### OPEN MEETING - THURSDAY, APRIL 19, 1990 - 10:00 a.m.

The subject matter of the April 19 open meeting will be:

Consideration of proposed Rule 144A, which would provide a safe harbor exemption from the registration requirements of the Securities Act of 1933 for resale of restricted securities to "qualified institutional buyers" as defined in the rule. The Commission also will consider seeking comment on the adoption of the amendments to Rules 144 and 145 under the Securities Act, which would redefine the required holding period for restricted securities, whether acquired pursuant to Rule 144A or otherwise.
