## RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

### APPLICATIONS FOR RELIEF FROM DISQUALIFICATION

LIBRARY

The Commission today announced various factors which it considers when it entertains applicants for relief from disqualification from participation in the securities business or some aspect thereof. In this regard, the Commission noted that situations may exist where it may appear appropriate to the Commission, in its discretion, to lift a disqualification if, after changed circumstances or the passage of a period of time, the disqualified applicant is able to demonstrate to the Commission's satisfaction that removal of the disqualification would be consistent with the public interest. The following factors, among others, are generally considered by the Commission in determining whether to lift a disqualification: the period of time since entry of the disqualification order, the applicant's attempts to undo any injury resulting from his prior misconduct, the applicant's overall conduct during this period, the type and nature of the applicant's prospective duties, and any other factors which the Commission in its discretion may deem pertinent. In addition, the Commission specified the prescribed procedures to be followed by an applicant seeking relief from disqualification. (Rel. 34-11267)

## DECISIONS IN ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

### DISQUALIFICATION OF DONALD R. HUNTER, ATTORNEY, FROM COMMISSION PRACTICE FINAL

The suspension of Donald R. Hunter, a Seattle attorney, from appearance or practice before the Commission has become permanent.

In November 1974, the Commission temporarily suspended Hunter from practice before it on the basis of an injunction entered against him by the U.S. District Court for the Western District of Washington. That injunction, which was entered with Hunter's consent and without his admitting or denying the Commission's charges against him, permanently enjoined Hunter from violating registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws. (SEC v. Wright Investments, Inc., et al.). Hunter did not petition to lift the suspension within the required time, and it therefore became permanent.

In the injunctive action, the Commission had alleged that Hunter, former executive vice-president and general counsel for Wright Investments, Inc., violated the above provisions by engaging in the fraudulent offer and sale of unregistered securities. (Rel. 34-11253)

## COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

### INITIAL DECISIONS REVOKE BROKER-DEALER REGISTRATIONS OF BUSINESS EQUITY CORP. AND DU-TEL INVESTMENT CO., INC. AND BAR GASTON R. DESAUTELS

Chief Administrative Law Judge Warren E. Blair has filed two initial decisions in administrative proceedings under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, each of which is subject to review by the Commission either on its own motion or on petition of a party. One decision revokes the broker-dealer registration of Business Equity Corp., of Miami, Florida, and bars Gaston R. Desautels, who controlled that firm, from association with any broker or dealer; the second decision orders similar action against the broker-dealer registration of Du-Tel Investment Corp., Inc., of Miami, Florida and Desautels, its president and majority stockholder.

Both registrants were found to have wilfully violated the Commission's net capital and bookkeeping rules as well as certain other rules regulating the conduct of registered broker-dealers and Desautels was found to have wilfully aided and abetted those violations.

## INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

### AURORA EQUITY FUND

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until March 24 to request a hearing on the application of Aurora Equity Fund, Inc. for an order that the company has ceased to be an investment company. (Rel. IC-8686 - Feb. 25)

### IVY FUND

An order has been issued on an application by Ivy Fund, Inc., a mutual fund, and Standish, Ayer & Wood, Inc., a registered investment adviser, exempting Standish, Ayer from certain provisions of the Act to the extent necessary to permit Standish, Ayer (1) to serve as investment adviser to Ivy Fund prior to approval by the Fund's shareholders of an investment advisory contract between the Fund and Standish, Ayer and (2) to receive from the Fund an amount by which the fee specified in such aforementioned investment advisory contract, as applied to the period Standish, Ayer rendered services to the Fund prior to approval of the contract by shareholders of the Fund, exceeds any costs previously paid by Fund to Standish, Ayer for such services, provided that Fund shareholders approve the contract and such retroactive payment. ### INVESTORS SYNDICATE OF AMERICA

An order has been issued on an application of Investors Syndicate of America, Inc. (ISA), a registered face-amount certificate company whose common stock is wholly-owned by Investors Diversified Services, Inc. (IDS), which serves ISA as its investment adviser and principal underwriter, IDS Life Insurance Company, another wholly-owned subsidiary of IDS, and Investors Variable Payment Fund, Inc., a mutual fund whose investment adviser and principal underwriter is IDS, permitting applicants, who own notes of Reeves Telecom Corporation (Reeves), to (1) consent to the purchase by Reeves of its outstanding 2% preferred stock and (2) consent to an amendment by Reeves of its 9% convertible subordinated notes so as to permit the purchase of such stock. ### HONEYWELL OVERSEAS FINANCE COMPANY
