SAMPLE My AmeriCorps Objective

This space is for you to determine your service goals for the coming year, including personal, host agency and community goals. Consider the things you hope will be different because of your service.

Service Site: Service Obiectives
What do you and your supervisor hope you will accomplish during the coming year.
How many students will you help during your year of service?
Will their academic performance be changed? For example, I'll serve 65 students and 50% will improve their grades by two grade levels. Or, student drop out rates will be reduced by 25%. Increased attendance is another measure used by many sites. Will students have increased knowledge of careers or an updated resume?
How are you going to measure if students have improved as a result of your service? How will you know that the hoped-for improvement has taken p/ace? You may review grade reports of students you serve. Or, drop out rates are lower because records show that the number of students who dropped out in previous years is different from the number who dropped out during your term of service. How many clients/students now have jobs?
How many teachers will be assisted because of your service?
Describe how you will assist teachers. For example, you may work with students in-class, allowing the teacher to work with other students. Or, you may work with teachers to find out what assignments a student in your tutoring lab is working on or what skills they need most help in.

Describe any other service activities you will perform for your agency, such as new program development, creating a resource manual for literacy students, library for children, interagency council on youth services, etc.

Think about your personal goals for the next year and what you hope to accomplish through your AmeriCorps service.
What technical skills do you hope to gain or improve?
What personal goals do you hope to reach during your term of AmeriCorps service? (For example, getting settled in a new town, budgeting, public speaking, being more assertive, etc.)
