CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

FORMER SECURITIES SALESPERSON NAMED IN INJUNCTIVE ACTION FOR FRAUD

The Commission announced that on June 14 a complaint was filed in U.S. District Court for the District of Oregon against Meredith K.M. Smith, a former securities salesman who was barred by the NASD in 1989 from association with any NASD member. The complaint alleges that Smith violated the antifraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, in connection with the offerings of stock of two companies: Telergy, Inc. and Columbia Gulf, Inc. The complaint alleges that in connection with these offerings, Smith, among other things, misrepresented Telergy's planned business, failed to disclose his NASD bar, fraudulently closed the Telergy offering and misappropriated a total of approximately \$71,500 from both offerings. The complaint seeks an injunction, disgorgement, prejudgment interest and penalties. [SEC v. Meredith K.M. Smith, No. 93-701-JU, D.Ore.] (LR-13677)

THOMAS GILMARTIN, JR. AND TERENCE ZAWACKI ENJOINED

The Commission announced that on June 10 Thomas P. Gilmartin, Jr. (Gilmartin) and Terence W. Zawacki (Zawacki) were permanently enjoined based on a complaint filed by the Commission on December 4, 1992. The complaint alleged that Gilmartin sold unregistered securities, failed to register as an investment adviser and, aided and abetted by Zawacki, misappropriated proceeds from the sale of such securities. Gilmartin also aided and abetted a broker-dealer's net capital violations and he and Zawacki aided and abetted books and records violations.

An order of permanent injunction by default was entered against Gilmartin. Zawacki consented to the entry of an order of permanent injunction without admitting or denying the allegations in the complaint. Gilmartin and Zawacki are permanently enjoined from violations of the antifraud and books and records provisions of the federal securities laws. Gilmartin is also permanently enjoined from violations of the registration provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and the Investment Advisers Act of 1940 and the net capital provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

MUTUAL FUND GROUP, ET AL.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until July 13, 1993 to request a hearing on an application filed by Mutual Fund Group, et al., for an order under Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act that would exempt certain applicants from Section 15(f)(1)(A). Olympus Asset Management Company, the investment adviser of Olympus Investment Trust, plans to sell its investment advisory business to The Chase Manhattan Bank, N.A., the investment adviser of Mutual Fund Group. Without the requested exemption, Mutual Fund Group would have to reconstitute its board to meet the 75% non-interested director requirement of Section 15(f)(1)(A) to allow Olympus Asset Management Company to rely on the safe-harbor provided by Section 15(f). HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

ALLEGHENY POWER SYSTEM, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until July 12, 1993 to request a hearing on a proposal by Allegheny Power System, Inc. (APS), a registered holding company, to extend its period of authorization to December 31, 1994 during which it may issue and sell the 1.52 million shares of its authorized and unissued common stock, par value \$2.50 (Common Stock), remaining of the 3.5 million shares previously authorized through December 31, 1993. APS further proposes to issue and sell, through December 31, 1994, up to an additional 3 million shares of Common Stock. APS was authorized to begin negotiations with potential underwriters to sell the Common Stock. (Rel. 35-25829)

THE SOUTHERN COMPANY, ET AL.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until July 12, 1993 to request a hearing on a proposal by Southern Company Services, Inc. (Services), a wholly owned service subsidiary company of The Southern Company (Southern) to engage in financing. Services proposes to incur indebtedness and issue notes, through December 31, 1996, up to an aggregate principal amount of \$200 million pursuant to borrowings from lenders; short-term or long-term borrowings under one or more revolving credit commitment agreements; short-term borrowings from banks (collectively, Borrowing); and/or borrowings from Southern. Southern proposes to guarantee the Borrowings of Services. (Rel. 35-25829)

THE SOUTHERN COMPANY, ET AL.

A supplemental notice has been issued giving interested persons until July 12, 1993 to request a hearing on a proposal by The Southern Company (Southern), a registered holding company, and its public utility subsidiaries, Alabama Power Company (Alabama),

Georgia Power Company (Georgia), Gulf Power Company (Gulf), Mississippi Power Company (Mississippi), Savannah Electric and Power Company (Savannah) and Southern Electric Generating Company (SEGCO)(collectively, Applicants). The Applicants (other than Southern) propose to issue and sell, from time to time through March 31, 1996, up to the aggregate principal amounts of \$530 million for Alabama, \$1.2 billion for Georgia, \$100 million for Gulf, \$140 million for Mississippi, \$70 million for Savannah and \$100 million for SEGCO, short-term and/or term loan notes to banks, commercial paper to dealers and/or non-negotiable promissory notes to public entities in connection with the financing of certain pollution control facilities through the issuance by such public entities of their revenue bond anticipation notes. ARKANSAS POWER & LIGHT COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing a proposal by Arkansas Power & Light Company (AP&L), an electric public-utility subsidiary of Entergy Corporation, a registered holding company. AP&L proposes to enter into a loan agreement with Independence County, Arkansas (County) so that the County will issue up to \$45 million aggregate principal amount of one or more new series of tax-exempt revenue bonds (Tax-Exempt Bonds) to be used to refinance \$45 million principal amount of County 11 1/8% Pollution Control Revenue Bonds, 1983 Series. In addition, AP&L proposes to guarantee payment on the Tax-Exempt Bonds by entering into a letter of credit and reimbursement agreement for the issuance of a letter of credit; providing an insurance policy on the Tax-Exempt Bonds; and/or issuing collateral bonds. ALABAMA POWER COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing Alabama Power Company, an electric public-utility subsidiary company of The Southern Company, a registered holding company, to finance \$9.8 million of the costs of certain pollution control and sewage and solid waste disposal facilities located in Columbia, Alabama. The Commission has reserved jurisdiction over all transactions associated with refinancing additional costs for such facilities in amounts of up to \$343.210 million. (Rel. 35-25831)

NEW ENGLAND ELECTRIC SYSTEM

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing New England Electric System (NEES), a registered holding company, to make from time to time through December 31, 1994 one or more capital contributions to its electric public-utility subsidiary company, Massachusetts Electric Company, in aggregate amounts increased from \$50 million to amounts not to exceed \$75 million. NATIONAL FUEL GAS COMPANY, ET AL.

An order has been issued authorizing a proposal by National Fuel Gas Company (National), a registered holding company, and its wholly-owned subsidiary companies, National Fuel Gas Distribution Corporation (Distribution), National Fuel Gas Supply Corporation (Supply), Seneca Resources Corporation (Seneca), Penn-York Energy Corporation (Penn-York), Empire Exploration, Inc. (Empire) and Utility Constructors, Inc. (Constructors) (collectively, Subsidiaries). National proposes to issue and sell, in one or more transactions through December 31, 1994, up to an aggregate principal amount of \$350 million in any combination of one or more series of its

debentures (Debentures) by, or under an exception from the requirements of, competitive bidding and medium-term notes (MTNs), under an exception from competitive bidding, such Debentures and MTN's to mature in not more than forty years. It is further proposed that National lend, through December 31, 1994, up to \$250 million to Distribution, \$150 million to Supply, \$100 million to Seneca, \$50 million to Penn-York, \$40 million to Empire and \$15 million to Constructors, all such loans to be made in exchange for unsecured notes. The Commission shall reserve jurisdiction over the loan to Constructors of proceeds from the issuance and sale of the Debentures and/or MTN's. (Rel. 35-25832)

LOUISIANA POWER & LIGHT COMPANY

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing a proposal by Louisiana Power & Light Company (LP&L), an electric public-utility subsidiary of Entergy Corporation, a registered holding company. LP&L proposes through December 31, 1994 to amend its arrangements with the Parish of St. Charles, Louisiana (Parish) to permit the Parish to increase the amount of Parish pollution control bonds (Parish Bonds) to be issued by \$50 million to a total of \$156 million (Total Parish Bonds), issue the Total Parish Bonds on either a tax-exempt or taxable basis (Taxable Parish Bonds), convert or refund Taxable Parish Bonds with tax-exempt Parish Bonds (Refunding Parish Bonds) when LP&L receives additional volume cap from Louisiana and use the proceeds from the Refunding Parish Bonds to retire the Taxable Parish Bonds and purchase additional pollution control facilities for repurchase by LP&L. LP&L also proposes through December 31, 1994 to increase the remaining authorized amount of collateral bonds (Collateral Bonds) to be issued as a pledge for the Parish Bonds by \$70 million to a total of \$215.44 million and to convert or refund and reissue Collateral Bonds as a pledge for the Total Parish Bonds subject to the same terms and conditions as described in this post-effective amendment and authorized by prior Commission orders. Jurisdiction is reserved over other proposals. (Rel. 35-25834)

IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Midwest Stock Exchange filed a proposed rule change (SR-MSE-93-13) to amend its Certificate of Incorporation and Constitution to change its name to the Chicago Stock Exchange as of July 8, 1993. The proposed rule change has become effective upon filing. Publication of the proposal is expected in the Federal Register during the week of June 21. (Rel. 34-32488)

The Midwest Stock Exchange filed a proposed rule change (SR-MSE-93-16) to amend its rules to make conforming changes in accordance with its name change to the Chicago Stock Exchange as of July 8, 1993. The proposed rule change has become effective upon filing. Publication of the proposal is expected in the Federal Register during the week of June 21. (Rel. 34-32489)

Persons eligible to use the short form (Schedule 13G) may in lieu of filing a Schedule 13D file a Schedule 13G within 45 days after the end of the calendar year in which the person became subject to Section 13(d)(1). Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
