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UNITED STATES ATTORNEYS' STATISTICAL REPORT
FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDED JUNE 30, 1956

The past fiscal year was one distinguished by remarkable achievement on the part of United States Attorneys and their staffs.


The drive on the backlog of pending cases resulted in a reduction of the caseload from 29,979 as of June 30, 1955 to 24,253 as of June 30, 1956. This is a reduction of 19.1 per cent or 5,726 cases and is by far the largest reduction in the pending caseload for the past twenty years. This pending caseload is the lowest since the close of Fiscal Year 1942 when 23,736 cases were pending.

Collections by United States Attorneys for Fiscal Year 1956 reached an all-time high of \$42,034,788. This is an increase of 53.02 per cent over the \$27,470,493 collected in Fiscal Year 1955.

United States Attorneys saved \$39,701,498 in 1,035 suits in which the Government was being sued for \$47,037,040.



Exclusive of routine Immigration cases in the five districts bordering on Mexico there was an increase of one per cent in the number of Civil and Criminal cases filed, and there was an increase of ten per cent in the number of these cases terminated. There was a marked increase in the number of Civil cases terminated. In fact the 25,425 cases terminated is the all-time high, and exceeded the 20,519 closed in Fiscal Year 1955 (the previous all-time high) by 23.9 per cent or 4,906 cases.

CRIMINAL CASES PENDING (As of June 30, 1956)

Criminal Cases pending as of June 30, 1956 totalled 7,341, 1,604 less than were pending as of June 30, 1955. This is the lowest number pending since June 30, 1889 when 7,212 cases were pending in a total of 72 Judicial Districts as compared with 94 at the present time. 3,179 or 43.3 per cent of the 7,341 cases are in ten districts, 1.4 per cent less than the number pending in the first ten districts at the close of Fiscal Year 1955. However, the District of Columbia, Southern New York and Southern Florida which had 2,141 such cases pending at the close of Fiscal Year 1955 had 1,586 at the close of Fiscal Year 1956. This is a decrease of 555 cases or 25.9 per cent.


New Jersey which ranked tenth in the number of Criminal cases pending as of June 30, 1955 with 178 dropped to fourteenth with 122 cases pending.

2,156 or 29.4 per cent of these cases are in a fugitive or other status beyond the control of United States Attorneys, e.g. fugitives. 308 in the District of Columbia and 275 in Southern New York comprise 27.0 per cent of the cases in this category.

A study of the Criminal cases pending by offense shows that 10 types of cases with 4,341 represent 59.1 per cent of the total. The following table and Chart 4 gives a comparison of the number pending by offense where the volume exceeds 100 cases as of June 30, 1956 as compared with the total pending in those types as of June 30, 1955.

JUNE 30, 1956



Of the 7,341 Criminal cases pending as of June 30, 1956, 5,185 or 70.6 per cent are in a triable status and 2,156 or 29.4 per cent are in a fugitive or other status beyond the control of United States Attorneys. An analysis of the length of time that the 5,185 triable cases have been in a particular status shows that 82.1 per cent have been in the same status less than six months and 91.0 per cent less than one year. Following is a table of the number of triable cases according to length of time in the same status:

Of the 5,185 cases 1,070 are awaiting arraignment in court, 2,194 are awaiting trial or trial is in progress and 821 are awaiting sentence. The following table gives a breakdown of the cases pending according to status and length of time in that status:



39.9 per cent of the pending Criminal cases are less than six months old since date of receipt in United States Attorneys' Offices. Of the 423 cases that are 5 or more years old, 93 are in the District of Columbia as compared with 173 such cases at the close of Fiscal Year 1955. Southern New York which has 118 cases in this category showed a slight increase over the 109 cases as of June 30, 1955. However, 90 of these 93 cases in the District of Columbia and 105 of these 118 cases in Southern New York are in a fugitive or other status beyond the control of the United States Attorney.

The following table indicates the progress made in closing out older cases. For instance, it will be noted that the number of cases in the 5 years or over bracket dropped from 504 to 423. Where 4,041 cases or 45.2 per cent of the cases were a year or more old as of June 30, 1955, that number was 3,058 or 41.7 per cent of the total pending cases as of June 30, 1956.

The number of Criminal complaints pending as of June 30, 1956 was 12,040 which is a decrease of 2,224 or 15.6 per cent from the 14,264 pending as of June 30, 1955. Where 6,557 or 46 per cent of the total complaints pending were in ten districts, the total now pending in the ten districts with the highest number of complaints is 4,906 or 40.7 per cent of the total. In fact the number of complaints pending in the first twenty-five districts is 7,466 or only 909 more than the number pending in the first ten districts at the close of Fiscal Year 1955.

Substantial decreases in complaints took place in Southern California and Northern Illinois where the decrease was 414 and 220 respectively. On the other hand, an increase of 141 for Eastern Michigan may be noted in the following table:

64 per cent or 7,706 of the pending complaints are in eleven offenses having a volume of 200 or more. National Stolen Property Act complaints with 1,807 complaints has 15.0 per cent of the total. Selective Service complaints which numbered 2,276 or 16.0 per cent of the total as of June 30, 1955 were down to 997 complaints or 8.3 per cent of the total. Following is a table showing complaints pending by those offenses.

Of the 12,040 complaints involving 16,316 defendants pending in United States Attorneys' Offices, 2,811 or 23.3 per cent are awaiting completion of investigation as compared with 3,977 or 27.9 per cent in this status as of June 30, 1955. Where 3,071 or 21.5 per cent of the complaints were awaiting grand jury action or the filing of information as of June 30, 1955, 2,981 or 24.8 per cent of them were in that status as of June 30, 1956. Of the 2,522 complaints where prosecution is under consideration 390 have been in that status for more than one year. 313 of these complaints are in two districts, Massachusetts with 82 and Southern New York with 231. The following table indicates the number of complaints in each status as well as the length of time in that status. It will be noted that 88.1 per cent have been in the same status for less than one year.

67.1 per cent of the complaints pending in United States Attorneys' Offices are less than six months old since date of receipt in United States Attorneys' Offices. 2,287 or 19.0 per cent of these are in a fugitive or other status beyond the control of the United States Attorney. A comparison with the per cent of fugitives in each age category indicates that there is a lower percentage in the complaints pending than in Criminal cases pending. Following is a table showing the number of complaints in each age category as well as the number and per cent of fugitives in each of these groups.

CRIMINAL CASES AND MATTERS FILED

For the year ending June 30, 1956, 31,554 cases involving 39,837 defendants were filed. This is a decrease of 6,130 or 16.3 per cent because Immigration cases filed in the five districts bordering on Mexico decreased to 2,864 from 8,546 filed during the previous fiscal year. Excluding these cases, the decrease amounts to only 448 cases or 1.5 per cent. Of these 31,554 cases, 13,959 were filed by indictment, 14,339 by information, 1,433 by transfer from other districts and 1,823 by other methods such as removal from State Courts, etc.

Chart 6 gives a comparison of the cases filed by Fiscal Year from 1951 through 1956.

During the year, United States Attorneys received 91,438 complaints involving 117,006 defendants. This is a decrease of 4,390 cases or 4.6 per cent but exclusive of Immigration complaints received in the Mexican border districts, an increase of 2.2 per cent from 86,704 to 88,647 may be noted.

Western Texas again had the largest number of cases filed, namely, 1,608 cases of which 1,206 were Immigration cases, the District of Columbia with 1,505 cases and Southern New York with 1,100 had the next highest number of cases filed per district, and minus Immigration cases, Southern California with 1,091 had almost as many as Southern New York. Chart 7 shows the relationship of the number of Immigration cases filed to the total filed for Fiscal Years 1942 to 1956 inclusive.

CRIMINAL CASES FILED



CRIMINAL CASES FILED




Chart 8 groups the cases filed according to offense by major categories for Fiscal Years 1942 to 1956 inclusive. A substantial decrease will be noted in the number of Immigration violations. Where this offense had the largest number for the past several years due to the large number of wetback cases in the five districts on the Mexican border, two other offenses, National Stolen Property and Liquor Law with 4,851 and 3,652 respectively, had a larger number in Fiscal Year 1956. Criminal Tax cases increased from 477 to 1,097, and Veterans' Readjustment Act of 1952 cases increased from 66 to 377.

The following table shows the number of cases filed in major categories, and the number of defendants in those cases.





PROCEEDINGS BEFORE GRAND JURY



CRIMINAL CASES AND MATTERS CLOSED DURING FISCAL YEAR 1956

United States Attorneys and their staffs closed 33,388 Criminal cases involving 42,447 defendants. This is a decrease of 5,838 or 14.9 per cent as compared with the number terminated in Fiscal Year 1955. However, by excluding routine wetback cases in the five Mexican border districts, there was a slight increase of 232 cases or .8 per cent. 24,459 cases were terminated with guilty pleas and a total of 3,217 defendants in 2,332 cases were found guilty after a court or jury trial.


Of the 61,945 complaints closed without reaching court dockets 52,813 or 85.3 per cent involving 68,411 defendants were by declination of prosecution. Chart 10 shows a comparison of the number of cases closed for Fiscal Years 1951 to 1956. Table 3-B in the Appendix gives a breakdown by district of the methods of disposition of Criminal cases and defendants.

3,315 cases involving 4,575 defendants were closed after a court or jury trial. Table 3-C furnishes a breakdown of the disposition of defendants according to type of offense.

Chart 11 gives a comparison of the number of Criminal cases tried for Fiscal Years 1951 to 1956 inclusive.



TRIALS IN CRIMINAL CASES




CIVIL CASES AND MATTERS PENDING (As of June 30, 1956)


Civil cases pending in United States Attorneys' Offices amounted to 16,912 exclusive of Tax Lien cases of which there are 1,550 Pending. *This is a reduction of 4,122 cases or 19.6 per cent, and it is the first time since Fiscal Year 1946 when 17,456 cases were pending that there have been less than 20,000 Civil cases pending in United States Attorneys' Offices. Of this number 8,968 or 53.0 per cent are pending in 15 districts which have a pending Civil caseload of more than 300 cases. 11,267 or 66.6 per cent are in 25 districts. Chart 13 illustrates in graphic form the fifteen districts having 300 or more cases as compared to the caseload for all districts.

The following table indicates the caseload at the close of Fiscal Years 1955 and 1956 in each of these fifteen districts as well as the per cent of increase or decrease and illustrates how United States Attorneys achieved considerable reductions in the backlog of pending cases.

It should be noted that the total of 1,156 for Northern California includes 509 Chinese Nationality suits which due to difficulties encountered in proving fraud, in obtaining witnesses, etc. have been pending for some time prior to Fiscal Year 1956.

Exclusive of Land Acquisition and Civil Tax cases there are 13,549 cases pending involving \$431,648,511. In 6,700 of these, United States as plaintiff is seeking to recover \$431,648,511. In the 5,846 suits in which the United States is defendant \$146,984,334 is involved, and there are 1,003 cases involving \$34,404,611 in which the United States is joined as a party.

The largest single group of cases in which the Government is plaintiff are Negotiable Instrument cases (principally Federal Housing Administration defaulted notes). There are 1,752 cases in this group as against 3,114 such cases pending at the close of Fiscal Year 1955. This reduction of 1,362 cases or 43.74 per cent is a result of the fine cooperation between the Department, the United States Attorneys and the Federal Housing Administration. The Federal Housing Administration provided a task force during the past fiscal year which visited 40 United States Attorneys' Offices for the purpose of reviewing FHA accounts and assisting the United States Attorneys to dispose of many of the pending accounts. This review resulted in the disposal of 32 per cent of the accounts reviewed in those offices.

As the following comparative table indicates there was no great increase or decrease percentagewise in the proportion of the various case categories to the total number of cases pending except possibly Negotiable Instrument cases which now comprise 13.7 per cent of the total as against 18.9 per cent at the close of Fiscal Year 1955.





The following table which compares the number of cases pending according to age groups since date of receipt in United States Attorneys' Offices as of June 30, 1955 and June 30, 1956 shows that decreases took place in all age categories except in those cases less than six months old. A breakdown of pending Civil cases (Other than Civil Tax and Land Condemnation) according to amount category indicates a substantial decrease in the number of cases in the \$1 to \$2,500 range. As of June 30, 1955, 6,853 or 40.0 per cent of the cases were in this range, and as of June 30, 1956 the cases in this range numbered 3,453 or 25.6 per cent of the total. The decrease amounted to 3,400 cases or 49.6 per cent. While decreases took place in all amount ranges, there was an increase in the number of non-monetary suits pending in United States Attorneys' Offices. The following table gives a comparison of the number of cases pending in each amount range at the close of Fiscal Years 1955 and 1956 as well as the percentage of each group to the total.

At the close of Fiscal Year 1956, there were 15,098 Civil matters pending in United States Attorneys' Offices which is 4,834 or 24.3 per cent less than the 19,932 such matters pending at the close of Fiscal Year 1955. Where 52.2 per cent or 10,416 of the total matters pending a year ago were in twelve districts, there are now 7,680 or 50.9 per cent pending in twelve districts.

Substantial decreases took place in the following districts:

Northern Illinois from 1,037 to 257, a 75.2 per cent decrease; Massachusetts from 689 to 402, a 41.7 per cent decrease; Eastern Michigan from 981 to 538, a 45.2 per cent decrease; Eastern New York from 1,162 to 729, a 37.2 per cent decrease; and Northern Ohio from 737 to 405, a 45.0 per cent decrease. Of 15,098 Civil matters pending 7,075 are Contract Actions consisting of 6,681 Negotiable Instrument matters, namely, 46.9 and 44.3 per cent respectively of the total. Another large group is the 4,317 Veterans' Matters comprising 28.6 per cent of the total. A comparison with the Civil matters pending as of June 30, 1955 shows that the above categories, although less in number as of June 30, 1956, are approximately the same percentagewise. A comparison of the status of Civil matters pending as of June 30, 1956 with those pending on June 30, 1955 shows an increase of 185 in the number of installment payments being made. Although this is a small increase, the percentage of matters in which installment payments are being made is now 22.0 per cent of the total as against 15.7 per cent of the total in this category a year ago. In 3,417 matters an answer is being awaited to a demand letter. This is a decrease of 1,863 or 35.3 per cent from the 5,280 in this status as of June 30, 1955. The following table showing the age of Civil matters pending in United States Attorneys' Offices at the close of Fiscal Years 1955 and 1956 illustrates the great progress made during the past year in reducing the backlog of pending matters. As of June 30, 1955 there were 9,938 matters one or more years old, as compared with 6,117 matters in this age group on June 30, 1956. This is a reduction of 3,821 or 38.4 per cent. Again, it may be noted that where 49.8 per cent of the total on June 30, 1955 was in that age bracket, that group constituted 40.5 per cent of the total Civil matters pending as of June 30, 1956.


CIVIL CASES AND MATTERS RECEIVED

During the year 21,706 Civil cases were filed, an increase of 953 or 4.6 per cent over the 20,753 cases filed during Fiscal Year 1955. As the following table indicates 38.7 per cent or 8,398 of the cases were filed in ten districts. Southern California and Northern Illinois with 1,717 and 1,171 cases respectively increased from 1,236 and 575 cases. On the other hand, Eastern Pennsylvania, although still having a considerable number of new cases, dropped from 1,042 to 633 Civil cases filed. Chart No. 16 gives a comparison of the number of cases filed each Fiscal Year since 1951, and Table 3-A in the Appendix give the number of cases filed in each district during the Fiscal Year.








Of the Civil cases filed (excluding Tax and Land Acquisition) the United States was plaintiff in 15,076 involving \$65,427,554. Two categories, namely, 5,614 Negotiable Instrument suits for \$13,995,808 and 4,076 Veterans' suits for \$6,765,001 made up over half of this total. The total number of Veterans' suits filed was 4,382 an increase of 1,375 or 45.7 per cent over the previous year.

Cases in which the United States was designated as defendant dropped from 3,967 to 3,768 but the amount involved in these suits increased from \$61,738,605 to \$66,978,761. Of this amount \$47,631,404 is indicated in 910 Tort Actions filed against the Government during the past year.

Civil matters received by United States Attorneys amounted to 29,427, an increase of 7.8 per cent over the 27,303 received in Fiscal Year 1955.

Excluding Tax and Land Acquisition matters, there were 27,688 Civil matters received in United States Attorneys' Offices of which 8,606 involved Negotiable Instruments and 6,311 Veterans' Matters. As compared with Fiscal Year 1955, these categories increased by 15.9 and 14.6 per cent respectively.

As may be seen in the following table 600 or more Civil matters were received in 13 out of the 94 Judicial Districts for a total of 12,454 or 42.3 per cent. Also, the table entitled "Work of United States Attorneys" in the Appendix shows the number received in each district.




CIVIL CASES AND MATTERS CLOSED

During the fiscal year ended June 30, 1956, 25,425 Civil suits were terminated, an increase of 23.9 per cent over the 20,519 terminated in Fiscal Year 1955. 

A total of 12,396 or 51.9 per cent of the Civil suits terminated (exclusive of Tax and Land Acquisition) resulted in judgments for the United States, as against 8,639 such judgments or 46 per cent of the total Civil suits terminated in Fiscal Year 1955. 1,072 or 4.5 per cent of the suits resulted in judgments against the United States while in Fiscal Year 1955, 1,394 or 7.5 per cent of the total were closed in this manner. Following is a table giving a breakdown of Civil suits terminated according to disposition in Fiscal Years 1955 and 1956.

1,035 of the 25,425 Civil suits terminated during Fiscal Year 1956 were suits in which the Government was being sued for a total of \$47,037,040. In 529 of those suits involving \$21,801,677, compromises amounting to \$3,676,937 were obtained resulting in a savings of \$18,124,740. This United States won 236 of them in which it was being sued for \$10,925,965 and although the Government lost 270 of the 1,035 suits in which the amount involved was \$14,309,398 the judgments against the United States amounted to \$3,658,605 resulting in a savings of \$10,650,793. The total amount saved was \$39,701,498 which when added to the \$41,784,788 collected equals the sum of \$81,486,286.

Southern New York with \$10,439,557 had the largest amount saved. Savings in the following districts exceeded \$1,000,000.

BY METHOD OF DISPOSITION



COLLECTIONS

For the second straight year collections by United States Attorneys and their staffs showed a decided increase. The amount collected during Fiscal Year 1956 was \$42,034,788 which is a 53.0 per cent increase over the \$27,470,493 collected in the previous year. This total is well over three times as much as the \$11,144,000 appropriated for the United States Attorneys' Offices, therefore, for every dollar appropriated \$3.77 was collected which is a substantial increase over the \$2.96 collected for each dollar appropriated in Fiscal Year 1955 when the appropriation for United States Attorneys amounted to \$9,279,130.

Chart 19 depicts amounts collected as compared with amounts appropriated for Fiscal Years 1950 through 1956 inclusive. The Financial Summary table in the Appendix will show amounts collected by district as well as amounts imposed in fines, judgments, etc.

PERSONNEL AND EXPENDITURES

An average of 1,556 employees were employed in United States Attorneys' Offices, and \$11,144,000 appropriated for their activities. During the year, 401 employees were appointed and 276 separated, a net gain of 125 employees.

Based on a caseload of 83,239 cases, the average cost per case handled was \$133.88 which is an increase over the average cost of \$103.28 in Fiscal Year 1955, but this is more than offset by the increase in collections to \$42,034,788 and savings of \$39,701,498 so that in a greater measure than ever before, United States Attorneys "paid their way" in Fiscal Year 1956.

ACCESSIONS AND SEPARATIONS



"UNITED STATES ATTORNEYS OFFICES"


