## RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

COMMISSION RESCINDS RULE 6c-2(T)  
AND WITHDRAWS PROPOSAL TO ADOPT  
RULE 6c-2

### LIBRARY

The Commission has rescinded Rule 6c-2(T) under the Investment Company Act of 1940 and withdrawn its proposal to adopt Rule 6c-2 under the Act because of a recent amendment to the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act of 1971 which exempts all the corporations organized pursuant to the Settlement Act from the Federal Securities Laws through December 31, 1991. (Rel. IC-9148)

### DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY TO MARKET REGULATION

The Commission has announced the adoption of amendments to paragraph (a)(8) of Section 200.30-3 in Chapter II of Title 17 of the Code of Federal Regulations. The amendments delegate to the Director of the Division of Market Regulation authority to perform certain of the Commission's functions under Rule 15c3-1, the uniform net capital rule. Functions under Rule 15c3-1 delegated to the Director of the Division of Market Regulation now include: (a) the approval of lesser equity requirements in specialist or market maker accounts pursuant to Rule 15c3-1(a)(6)(iii)(E); (b) the granting of exemptions from Rule 15c3-1 pursuant to paragraph (b)(3) thereof; (c) the granting of temporary exemptions upon specified terms and conditions from the debt-equity requirements of Rule 15c3-1(d); and (d) the approval of changes in election of the alternative capital requirement pursuant to Rule 15c3-1(f)(1)(i) & (ii). ## ORDERS FOR PUBLIC PROCEEDINGS

### SEC CITES MICHAEL DUTZAR

Public administrative proceedings have been instituted against Michael Dutzar (Dutzar), the president, majority shareholder, and a director of a registered broker-dealer. (Registrant)

The Commission's order is based upon: alleged violations of the net capital rule under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934; a permanent injunction issued on September 4, 1973 against Dutzar, upon his consent; and the appointment of a trustee for the liquidation of Registrant pursuant to the Securities Investor Protection Act of 1970.

A hearing will be scheduled to take evidence on the staff's allegations and to afford the respondents an opportunity to offer any defenses. The purpose of the hearing is to determine whether the allegations are true and if any action of a remedial nature should be ordered by the Commission. (Rel. 34-12082)

## INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

### THE ACCUMULATION FUND

A notice has been issued giving persons until March 2 to request a hearing on an application of The Accumulation Fund, Inc., for an order declaring that it has ceased to be an investment company. (Rel. IC-9147 - Feb. 6)

### THE POTOMAC EDISON COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing The Potomac Edison Company, subsidiary of Allegheny Power System, Inc., to finance construction of certain pollution control equipment through arrangements with a West Virginia County Commission. (Rel. 35-19376 - Feb. 6)

### ALLEGHENY POWER SYSTEM

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing an extension of time within which Allegheny Power System, Inc., a registered holding company, can issue and sell up to 3,500,000 shares of authorized and unissued common stock, par value \$2.50 per share. (Rel. 35-19377 - Feb. 6)

### PENNSYLVANIA ELECTRIC COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing a proposal by Pennsylvania Electric Company, subsidiary of General Public Utilities Corporation, that it amend its articles of incorporation to increase its authorized preferred stock, to authorize preferred stock without par value and to reclassify its presently outstanding preferred stock. ## SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

---

### NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Pacific Stock Exchange has filed a proposed rule change under Rule 19b-4 (SR-PSE-76-4) to amend its Constitution and certain of its Rules in connection with its responsibilities under Rule 19b-3 of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 prohibiting the fixing of commission rates by national securities exchanges. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of February 9. (Rel. 34-12073)

The Detroit Stock Exchange has filed a proposed rule change under Rule 19b-4 (SR-DSE-76-1) to allow the Governing Committee to fix the number of its members at not less than seven nor more than eleven. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of February 9. (Rel. 34-12074)

The Pacific Clearing Corporation has filed a proposed rule change under Rule 19b-4 (SR-PCC-76-2) to amend its fee schedule. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of February 9. (Rel. 34-12076)

### APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission has approved a proposed rule change filed by the Midwest Securities Trust Company which implements its Depository Input Satellite System (DIS System). The DIS System would allow MSTC participants to deliver securities to banks acting as agents of MSTC and to receive credit for these deposits prior to the actual physical delivery of such securities from the banks to MSTC.
