COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

PATRICIA HOLLAND PROMOTED TO ASSISTANT REGIONAL ADMINISTRATOR

The Chicago Regional Office has announced the promotion of Patricia Holland to Assistant Regional Administrator for Enforcement. Ms. Holland obtained her B.A. from University of Illinois at Urbana in 1979 and her J.D. from University of Chicago in 1983. After practicing law for one year, Ms. Holland joined the CRO as an enforcement staff lawyer in 1984 and was promoted to Branch Chief in mid-1987.

FOIA OFFICER'S DECISION, IN PART, AFFIRMED, REVERSED

The General Counsel sent a letter dated February 27 to Charles R. McKirdy of Pope, Ballard, Shepard & Fowle, Ltd., Counsel for the South Chicago Savings Bank. In that letter, the General Counsel affirmed in part and reversed in part the FOIA Officer's decision to grant access to certain documents that were the subject of a confidential treatment request. The General Counsel determined that FOIA Exemption 8, 5 USC Section 552(b)(8), 17 CFR Section 200.80(b)(3), should be applied to withhold documents subject to the appeal that contained information related to: confidential condition reports filed with the FDIC. The General Counsel also determined that FOIA Exemptions 7, 5 USC Section 552(b)(7), 17 CFR Section 200.80(b)(7) and 5, 5 USC Section 552(b)(5), 17 CFR Section 200.80(b)(5), should not be applied to withhold documents discussing settlement negotiations between adverse parties with the exception of one internal memorandum which was withheld under Exemption 5. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

HERBERT STONE SENTENCED

The Chicago Regional Office announced that Herbert Stone (Stone) of Beechurst, New York, was sentenced by the Honorable Ilana Rovner of the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Illinois to two years in prison to be followed by five years probation and was ordered to pay \$50,000 in restitution.

Stone had pled guilty to conspiracy, six counts of securities fraud, six counts of mail fraud and one count of perjury in connection with a scheme to manipulate the price of a penny stock called European Auto Classics, Ltd. At the time of the activities described in the indictment, Stone was a registered representative and a trader.

The case was investigated and prosecuted by members of the staffs of the Justice Department's Chicago Organized Crime Strike Force and the Commission's Chicago

Regional Office. Three other defendants in the case who were convicted after a jury trial are scheduled for sentencing on February 27. These defendants are Jack Ringer (Brooklyn, NY), Raphael Bloom (NYC) and Alan Scop (Brooklyn, NY). [United States v. Jack Ringer, et al., USDC, ND ILL, 86 CR 541] (LR-12394)

MOTION TO SHOW CAUSE FILED AGAINST THOMAS QUINN

The Chicago Regional Office announced the filing of a motion for an order to show cause why Thomas Quinn (Quinn) should not be held in civil contempt for violating the preliminary injunction entered against him in the above captioned case. Quinn and fifteen other defendants were sued by the Commission for their participation in a scheme to manipulate the price of two penny stocks, GSS Venture Capital Corporation and Max, Inc.

The preliminary injunction entered in the case by the Honorable Milton I. Shadur of the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Illinois, among other things, froze all of Quinn's assets. The motion filed by the Chicago Regional Office alleges that Quinn violated this provision of the preliminary injunction by causing \$75,000 to be transferred out of a brokerage account in one of his alias names. The motion is currently under consideration by Judge Shadur. [SEC v. Arnold Kimmes, et al., USDC, ND ILL., 89 C 5942] (LR-12395)

RANDAL C. FORMAN PERMANENTLY ENJOINED

The Atlanta Regional and Miami Branch Offices announced that, on February 5, the Honorable Jose A. Gonzalez Jr., U.S. District Judge for the Southern District of Florida, permanently enjoined Randal C. Forman (Forman) of Boca Raton, Florida, from the violations of the antifraud, registration and recordkeeping provisions of the federal securities laws as well as ordering other relief. Forman was formerly employed at the Boca Raton, Florida branch of F.D. Roberts Securities, Inc. (F.D. Roberts), a registered broker-dealer which ceased operations in February 1989. Forman consented to the entry of the final judgment without admitting or denying the allegations in the complaint.

The Commission's complaint, filed November 20, 1989, alleges that Forman and seven other defendants caused F.D. Roberts to manipulate the market for the securities of Frankel Capital Management, Inc. and Integrated Financial Group, Inc. by, among other things, placing the securities in "nominee" or controlled accounts during the respective initial public offerings, redistributing the securities in the secondary market at artificial price levels, and making numerous misrepresentations and omissions of material facts to investors and prospective investors in the securities. [SEC v. Leonard M. Tucker, et al., Civil Action No. 89-6974-Civ-Gonzalez, S.D. Fla.] (LR-12397)

TEN-YEAR DISGORGEMENT PLAN ORDERED

The Houston Branch Office announced that, on February 23, Honorable Lucius D. Bunton, III, Chief U.S. District Judge for the Western District of Texas, ordered W. Reeves Moore to disgorge \$262,206.45 plus prejudgment and postjudgment interest. During the hearing, Moore contended that he was currently financially unable to pay any of the amount of disgorgement sought by the Commission. The Court then ordered Moore to

repay the full disgorgement plus prejudgment interest into the Court Registry within approximately ten years and further ordered Moore to pay postjudgment interest until the disgorgement amount plus prejudgment interest is fully paid.

The Court, on February 27, permanently enjoined Moore from engaging in further violations of, among other things, the securities fraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act. Moore consented to the entry of the Permanent Injunction without admitting or denying the allegations. The Complaint alleged Moore misappropriated approximately 65% of the assets of Continental Excalibur Corporation, a public company whose assets at the time consisted primarily of investor proceeds raised through a "blind pool" public offering. [SEC v. Continental Excalibur Corporation, et al., Civil Action No. MO-89-CA-118, USDC (WDTX)] (LR-12396)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

CITIBANK, N.A.

An order has been issued on an application by Citibank, N.A. amending an existing order (Release IC-15617 of March 11, 1987) to permit foreign bank subsidiaries of its bank holding company parent, Citicorp, to maintain securities and other assets of United States investment companies outside the United States. (Rel. IC-17360 - Feb. 28)

EMERALD FUNDS

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until April 2 to request a hearing on an application for an order granting exemptions from Sections 18(f), 18(g) and 18(i) of the Act to the extent necessary to permit Emerald Funds to issue and sell separate classes of shares in certain of its investment portfolios. (Rel. IC-17361 - Mar. 1)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

JERSEY CENTRAL POWER & LIGHT COMPANY EUA COGENEX CORPORATION

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until March 26 to request a hearing on proposals by several companies under the same release: Jersey Central Power & Light Company (JCP&L), wholly owned electric utility subsidiary of GENERAL PUBLIC UTILITIES CORPORATION, to issue and sell from time to time through December 31, 1990 up to a stated value of \$100 million of cumulative preferred stock (Preferred Stock). Such Preferred Stock may be issued pursuant to a deviation from the Commission's "Statement of Policy Regarding Preferred Stock Subject to the Public Utility Holding Company Act of 1935; EUA COGENEX CORPORATION (Cogenex) and its parent company EASTERN UTILITIES ASSOCIATES (EUA), whereby Cogenex will issue and negotiate the sale of up to \$35 million aggregate principal amount of secured and/or unsecured notes and/or first mortgage bonds, with all or any portion of the obligations on such debt being guaranteed by EUA.
