CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

THE ROLFITE COMPANY AND STEPHEN L. READ IN CONTEMPT; READ ENJOINED AND SANCTIONED

The Commission today announced that the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia entered Findings of Civil Contempt as to The Rolfite Company and Stephen L. Read and Order Imposing Sanctions As To Read. Read is the Chairman, Chief Executive Officer, and principal shareholder of Rolfite. The Order, which was entered by consent, requires that Rolfite file certain delinquent Annual and Quarterly Reports by January 15, 1988, and should it fail to do so, that Read pay a daily fine of \$1,000 until the reports are filed with the Commission. The Court also entered a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction against Read, by consent, restraining and enjoining him from failing timely to file Forms 3 and 4 and Schedules 13D and from aiding and abetting or any issuer's failure to file its Annual, Quarterly and Current Reports and Notifications of Late Filing. (SEC v. The Rolfite Company, Civil Action No. 87-0881-CRR, D.D.C., May 12, 1987, and SEC v. Stephen L. Read, Civil Action No. 87-3006-CRR, D.D.C., November 5, 1987). (LR-11620)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

LOCUST STREET FUND

An order has been issued exempting Locust Street Fund, Centerre Trust Company of St. Louis (Adviser), and Centerre Bank National Association (Centerre Bank) from the provisions of Sections 17(a) and 17(e) of the Investment Company Act to permit the Fund's portfolios and the Adviser to engage in certain principal and agency transactions with Centerre Bank. OVERLAND FUNDING, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 28 to request a hearing on an application filed by Overland Funding, Inc. for an order amending its previous order dated October 19, 1986 [Rel. IC-15361]. Applicant seeks permission to issue one or more classes of adjustable interest rate bonds secured by certain mortgage related collateral (which may include certain mortgage related collateral representing beneficial ownership interests in less than 100% of the distributions of principal or interest or both made on mortgage loans underlying such mortgage related collateral), elect one or more series of its bonds secured by certain mortgage related collateral to be treated as a REMIC, and to sell residual interests in such series. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

NATIONAL FUEL GAS COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 28 to request a hearing on a proposal by National Fuel Gas Company, a registered holding company and a New Jersey corporation, and its subsidiaries, National Fuel Gas Distribution Corporation, Penn-York Energy Corporation, Empire Exploration, Inc., and Enerop Corporation (collectively, Subsidiary Companies), each a New York corporation, to amend their respective certificates of incorporation. National and the Subsidiary Companies seek to limit the personal monetary liability of directors, and in the case of National, officers for a period of two years, of these corporations, subject to shareholder approval, in accordance with recent amendments to the New Jersey Business Corporation Act and the New York Business Corporation Law. National also proposes, and has been granted authority, to solicit proxies in this regard for voting at the 1988 Annual Meeting of Stockholders, scheduled for February 18, 1988. The Subsidiary Companies will each seek the consent of National, their sole shareholder, to make such amendments and to make certain additional changes to their respective certificates. AMERICAN AIRLINES, INC.
