds in bearer form. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of June 17. (Rel. 34-22132)

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## TRUST INDENTURE ACT RELEASES

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### STORAGE EQUITIES, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until July 8 to request a hearing on an application by Storage Equities, Inc. under Section 310(b)(1)(ii) of the Trust Indenture Act of 1939. The application declares that the trusteeship of Trust Services of America, Inc. (as successor trustee to First Interstate Bank of California), under a seventh supplemental indenture to an existing indenture dated August 9, 1983, is not so likely to involve a material conflict of interest as to make it necessary to disqualify Trust Services from acting as trustee. Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
