NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Pacific Stock Exchange has filed a proposed rule change under Rule 19b-4 to (a) prohibit the imposition of floor brokerage with respect to round-lot limit orders executed through COMEX, the automatic execution system operated by the PSE, and (b) expand the COMEX system to make executions through COMEX available for orders up to 300 shares. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of November 17. (Rel. 34-11828)

NASD SUBMITS A PROPOSAL TO AMEND ITS RULES CONCERNING ASSIGNMENT OF SECURITIES

The National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc. (the NASD) submitted on November 10 a proposed rule change under Rule 19b-4 with respect to the NASD's Rules concerning the necessity for witnesses to an assignment of a registered security. The proposed rule change deletes the requirement of a witness to a signature on an assignment or power of substitution. Publication of the submission is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of November 17. (Rel. 34-11832)

DECISIONS IN ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

NAGLER-WEISSMAN & CO., INC. AND RESCH-CASSIN & CO., INC. REVOKED; OFFICERS BARRED

The Commission has revoked the broker-dealer registrations of Nagler-Weissman & Co., Inc. of the Bronx and Resch-Cassin & Co., Inc. of Manhattan. It has also barred Adolph Weissman, formerly vice president and part-owner of Nagler-Weissman and Michael Cassin, formerly chairman of the board and part-owner of Resch-Cassin, from association with any broker, dealer or registered investment company. The Commission's order allows Cassin after one year and Weissman after two years to apply to the Commission to become reassociated in a non-supervisory position. Each must show, however, that he will be adequately supervised.

The sanctions were based on findings that respondents violated the antifraud, financial responsibility and recordkeeping provisions of the securities laws. Respondents consented to the findings and sanctions, solely for the purpose of settling this proceeding and without admitting or denying the charges against them. (Rel. 34-11808)

COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

VOLUNTARY DISCLOSURE OF SOCIAL SECURITY ACCOUNT NUMBERS ON CERTAIN COMMISSION FORMS

The Commission has announced that in light of Section 7 of the Privacy Act of 1974 (Pub. L. 93-579), it will no longer deem as mandatory the disclosure of social security account numbers on certain forms which collect information from or about individuals. Although the disclosure of social security account numbers may be of assistance to the Commission in identifying persons and in promptly processing such forms, the Commission believes that disclosure of such numbers should be voluntary. SECTION 12(h) APPLICATION

The Commission has ordered that a hearing to determine whether the application filed by I.R.E. Florida Income Partners, Ltd. should be granted or denied be held on December 9 at 10:00 a.m. at the offices of the Securities and Exchange Commission, Room 776 500 North Capitol Street, Washington, D.C. Any person desiring to be heard is directed to file with the Secretary of the Commission his request as provided by Rule 9(c) of the Commission's Rules of Practice, setting forth any issues of fact or law which he desires to controvert and/or setting forth any additional issues which he feels should be considered. COMMISSION TO REFUND ANNUAL ASSESSMENTS
PAID BY REGISTERED INVESTMENT ADVISERS

The Commission announced that it will refund annual assessment fees paid by registered investment advisers pursuant to former Rule 203-3(b), (c), (d) and (e) under the Investment Advisers Act of 1940, which was repealed by the Commission on March 29. The Commission will identify from its records and make refunds to those advisers and former advisers who paid annual fees, and it will ordinarily not be necessary for advisers to make application for a refund. Any adviser who has not received a refund to which he believes himself entitled by February 15, 1976 is requested to make inquiry at that time of the Office of the Comptroller, Securities and Exchange Commission, Washington, D.C. 20549. TRADING SUSPENSIONS

TRADING SUSPENDED IN TRANSJERSEY BANCORP

The Commission has announced the temporary suspension of over-the-counter trading in the securities of Transjersey Bancorp for the single ten-day period beginning at 5:00 p.m. November 14 and terminating at midnight (EST) on November 23.

The Commission suspended trading in the securities of Transjersey Bancorp because of questions concerning the recent market activity in the company's common stock and other matters pertaining to the company. (Rel. 34-11834)

COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS

D.C. TRANSIT SYSTEM, INC. ENJOINED, DISCONTINUANCE AS TO O. ROY CHALK ENTERED

The Commission announced that on November 6 the Honorable George L. Hart, Jr., of the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia, filed a final judgment of permanent injunction as to D.C. Transit System, Inc. and discontinuance as to O. Roy Chalk, which was entered pursuant to a consent by defendants and a letter from defendant Chalk to the Commission. The final judgment permanently enjoins D.C. Transit from failing to file timely with the Commission proper current and periodic reports in contravention of Section 13(a) of the Exchange Act and the rules and regulations thereunder, and, by consent, discontinues the action against Chalk without prejudice. On June 16 D.C. Transit filed its delinquent December 31, 1974 Form 10-K and its delinquent Form 10-Q for its quarter ended March 31.

D.C. Transit has securities listed for trading on the PBW Stock Exchange. On May 1 the Commission suspended exchange and over-the-counter trading in D.C. Transit securities for a ten-day period due to D.C. Transit's failure to comply with the reporting provisions of Section 13(a) of the Exchange Act. (SEC v. D.C. INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

THE FIRST NATIONAL DUAL SERIES TAX-EXEMPT BOND TRUST

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 8 to request a hearing on the application of The First National Dual Series Tax-Exempt Bond Trust, Series 1 and Subsequent Series, a registered unit investment trust, and Van Kampen Sauermaan Inc., the Fund's sponsor, for an order exempting the Fund from the initial net worth requirements of Section 14(a) and from the limitations on the distributions of capital gains contained in Rule 19b-1, and exempting from Rule 22c-1 the proposed secondary market operation of the Fund's sponsor. EXTRACTABLE RESOURCES

An order has been issued declaring that Extractable Resources, Inc., has ceased to be an investment company. (Rel. IC-9034 - Nov. 14)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

ALLEGHENY POWER SYSTEM

An order has been issued authorizing Allegheny Power System, Inc., a registered holding company, to act as surety for one of its subsidiaries. (Rel. 35-19244 - Nov. 14)

MIDDLE SOUTH ENERGY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 9 to request a hearing on a proposal of Middle South Energy, Inc., a subsidiary of Middle South Utilities, Inc., to increase the amount of its authorized long-term bank borrowings from \$308,500,000 to \$353,500,000. (Rel. 35-19245 - Nov. 14)

GEORGIA POWER COMPANY

An order has been issued approving a proposal of Georgia Power Company, a subsidiary of The Southern Company, to issue and sell, at competitive bidding, up to \$100 million of first mortgage bonds. The net proceeds of the sale will be used to finance, in part, Georgia's 1975 construction program and applied to the payment of short-term indebtedness incurred to finance Georgia's construction program.
