U.S. SECURITIES AND EXCHANGE COMMISSION

NOTICE OF PROPOSAL TO MODIFY SECO FEES AND ASSESSMENTS FOR FISCAL YEAR 1976

The SEC has announced a proposal to modify SECO fees and assessments for fiscal year 1976, and to amend Rule 15b9-2 to change the SECO fiscal year from July 1 to October 1, among other things. Publication is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of May 31, 1976. (Rel. 34-12490)

DECISIONS IN ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

SANCTIONS IMPOSED AGAINST ROBERT H. JAFFE AND EDWARD GARY REISDORF

The SEC has accepted offers of settlement from Robert H. Jaffe (Jaffe) and Edward Gary Reisdorf (Reisdorf). In connection therewith the Commission ordered that both respondents be suspended from association with any broker or dealer for a period of 12 months and thereafter limited, for a period of 18 months, any association with a broker or dealer to a non-proprietary, non-supervisory capacity. In addition, the Commission accepted the undertakings of both respondents not to practice as attorneys before the Commission for a period of 18 months. The offers of settlement were accepted by the Commission without admitting or denying the allegations in the order for proceedings. (Rel. 34-12473)

JACK ALTMAN SANCTIONED

Pursuant to an offer of settlement submitted by Jack Altman, Baltimore, Maryland, formerly assistant secretary of Ambassador Church Finance/Development Group, Inc., a broker-dealer of Brentwood, Tennessee presently under liquidation by the Securities Investor Protection Corporation, the Commission has barred him from association with any broker or dealer effective at the opening of business on the second Monday after the Commission's order, with the provision that he may apply to become associated with a broker or dealer in a non-supervisory capacity in one year. The offer was made without admitting or denying the allegations in the Commission's order for proceedings. The sanctions were based upon findings pursuant to the offer of settlement that Altman willfully violated the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws, as well as the bookkeeping requirements of these laws. RICHARD PERESS SUSPENDED

Pursuant to an offer of settlement submitted by Richard Peress, New York, N.Y., the Commission has suspended Peress from association for five days and required him to comply with certain restrictions concerning his retail trading activities. The offer of settlement was made without admitting or denying the allegations in the Commission's order for proceeding. The sanctions were based on findings pursuant to said offer of settlement that Peress willfully violated and willfully aided and abetted violations of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws. SEC ORDERS PUBLIC HEARINGS ON NATIONAL SECURITIES CLEARING CORPORATION'S APPLICATION FOR REGISTRATION

On May 26, 1976, the Commission ordered that, commencing on June 16, 1976, public hearings will be held to determine whether the Commission will grant or deny National Securities Clearing Corporation's (NSCC) application for registration as a clearing agency. The period for public comment on NSCC's application has been extended until June 21, 1976. Persons interested in participating in the hearings should contact

COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS

TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER ENTERED AGAINST AN-CAR OIL COMPANY, INC., OTHERS

The Boston Regional Office announced that the Honorable Joseph L. Tauro, granted after hearing the Commission's application for a temporary restraining order against An-Car Oil Company, Inc., a Delaware corporation; Wichita Drilling Corporation, a Ohio corporation; and Calvin Oil Company, Inc., an Alberta, Canada corporation. An-Car, Wichita and Calvin are under common control and the three corporations have offices at 111 Devonshire Street, Boston, Massachusetts. The complaint also names John C. Sterge of Beverly, Massachusetts, the president, treasurer and director of An-Car, Wichita and Calvin; Stanley H. Sichel of Boston, and Donald M. Patten, Concord, Massachusetts, both former officers and salesmen for An-Car and now officers and directors of Bay State Energy Company, Inc., Boston; Mary L. Savary of Beverly Commons, Massachusetts, the corporate secretary of An-Car, Wichita and Calvin; James I. F. Matthew of Burlington, Massachusetts, a vice-president of An-Car; Shelwell Services, Inc., an Ohio corporation and its president Clyde D. Shelton, both of Hebron, Ohio. Judge Tauro also granted the Commission's request for a temporary receiver for An-Car, Wichita, Calvin and the individual defendants. The Court scheduled a hearing on the question of whether or not a preliminary injunction should issue for June 9, 1976. The restraining order entered was to remain in effect until that time. (SEC v. An-Car Oil Co., Inc., D. MA, Civil Action No. 76-2039-T). (LR-7414)

MICHAEL BURNETT, ROBERT JOHNSTONE ENJOINED; ACTION VOLUNTARILY DISMISSED AS TO MAX BUSSARD

The New York Regional Office announced that, upon the default of defendants Michael Burnett, also known as Michael Raymond, and Robert Johnstone, also known as Bobby Dell, Judge Lloyd F. MacMahon, on March 30 issued permanent injunctions enjoining them from violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws. Furthermore, at the request of the Commission, Judge MacMahon issued an order on April 12 wherein the Commission voluntarily dismissed the action, without prejudice with regard to defendant Max Bussard.

Burnett was chairman of Silenus' board of directors, Johnstone was an officer of, and Bussard an accountant for Silenus. The Commission's complaint in this action was filed on September 9, 1975.

COMPLAINT NAMES JOSEPH AYOUB, WILLIAM CRAUGH AND CHARLES BOEHM

The New York Regional Office announced that on May 17 a complaint was filed in the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York seeking to enjoin Joseph Ayoub of Brooklyn, New York, William Craugh of South Orange, New Jersey, and Charles Boehm of Staten Island, New York, from violations of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws in their possession, dissemination and misuse of material non-public information concerning a tender offer by Airco, Inc. for all the outstanding shares of Unitek Corporation. In addition to injunctive relief, the complaint seeks an order directing the defendants to disgorge all profits which resulted from their violative conduct.

The complaint alleges that Boehm, an employee of a financial printer, provided Ayoub with a printer's proof of the tender offer by Airco for Unitek. It is further alleged that while in possession of this material non-public information and prior to Airco's public announcement of the tender offer on May 7 Ayoub and Craugh purchased and recommended the purchase of Unitek stock.

Simultaneous with the filing of the complaint, Craugh consented, without admitting or denying the allegations contained in the Commission's complaint, to the entry of a final judgment of permanent injunction and an order directing him to disgorge the profits which resulted from his alleged violative conduct. **COMPLAINT NAMES PRODUCTION OIL CORP.,
JOHN R. NEYREY**

The Fort Worth Regional Office announced that on May 27 a civil injunctive complaint was filed in Federal District Court at Biloxi, Mississippi, against Production Oil Corporation and John R. Neyrey, both of Biloxi (formerly of Metairie, Louisiana), for violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws in the offer and sale of fractional undivided working interests in oil and gas leases located in Texas. (SEC v. Production Oil Corp., et al., S.D. Miss.). (LR-7417)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

WEEDEN TAX EXEMPT BOND TRUST

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until June 21 to request a hearing on an application of Weeden Tax Exempt Bond Trust, Series 1 (and subsequent series), unit investment trusts, from the initial net worth requirements of Section 14(a), from the limitations on the distributions of capital gains contained in Rule 19b-1, and exempting the secondary market operations of the sponsors from the pricing requirements of Rule 22c-1. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

NORTHEAST UTILITIES

A supplemental order has been issued regarding Northeast Utilities, a registered holding company, and its subsidiary authorizing a three-year extension of the period during which the subsidiary may have outstanding up to \$2,500,000 of bank notes. (Rel. 35-19547 - May 28)

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Depository Trust Company has filed a proposed rule change pursuant to Rule 19b-4 (SR-DTC-76-5) to permit its participants to deposit at DTC the coupon form of most DTC-eligible interchangeable corporate debt securities which are issued in both the coupon and registered forms. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of June 7. (Rel. 34-12491)

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission has approved a proposed rule change filed by the National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc. The rule change (SR-NASD-76-4) will permit stabilizing bids accompanied by penalty stipulations to appear on the National Association of Securities Dealers Automated Quotations System (NASDAQ) so long as the penalty stipulation is applicable to selling concessions only.
