### PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO FORM S-8 AND RELATED NEW RULES

### U.S. SECURITIES AND EXCHANGE COMMISSION

The Commission has authorized the publication for comment of several specific and general amendments to Form S-8 and related new rules under the Securities Act of 1933. The purpose of the specific form amendments and the new rules is to provide a means whereby all filings on Form S-8 (both pre-effective and post-effective, with certain limited exceptions) will become effective automatically, without affirmative action on the part of the Commission or its staff pursuant to delegated authority. The Commission is also requesting comments on a series of general proposals which, if adopted, would make the Form S-16 type of disclosure available to issuers with employee stock plans, either by incorporating Form S-16 disclosure and updating features into Form S-8, or by adopting a new form.

## CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

---

### COMPLAINT NAMES FUTURE COMMUNITIES, INC.

The Commission announced that on November 19 it filed in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia a civil injunctive action against Future Communities, Inc.,

of Long Beach, California. The Commission's complaint alleges violations of the reporting provisions of the securities laws and seeks a Judgment of Permanent Injunction and Other Relief. The complaint alleges that Future Communities had failed to file its Annual Report on Form 10-K for its fiscal year ended June 30, 1979, required to have been filed with the Commission by September 28, 1979, and its Quarterly Report on Form 10-Q for its fiscal quarter ended September 30, 1979, required to have been filed by November 14, 1979. Further, the complaint charged that Future Communities, as part of a continuing course of violative conduct extending over several years, has failed to timely file certain of its annual and quarterly reports with the Commission. The complaint requests that the court order Future Communities to file forthwith with the Commission its Annual Report on Form 10-K for its fiscal year ended June 30, 1979, and its Quarterly Report on Form 10-Q for its fiscal quarter ended September 30, 1979. Further, the Commission requested that the court enjoin Future Communities from further violations of the reporting provisions of the securities laws. (SEC v. Future Communities, Inc., U.S.D.C. ### APPALACHIAN POWER COMPANY

A supplemental order has been issued releasing the jurisdiction heretofore reserved with respect to the fees and expenses to be incurred in connection with the issuance and sale of first mortgage bonds in a private placement by Appalachian Power Company, subsidiary of American Electric Power Company. ## SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

---

### FILING OF PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO CONSOLIDATED TAPE PLAN

The Commission has made available for public comment a proposed amendment to the joint industry plan governing the consolidated transaction reporting system filed with and declared effective pursuant to Rule 17a-15 under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The proposed amendment would effect an 8% increase in display charges to subscribers for receipt of last sale information with respect to Network A. (Rel. 34-16347)

### NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Philadelphia Stock Exchange has filed a proposed rule change under Rule 19b-4 (SR-Phlx-79-8) to delete Commentaries .04 through .06 of Rule 1024 relating to the approval of certain types of options accounts, and Commentary .01 of Rule 1027, relating to discretionary options accounts. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of November 26. (Rel. 34-16349)

### APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission has approved a proposed rule change filed by the New England Securities Depository Trust Company (NESDTC). The rule change (SR-NESDTC-79-1) authorizes NESDTC to retain for use in its own business the income and gain resulting from the investment of cash contributions to its Participants' Fund. ### NOTICE OF EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Pacific Stock Exchange has filed a proposed rule change (SR-PSE-79-12) which became effective under Section 19(b)(3)(A) to amend various Options Floor Procedure Advices (procedures), and to adopt two new procedures. These procedures relate to conduct on the options exchange floor. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of November 26. (Rel. 34-16351)
