PROCEDURES FOR EARLY STAFF REVIEW OF EXECUTIVE COMPENSATION DISCLOSURE

In order to facilitate staff review of executive compensation disclosure during the 1994 proxy season, the Commission recently announced in its publication of refinements to the executive compensation requirements [See Rel. No. 33-7032 (November 22, 1993)] that issuers may submit their executive compensation disclosures for staff review prior to filing with the Commission. These submissions should be directed to the attention of John Bernas of the Division of Corporation Finance by mail at Securities Exchange Commission, 450 Fifth Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20549, Mail Stop 3-7 or by facsimile to (202) 272-7546. In order to review the draft, the staff would have to be provided with all of the disclosure required by Items 402 and 404 of Regulation S-K and Item 10 of Schedule 14A at least 20 days before comments are necessary. Issuers should confirm receipt of the materials by calling (202) 272-3097. Issuers submitting the information on EDGAR should use the document tag <CORRESP> which will ensure that the information remains non-public. ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

PHILLIP HUSS ORDERED TO DISGORGE PROFITS

The Commission announced that on December 20, 1993 the Honorable Donald D. Alsop, U.S. District Court Judge for the District of Minnesota, entered an Order against Phillip T. Huss (Huss), by consent, setting disgorgement of \$4,400.01, plus prejudgment interest of \$3,163.86, but waived such payments based on Huss' demonstrated inability to pay. Previously in this case, Huss was enjoined, by consent, from engaging in further violations of the antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws.

In its complaint, the Commission alleged that, from at least December 1987 through January 1989, while employed at Summit Investment Corporation, a broker-dealer registered with the Commission, Huss engaged in unauthorized purchases of securities in the accounts of his customers and also failed to execute sales transactions in those accounts. INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

PUTNAM CAPITAL MANAGER TRUST, ET AL.

An order has been issued pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act exempting Putnam Capital Manager Trust, (Trust), Putnam Investment Management, Inc. and certain life insurance companies and their separate accounts investing now or in the future in the Trust from the provisions of Sections 9(a), 13(a), 15(a) and 15(b) of the Act and Rules 6e-2(b) (15) and 6e-3(T) (b) (15) thereunder to the extent necessary to permit shares of the Trust to be sold to and held by separate accounts funding variable annuity and variable life insurance contracts issued by both affiliated and unaffiliated life insurance companies. (Rel. IC-19984 - December 29)

AMERICAN NATIONAL INSURANCE COMPANY, ET AL.

An order has been issued pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act exempting American National Insurance Company, American National Variable Annuity Separate Account (Separate Account) and Securities Management and Research, Inc. from the provisions of Sections 26(a) (2) and 27(c) (2) of the Act to the extent necessary to permit the deduction of mortality and expense risk charges from the assets of the Separate Account in connection with the offer and sale of certain variable annuity contracts. (Rel. IC-19985 - December 29)

INVESCO VARIABLE INVESTMENT, ET AL.

An order has been issued pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act exempting Invesco Variable Investment Funds, Inc. (Fund) and Invesco Funds Group, Inc. (together with the Fund, Applicants) from the provisions of Sections 9(a), 13(a), 15(a) and 15(b) of the Act and Rules 6e-2(b) (15) and 6e-3(T) (b) (15) thereunder. The order permits, to the extent necessary, shares of the Fund to be sold to and held by variable annuity and variable life insurance separate accounts of both affiliated and unaffiliated life insurance companies. (Rel. IC-19986 - December 29)

CROWN AMERICA SEPARATE ACCOUNT A

An order has been issued pursuant to Section 8(f) of the Investment Company Act declaring that Crown America Separate Account A has ceased to be an investment company as defined by the Act. (Rel. IC-19987 - December 29)

CROWN AMERICA SEPARATE ACCOUNT D

An order has been issued pursuant to Section 8(f) of the Investment Company Act declaring that Crown America Separate Account D has ceased to be an investment company as defined by the Act. (Rel. IC-19988 - December 29)

INSURANCE MANAGEMENT SERIES, ET AL.

An order has been issued pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act exempting Insurance Management Series (Fund), Federated Advisers, and certain life insurance companies and their separate accounts investing now or in the future in the Fund from the provisions of Sections 9(a), 13(a), 15(a) and 15(b) of the Act and Rules 6e-2(b) (15) and 6e-3(T) (b) (15) thereunder. The order permits, to the extent necessary, shares of the Fund to be sold to and held by variable annuity and variable life insurance separate accounts of both affiliated and unaffiliated life insurance companies. (Rel. IC-19989 - December 29)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

NATIONAL FUEL GAS COMPANY, ET AL.

An order has been issued authorizing a proposal by National Fuel Gas Company and its subsidiary companies, National Fuel Gas Distribution Corporation, National Fuel Gas Supply Corporation, Empire Exploration, Inc., Penn-York Energy Corporation, Seneca Resources Corporation, Utility Constructors, Inc., Highland Land & Minerals, Inc., Enerop Corporation, Data-Track Account Services, Inc., and National Fuel Resources, Inc. The companies propose to issue and sell commercial paper and other short-term notes; borrow short-term under credit facilities with banks or other financial institutions; participate in an intrasystem money pool; and enter into interest rate and currency exchange agreements. (Rel. 35-25964)

PUBLIC SERVICE COMPANY OF OKLAHOMA, ET AL.

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing Public Service Company of Oklahoma (PSO), a subsidiary of Central and South West Corporation, a registered holding company, and its subsidiary company, Ash Creek Mining Company (Ash Creek), to extend, through December 31, 1995, the time in which PSO may make short-term loans to Ash Creek in the maximum principal amount outstanding at any one time of \$5 million. NEW ENGLAND ELECTRIC SYSTEM

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing New England Electric System (NEES), a registered holding company, to extend its authority through December 31, 1996 to issue, sell and acquire up to 10,693,536 shares of its authorized but unissued common stock to the NEES System Dividend Reinvestment and Common Share Purchase Plan. (Rel. 35-25966)

NEWPORT ELECTRIC CORPORATION

An order has been issued authorizing Newport Electric Corporation (Newport), an electric public-utility subsidiary company of Eastern Utilities Associates, a registered holding company, to refinance \$7,925,000 aggregate amount of outstanding tax-exempt bonds. To effect such refinancing, Newport may borrow, on or before December 31, 1994, the proceeds of one or more issues of refunding bonds (Refunding Bonds) to be issued by the Rhode Island Development Corporation or similar governmental agency with tax-exempt authority. To enhance the credit rating of the Refunding Bonds, Newport may arrange for an irrevocable letter of credit. The Commission reserved jurisdiction over a successor letter of credit and a fixed-rate letter of credit. (Rel. 35-25967)

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The New York Stock Exchange filed a proposed rule change (SR-NYSE-93-47) to amend the NYSE's current policy to permit listed non-U.S. companies to submit summary annual reports to ADR holders. Publication of the proposal is expected in the Federal Register during the week of January 3. (Rel. 34-33400)

ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Commission granted accelerated approval to a proposed rule change filed by the Chicago Stock Exchange (SR-CHX-93-29) to extend the trading hours for the Chicago Stock Basket. (Rel. 34-33401)

The Commission granted accelerated approval to a proposed rule change filed by the Philadelphia Stock Exchange (SR-PHLX-93-57) to extend the Phlx's Automated Options Market (AUTOM) system pilot program, which is an electronic delivery system of small options orders to the Phlx trading floor, until December 31, 1994. Publication of the order is expected in the Federal Register during the week of January 3. (Rel. 34-33405)

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved a proposed rule change filed by the New York Stock Exchange (SR-NYSE-93-35) to add procedures relating to market-at-the-close orders on expiration days to the list of exchange rule violations and fines applicable thereto pursuant to Rule 476A and to amend the NYSE minor rule violation enforcement and reporting plan accordingly.
