ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

RUSSELL PONCE ORDERED TO CEASE AND DESIST AND BARRED FROM APPEARANCE AS ACCOUNTANT

On August 31, 2000, the Commission disciplined Russell Ponce, formerly a certified public accountant. Ponce was the auditor for American Aircraft Corporation (AAC) and audited AAC's financial statements during four fiscal years. These financial statements recorded a license, certain tooling costs, and a prototype as assets of AAC. The Commission ordered Ponce to cease and desist from violations of Exchange Act Sections 10(b), 13(a), and 13(b)(2) and Rules 10b-5, 12b-20, 13a-1, and 13a-13. It barred him from practice as an accountant before the Commission with the right to reapply in five years.

The Commission found that AAC purchased from William F. Moody, Jr., AAC's president and chief executive officer, an exclusive license for certain aircraft and helicopter designs for 2.5 million shares of AAC restricted stock. Management valued the license at \$4.68 million. Ponce knew that the license constituted a major part of AAC's assets. He also knew that, two weeks later, AAC acquired the assets of Phalanx Organization, Inc. (whose controlling shareholder was Moody) valued at \$124,742 for 28.6 million shares of AAC common stock, worth \$.0044 per share.

AAC's in-house accountant expensed certain tooling costs for various aircraft that the company was designing, as well as the prototype of a helicopter whose design AAC was modifying. Ponce improperly changed these entries and treated the tooling costs and the prototype as assets. Financial Accounting Standard No. 2 requires that all research and development costs be charged as expenses when incurred.

In 1993, AAC restated its financial statements to reflect that the aircraft designs had not progressed beyond research and development. It also wrote off approximately \$654,000 that had been recorded as inventory, work-in-progress, and tooling. The Commission concluded that Ponce willfully aided, abetted, and caused AAC's filing of misleading financial reports with the Commission and caused AAC to fail to correct these misleading reports. The Commission also found that Ponce violated the antifraud provisions by falsely representing that he audited AAC's financial statements in accordance with Generally Accepted Auditing Standards (GAAS) and that AAC's financial statements were presented in accordance with Generally Accepting Accounting Procedures.

The Commission found that Ponce deviated from GAAS by failing to exercise due professional care and failing to render an accurate audit report. Ponce further failed to comply with auditor independence requirements since he was owed money for services for prior year audits. Ponce allowed his accounting license to lapse in 1994. SEC SETTLES INSIDER TRADING CASE AGAINST CHRISTOPHER BURTON

On August 31, 2000, the Commission filed a settled injunctive action in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia against Christopher L. Burton, a resident of Fort Smith, Arkansas. The Commission's complaint alleges that in January 1999 Burton engaged in insider trading in the securities of Arkansas Best Corporation, a holding company engaged in transportation and related businesses. At the time of the trading, Burton was the Director of Economic Analysis for Arkansas Best's principal subsidiary. Without admitting or denying the allegations of the complaint, Burton consented to the entry of a final judgment permanently enjoining him from violating Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5 thereunder, and ordering Burton to pay \$85,319 in profits gained as a result of his purchases and sales of Arkansas Best securities, plus prejudgment interest of \$9,512. Based on Burton's demonstrated financial condition, a civil penalty was not assessed against him.

The complaint alleges that from January 12, 1999 to January 21, 1999, Burton purchased Arkansas Best common stock and units of a fund invested solely in Arkansas Best stock while he possessed material non-public information concerning the company's soon-to-be released earnings and other aspects of its financial performance. Prior to the opening of trading on January 22, 1999, Arkansas Best announced that it had earned \$.41 per share during the fourth quarter of 1998, an increase of 116% over the fourth quarter of 1997, and that for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1998, net income was \$1.21 versus \$.84 for the 1997 fiscal year. At the time, consensus Wall Street estimates for the fourth quarter of 1998 had been \$.17 per share. The complaint alleges that Burton's total profit from trading Arkansas Best securities while in possession of material non-public information was \$85,319. [SEC v. Christopher L. COMMISSION FILES ACTION AGAINST ALLEGED EMULEX FRAUDSTER

On August 31, 2000, the Commission filed a complaint against Mark S. Jakob (Jakob) of El Segundo, California, for perpetrating an Internet hoax six days earlier. As a result of Jakob's scheme, in just 16 minutes, a Southern California high-tech company temporarily lost \$2.2 billion in market value and investors suffered millions of dollars of trading losses. The Commission's complaint and documents filed in support of emergency relief allege:

- Jakob, age 23, until recently was an employee of Internet Wire, Inc., a press release distribution company, and a student at El Camino Community College.

- On August 17 and 18, 2000, Jakob, expecting a decline in Emulex's stock price, sold short 3,000 Emulex shares at an average price of \$80 per share. By August 24, 2000, however, Emulex stock had risen to over \$113 per share, resulting in Jakob's having unrealized losses of over \$97,000.
- On the evening of August 24, 2000, Jakob, using an alias and purporting to act on Emulex's behalf, used a personal computer at El Camino Community College to send an e-mail instructing Internet Wire to issue an attached press release for Emulex.
- As instructed, on August 25, 2000, at 9:30 am EDT, Internet Wire issued what purported to be an Emulex press release. The release stated that the Commission was investigating Emulex's accounting practices, that its CEO had resigned, and that it would revise its earnings to report a loss instead of a profit. The release was a complete hoax--Emulex did not issue, or authorize the issuance of, the release and all of the statements in the release were false.
- The false press release's effect on the market was swift and dramatic. At 10:13 am EDT, a news service issued a headline containing information from the false release. In the next 16 minutes, 2.3 million Emulex shares traded, and the price plummeted almost \$61, resulting in Emulex's losing \$2.2 in market capitalization. At 10:29 am EDT, NASDAQ halted trading after learning from Emulex that the release was false. Emulex resumed trading later that day after the hoax was discovered, and the price rebounded to close at \$105.75.
- On August 25, 2000, after the issuance of the false press release and just before the trading halt, Jakob covered his short position, realizing a profit of over \$54,000. Minutes later, Jakob purchased 3,500 shares, which he sold on August 28, 2000, at a profit of over \$186,000. In total, Jakob's profit from this hoax was over \$241,000.

The Commission's complaint charges that Jakob's scheme violated the antifraud provisions of Section 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933 and Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5 thereunder. The Commission is seeking a temporary restraining order, preliminary injunction and permanent injunction against future antifraud violations, disgorgement with prejudgment interest, civil penalties, and an order freezing assets, expediting discovery, and prohibiting the destruction of documents.

In a related action, Jakob was arrested by agents from the Federal Bureau of Investigation's Los Angeles field office and charged with securities and wire fraud.

The Commission acknowledges the assistance of the Office of the United States Attorney for the Central District of California, the Federal Bureau of Investigation, and

DEAN H. HARRIS SUED FOR FRAUD

On August 30, 2000, the Commission filed a complaint against Dean H. Harris, former registered representative with the Atlanta office of a broker-dealer. The complaint alleges that from April 1995 through August 1997, Harris acted with others to cause the misappropriation and fraudulent transfer of over \$13 million in funds and securities from State Mutual Insurance Company (State Mutual), of Rome, Georgia, through unauthorized securities transactions and unauthorized transfers of money. Harris received kickbacks of approximately \$1.3 million for his role in these unauthorized securities transactions and unauthorized transfers of money. As a result, Harris violated Section 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933 (Securities Act) and Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (Exchange Act) and Rule 10b-5 thereunder.

Harris, without admitting or denying the allegations against him, has consented to the entry of an order permanently enjoining him from violating Section 17(a) of the Securities Act and Section 10(b) of the Exchange Act and Rule 10b-5 thereunder. The Commission has filed a proposed final judgment with the court.

This action is a continuation of the Commission's investigation concerning the misappropriation of funds and securities of State Mutual. The Commission has previously obtained a permanent injunction and other relief against Robert J. Strauss, State Mutual's vice president and portfolio manager. See LR-16378. [SEC v. Dean H. Harris, Civil Action No. 1 00-CV-2269, N.D. Ga] (LR-16672)

FORMER PRESIDENT OF PUBLICLY TRADED COMPANY SETTLES WITH SEC

The Commission announced that on May 12, 2000, the Northern District Court of California entered judgment against Thomas K. Williams. (Williams), the former President of American Telecommunications Standards, Inc. (ATSI), once a publicly traded company, and President of SynCom International, Inc. (SynCom), for participating in the unlawful distribution of securities without a valid registration statement on file, a violation of Section 5(a) and 5(c) of the Securities Act of 1933. Williams resides near Boulder, Colorado.

The Commission alleged that in February 1998, Williams agreed to transfer 2.1 million shares of ATSI stock while an "affiliate" and "control person" of ATSI. At the time, no valid registration statement was on file with the Commission. Later, these shares were sold on the market at a profit in a complex market manipulation scheme. As a result of the settlement, Williams consented to pay a civil penalty of \$5,000 and an order permanently enjoining him from future violations of Section 5(a) and 5(c) of the Securities Act of 1933.

This settlement is part of the Commission's market manipulation case involving fourteen other defendants, which was filed as part of the Commission's microcap fraud sweep. The case remains pending. Williams consented to the judgment without admitting or denying the allegations contained in the complaint. See LR-16237. [SEC v. Durante, Civil Action No. C 99-3690, SBA, N.D. INTERNET NEWSLETTER OPERATORS ENJOINED

On August 29, 2000, Stephen B. Marek and Dominic Roelandt were enjoined, by consent and without admitting or denying the complaint's allegations, from violating the antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act, Section 10(b), and Rule 10b-5 thereunder. Marek was ordered to pay disgorgement of \$100,835 and a civil penalty of \$100,835. Roelandt was ordered to pay disgorgement of \$41,958 and a civil penalty of \$41,958.

The Commission's complaint, filed April 4, 2000 charged that Roelandt, using an Internet newsletter named "Coldstocks," and Marek, using newsletters named "BigProfitNews" and "Bulls-Eye Stocks," touted the stocks of 35 microcap companies over the Internet. The complaint alleged that e-mail messages or websites contained various false and misleading statements concerning the claimed performance of Marek's and Roelandt's past stock picks, their trading intentions, and compensation received by Marek. U.S. District Judge Earl H. Carroll of the District Court in Phoenix, Arizona issued the order. See also LR-16500 (April 4, 2000). [SEC v. Stephen B. SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The National Association of Securities Dealers filed a proposed rule change (SR-NASD-00-36) under Section 19(b)(2) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 relating to options position reporting requirements and the application of options position and exercise limits to trades with non-member brokers and dealers. Publication of the notice in the Federal Register is expected during the week of September 4. (Release No. 34-43220)

IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission issued a notice of a proposed rule change (SR-CBOE-00-39) filed by the Chicago Board Options Exchange amending the exchange's fee schedule to waive the transaction fee, trade match fee, floor brokerage fee, and the retail automatic execution system fee on public customer option orders based on a reduced-value of the Nasdaq-100 Index. Publication of the proposal is expected in the Federal Register during the week of September 4. (Release No. 34-43221)

The Commission issued a notice of a proposed rule change (SR-CBOE-00-33) filed by the Chicago Board Options Exchange amending the exchange's fee schedule to impose a fee on the designated primary market-maker for trading options based on a reduced-value of the Nasdaq-100 Index for its proprietary account. Publication of the proposal is expected in the Federal Register during the week of September 4. (Release No. 34-43226)

A proposed rule change (SR-AMEX-00-38) filed by the American Stock Exchange on July 20, 2000, to adopt a new marketing fee to be imposed on transactions of specialists and registered options traders, has become immediately effective under Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. Publication of the proposal is expected in the Federal Register during the week of September 4. (Release No. 34-43228)
