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COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS

CONTINENTAL GOLD AND SILVER CORPORATION ENJOINED

U.S. SECURITIES AND
EXCHANGE COMMISSION

The Denver Regional Office announced that on May 19 Continental Gold and Silver Corporation, a Utah corporation, was enjoined by default in the Federal District Court in Salt Lake City, Utah. The order, in substance, enjoins violations of the registration requirements and the antifraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and the antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 in connection with the offer and sale of common stock of Continental Gold and Silver Corporation or any other security. (SEC v. Continental Gold and Silver Corporation, et al., D. Utah, Civil Action No. C-75-414). (LR-7458)

BOB CHARLES CRAVER INDICTED

The Denver Regional Office announced that on May 14 Bob Charles Craver of Casper, Wyoming was charged by a statewide grand jury at Laramie County, Wyoming with fraud in the sale of securities and the sale of unregistered securities in violation of certain Wyoming statutes. The following day, May 15, Craver was charged by the same grand jury with embezzlement of money of Financial Management Corporation and Jiffy Burgers, Inc. (State of Wyoming v. Bob Charles Craver, First Judicial District). (LR-7459)

COMPLAINT NAMES RECLAMATION DISTRICT NO. 2090,
OTHERS

The San Francisco Branch Office announced that on June 17 a complaint was filed in the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of California seeking preliminary and permanent injunctions against Reclamation District No. 2090 [County of Contra Costa, California] (the District), a quasi-governmental agency of the State of California; Max H. Mortensen of Oakland, California; John B. Schoenfeld and Lowell C. Lundell of Atherton, California; Robert D. Lewis and Urban J. Schreiner of Palo Alto, California; James H. Dondich, also known as James Harold, of Santa Ana, California; Louis M. Mayo of Havertown, Pennsylvania; National Municipal Bond Co., Inc. and Robert W. Osness of St. George, Utah; Roy J. Jackson of Ogden, Utah; MFAI Associates of Inglewood, California; Lawrence A. Luebbe of Los Angeles, California; Benchmark Securities, Inc. and Sheldon Fidler of Beverly Hills, California; Arnold Phillips of Sherman Oaks, California; All-States Tax Exempt Securities, Inc., Pasquale A. Tamburri, also known as Pat Tamburri, and Jules L. Steele of Clearwater, Florida; George E. Grills of Dunedin, Florida; and Norton McGiffin of North Largo, Florida. The complaint alleges that the defendants variously violated and aided and abetted violations of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws in connection with sales of approximately \$1.2 million face amount of general obligation bond anticipation notes (bond anticipation notes) and \$1.0 million face amount of general obligation negotiable promissory notes (promissory notes) to 161 members of the public.

The Commission's complaint specifically alleges that all of the defendants violated and aided and abetted violations of Section 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933 and Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5 thereunder. The misrepresentations and omissions charged with respect to both the bond anticipation notes and the promissory notes concern, among other things, the revenues available to repay the notes; the availability of sources of funds, other than revenues, to repay the notes; the insufficiency of the District's tax base to generate enough funds to repay the notes; the use of proceeds derived from sales of the notes; the underwriting discounts and commissions received by the sellers of the notes; the financial condition of the District; the operating history of the District; the debt structure of the District; and the risk factors involved in a purchase of the District's notes.

The complaint seeks preliminary and permanent injunctive relief against all defendants, including the District, which filed a bankruptcy petition under Chapter IX of the Bankruptcy Act in San Francisco on June 15. (SEC v. Reclamation District No. 2090, et al., N.D. CA, C76-1231-SAW). (LR-7460)

COMPLAINT NAMES ROBERT C. DRUCKER, OTHERS

The New York Regional Office announced that on June 16 a complaint was filed in the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York seeking to enjoin Robert C. Drucker, John L. Feldman, Edward R. Wertheimer, Robert Nathanson, and Beneficial Labs, Inc. (Beneficial) from engaging in violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws. In addition, the Commission's complaint seeks ancillary relief in the form of an order by the Court requiring Drucker to sever all relationships with Beneficial and requiring Drucker, Feldman, and Beneficial to file with the Court and the Commission beneficial ownership reports in connection with Drucker and Feldman's holdings of Beneficial's securities.

The Commission's complaint alleges that the defendants participated in a scheme to sell unregistered Beneficial common stock in violation of the registration provisions of the securities laws. It is also alleged that during the same period, Drucker engaged in a scheme to artificially raise and maintain the price of Beneficial's common stock by manipulating the over-the-counter trading market for the security. Defendants John L. Feldman and Beneficial were previously enjoined from violating the securities laws and defendant Drucker has also been found to be in violation of numerous provisions of those laws. See SEC v. Commonwealth Chemical Securities, Inc., (SEC v. Robert C. Drucker, et al., 76 Civil 2643 (MEL) S.D.N.Y.). (LR-7461)

E.L. AARON & CO., INC., OTHERS ENJOINED

The New York Regional Office announced that on May 25 and May 27, respectively, the Honorable Lee P. Gagliardi, U.S. District Judge for the Southern District of New York, signed final judgments of permanent injunction enjoining Edward L. Aaron (E. Aaron), Norman Schreiber (Schreiber) and E.L. Aaron & Co., Inc. (Aaron & Co.) from violating the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws.

On March 31, May 21 and May 27, respectively, Fernando Erazo (Erazo), Daniel Dorfman (Dorfman), and Donald Darwin Jacobson (Jacobson) were permanently enjoined from violating the antifraud provisions of the securities laws. The Commission's complaint had alleged that Aaron & Co., E. Aaron and Schreiber violated the registration provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 by arranging for principals of Lawn-A-Mat Chemical & Equipment Corp. (LAM) to sell 21,000 shares of LAM common stock pursuant to Rule 144, allegedly without complying with the provisions of the Rule.

In addition, the complaint charged that from November 1974 to September 1975, Aaron & Co., E. Aaron, Schreiber and Jacobson violated and aided and abetted violations of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws by making false and misleading representations to investors and prospective investors in connection with the offer and sale of LAM stock.

Finally, the complaint alleged that Erazo and Dorfman knew of the misrepresentations, but failed to take any effective action to halt or prevent the misconduct, thus, aiding the violations of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws. All defendants consented, without admitting or denying the allegations in the Commission's complaint, to the entry of the above final judgments of permanent injunction. (SEC v. E.L. Aaron & Co., Inc., et al., 76 Civil 907 (LPG) S.D.N.Y.). (LR-7462)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

WEEDEN TAX EXEMPT BOND TRUST, SERIES 1 (AND SUBSEQUENT SERIES)

An order has been issued on an application of Weeden Tax Exempt Bond Trust, Series 1 (and subsequent series), unit investment trusts, and its sponsor, Weeden & Co., for an order exempting the trusts from the initial net worth requirements of Section 14(a), from the limitations on distributions of capital gains contained in Rule 19b-1, and exempting the secondary market operations of the sponsor from the pricing requirements of Rule 22c-1. (Rel. IC-9330 - June 23)

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission has approved a proposed rule change filed by the Midwest Stock Exchange, Inc. The amendment (SR-MSE-76-10) requires that members and member organizations notify the exchange and obtain its approval as to any prospective employee who is subject to a statutory disqualification referred to in the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. EXTENSION OF COMMENT PERIODS APPLICABLE
TO PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Commission has extended the comment periods applicable to two proposed rule changes previously filed by the Chicago Board Options Exchange, Inc. (SR-CBOE-76-8 and SR-CBOE-76-9). Notice of the filing of such proposals was given by Commission Release 34-12400, May 3, 1976 and 34-12453, May 18, 1976, respectively, and by publication in the Federal Register (41 Fed. Reg. 19174 (May 10, 1976) and 41 Fed. Reg. 21369 (May 25, 1976), respectively). Interested persons are invited to submit written comments on either or both of such proposals on or before July 30, 1976. (Rel. 34-12569)
