### U.S. SECURITIES AND EXCHANGE COMMISSION

#### ASSETS OF PRIVATE NONINSURED PENSION FUNDS

At the end of 1980, total assets of private noninsured pension funds were \$256.9 billion at book value and \$297.2 billion at market value. These figures represent increases of \$33.4 billion and \$72.0 billion, respectively, over totals for the end of 1979. Details on these results will be published in the May issue of the SEC Monthly Statistical Review.

#### NOTICE TO 1933 ACT REGISTRANTS

Effective immediately, the Commission will terminate the practice of automatic transmittal of collect telegrams to Registrants and Agents for Service, providing the effective date of 1933 Act Registration Statements. The decision to terminate this courtesy was based upon complaints received from a number of Registrant/Agents for Service, their subsequent refusal to pay collect charges and the fact that the number of Registrants and Agents for Service has increased to such a level that it has become an administrative burden for a substantially reduced support staff of the Commission to prepare and transmit both orders and telegrams on a timely basis.

Effective orders are generally transmitted within two or three days after effectiveness. Collect telegrams confirming effectiveness may be obtained upon specific request, but will be limited to the Registrant and one designated person.

This change will in no way affect the issuance of "no-stop-order" telegrams as outlined in Release 33-5991.
