ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

U.S. SECURITIES
EXCHANGE COMMISSION

PROCEEDINGS AGAINST MICHAEL HUME

The Commission announced the institution of administrative proceedings pursuant to Section 15(b)(6) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 against Michael Hume, the former branch manager of the Reno, Nevada office of Wedbush Morgan Securities. The proceedings arise out of Hume's failure reasonably to supervise a registered representative, who was subject to his supervision, with a view to preventing the registered representative's sales of unregistered securities of The Crown Companies Group, Ltd. a/k/a The Crown Gold Companies Group, Ltd. in violation of Section 5 of the Securities Act of 1933.

Simultaneous with the institution of these proceedings, the Commission accepted Hume's Offer of Settlement in which he consents to the entry of an Order by the Commission, without admitting or denying any of the findings contained therein, suspending him from acting in a supervisory capacity for any broker or dealer for a period of 120 days. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

ARKANSAS POWER & LIGHT COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing a proposal by Arkansas Power & Light Company (AP&L), a public-utility subsidiary company of Entergy Corporation, a registered holding company, to sell substantially all its retail distribution and related transmission assets in Missouri to Union Electric Company for approximately \$63 million. The order also authorizes AP&L to sell certain transmission and distribution assets to Sho-Me Power Corporation for approximately \$4.035 million, certain transmission assets located in Missouri to Associated Electric Cooperative, Inc. for approximately \$1.013 million and seven substations located in Missouri to a group of mining customers of AP&L for an aggregate of \$887 thousand. TRANSCANADA PIPELINES LIMITED

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until March 2 to request a hearing on an application by TransCanada Pipelines Limited (TransCanada), a Canadian natural gas transportation and gas marketing company, for an order granting an exemption under

Section 3(a)(5) from all provisions of the Act, except Section 9(a)(2). TransCanada also seeks an unqualified order of exemption under Section 3(b) for a wholly owned subsidiary company (Subsidiary) that may be organized to own and operate an electric generating project (Project) located in Ontario, Canada. Once the Project is operational, the Subsidiary would be an "electric utility company" under Section 2(a)(3) of the Act and TransCanada would be a "holding company" with respect to the Subsidiary under Section 2(a)(7) of the Act. LOUISIANA POWER & LIGHT COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until March 2 to request a hearing on a proposal by Louisiana Power & Light Company (LP&L), an electric public-utility subsidiary of Entergy Corporation, a registered holding company. LP&L proposes to increase from \$200 million to \$500 million the amount of first mortgage bonds (Bonds) it is authorized to issue and sell; and from \$250 million to \$550 million the amount of its outstanding first mortgage bonds it may repurchase. LP&L has been granted authorization to begin negotiations for the public offering or private placement of the Bonds. (Rel. 35-25472)

WESTERN MASSACHUSETTS ELECTRIC COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until March 2 to request a hearing on a proposal by Western Massachusetts Electric Company, an electric utility subsidiary company of Northeast Utilities, a registered holding company, to issue and sell up to \$202 million principal amount of its first mortgage bonds and up to \$65 million aggregate par value of its preferred stock through December 31, 1993. (Rel. 35-25472)

THE CONNECTICUT LIGHT AND POWER COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until March 2 to request a hearing on a proposal by The Connecticut Light and Power Company, a public-utility subsidiary company of Northeast Utilities, a registered holding company, to issue and sell up to \$632 million principal amount of its first mortgage bonds, or preferred stock, or a combination of both in one or more series, from time to time through December 31, 1993. GENERAL PUBLIC UTILITIES CORPORATION

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until March 2 to request a hearing on a proposal by General Public Utilities Corporation (GPU), a registered holding company. GPU proposes to make cash capital contributions, through December 31, 1993, to its three electric public-utility subsidiary companies in the following amounts: \$100 million for Jersey Central Power & Light; \$50 million for Metropolitan Edison Company; and \$50 million for Pennsylvania Electric Company. SOUTHWESTERN ELECTRIC POWER COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until March 2 to request a hearing on a proposal by Southwestern Electric Power Company (SEPCO), an electric public-utility subsidiary company of Central and South West Corporation, a registered holding

company. SEPCO proposes to issue and sell first mortgage bonds in an aggregate principal amount up to \$40 million, in one or more series, from time to time through December 31, 1993. (Rel. 35-25472)

TRANSOK, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until March 2 to request a hearing on a proposal by Transok, Inc., a subsidiary company of Central and South West Corporation, a registered holding company, to issue and sell up to \$200 million aggregate principal amount of its medium-term notes from time to time through December 31, 1993. WEST TEXAS UTILITIES COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until March 2 to request a hearing on a proposal by West Texas Utilities Company, a subsidiary company of Central and South West Corporation, a registered holding company, to issue and sell in one or more series up to \$25 million aggregate principal amount of its first mortgage bonds through December 31, 1993. APPALACHIAN POWER COMPANY, ET AL.

The applicants propose to acquire, through the operation of a sinking fund or pursuant to a voluntary redemption provision, up to \$50 million each of cumulative preferred stock to be issued in connection with their respective 1992 long-term financing programs. SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The National Association of Securities Dealers filed a proposed rule change (SR-NASD-91-68) pursuant to Rule 19b-4 to amend an Interpretation of the Board of Governors -- Forwarding of Proxy and Other Materials, Article III, Section 1 of the NASD Rules of Fair Practice. The proposal amends the Interpretation to clarify that NASD members are required to forward proxy material upon the request of either the issuer of the securities or a stockholder of such issuer. Publication of the proposal is expected in the Federal Register during the week of February 10. (Rel. 34-30341)

The Government Securities Clearing Corporation filed a proposed rule change (SR-GSCC-92-02) under Rule 19b-4 to modify and seek approval, permanently or by extending the existing temporary approval, of GSCC's rules and procedures for the netting of forward-settling trades in Government securities. Publication of the proposal is expected in the Federal Register during the week of February 10. (Rel. 34-30350)

The Depository Trust Company filed a proposed rule change (SR-DTC-92-04) under Rule 19b-4 relating to procedures for processing partial calls of uniquely denominated securities. Publication of the proposal is expected in the Federal Register during the week of February 10. (Rel. 34-30351)

The American Stock Exchange filed a proposed rule change (SR-Amex-91-35) under Rule 19b-4 to provide greater flexibility in developing broad-based and narrow-based stock indexes for index option trading. IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The National Association of Securities Dealers filed a proposed rule change (SR-NASD-92-4) which became effective upon filing with the Commission. The rule change amends Section 14 of Schedule A to the NASD By-Laws to eliminate the distinction in charges between original fingerprint card submissions and resubmissions, marking the charge a uniform \$2.50 for all fingerprint cards submitted to the NASD. Publication of the proposal is expected in the Federal Register during the week of February 10. (Rel. 34-30342)

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Commission approved a proposed rule change submitted by The Options Clearing Corporation (SR-OCC-91-17) relating to a service, Risk Management System, to be used by its participant exchanges and clearing members in their assessment and management of risk of positions maintained in proprietary, market professional and customer accounts. Publication of the order is expected in the Federal Register during the week of February 10. (Rel. 34-30346)

The Commission approved a proposed rule change submitted by the Philadelphia Stock Exchange (SR-Phlx-91-12) to clarify the obligations of a floor broker when crossing orders or responding to solicited orders. Publication of the order is expected in the Federal Register during the week of February 10. (Rel. 34-30355)

AMENDMENT TO PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The American Stock Exchange filed an Amendment No. 1 to a proposed rule change (SR-Amex-91-25) under Rule 19b-4 to establish an Emerging Company Marketplace. Publication of the proposal is expected in the Federal Register during the week of February 10. (Rel. 34-30348)

REQUEST FOR TEMPORARY REGISTRATION

The Participants Trust Company filed with the Commission pursuant to Section 19(a) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, 15 U.S.C. Section 78s(a), an amendment to its Form CA-1 requesting the Commission to extend PTC's registration as a clearing agency until March 31, 1993.
