COLLECTION INFORMATION CODE TABLE

The following table lists, in numerical order, all revenue source codes (RSC) for incidental revenues. The list of available land status and disposition codes follows the complete listing of RSCs. The proper 6-digit collection information code must be chosen by selecting the appropriate code from each of the three sections: RSC, land status, and disposition.

Revenue Source Codes for Incidental Revenues	
531	Recreation User Fees Collected by Non-Feds. For use only if recreation user fee revenue is forwarded to Reclamation by the non-Federal public body managing a Reclamation recreation area. See RSCs 592 and 595 for sources of other recreation revenues.
544	Parking Fees – Hoover. Parking fees specific to Hoover Dam and visitor center.
545	Haying. Rights-of-use for haying activities.
546	Products/Publication Sales – Hoover. Only for use with Hoover sales.
548	Power sales-Subsection I. Sale of power from Government-owned and -operated power generating facilities that is marketed by the Government. Contractors must have valid authority to receive front-end credits under Subsection I of the Fact Finders' Act of 1924. Only possible disposition is as a front-end credit.
549	Transportation of Minerals. Rights-of-use for pipelines for the transportation of oil, natural gas, synthetic liquid, gaseous fuels, or any refined product.
550	Film/Sound/Photo Making. Rights-of-use on project lands and/or facilities for film making, sound recording, and commercial photography.
551	Sale or Use of Town Lots. Only exist on withdrawn and improved withdrawn project lands.
552	Sale of Land. Sale of public domain, surplus acquired, withdrawn improved, and small tract lands.
553	Sale of Timber. Rights-of-use for the removal of timber from public lands under the jurisdiction of BLM and from withdrawn and acquired lands under the jurisdiction of Reclamation.
554	Sale of Real Property. Improvements and fixtures such as buildings or structures. Does not include land or timber; see RSC 552 for Sale of Land and RSC 553 for Sale of Timber.
555	Sale of Mineral Materials. Rights-of-use for the removal of common varieties of sand, gravel, pumice, stone, cinders, etc., from public lands under BLM jurisdiction and from withdrawn and acquired lands under Reclamation jurisdiction. Does not include Sale of Timber; see RSC 553.
556	Sale of Surplus Water – 1920 Act or Drought Act. For non-irrigation purposes (e.g., municipal, industrial, domestic, etc.) authorized by the Sale of Water for Miscellaneous Purposes Act of 1920 or the payment of capital costs attributable to the sale of project or non-project water for drought purposes pursuant to the Reclamation States Emergency Drought Act of 1992.

559	Storage/Conveyance of Non-Project and Project Water (Warren Act or Drought Act). Non-project water stored in or conveyed through Reclamation project facilities pursuant to the Warrant Act of 1911 or payment of capital costs attributable to the use of Federal Reclamation facilities for project and non-project water for drought purposes pursuant to the Drought Act.
570	Geothermal Steam. Leases for the extraction of geothermal steam authorized by the Geothermal Steam Act of 1970.
571	Grazing Leases. Rights-of-use to graze stock for a defined period of time.
572	Minerals Rents/Royalties (1920 Act). Leases for the extraction of mineral deposits (e.g., oil, gas, gilsonite, phosphate, potassium, coal, hydrocarbons, oil shale, potash, sulfur, and sodium) from withdrawn and improved withdrawn project lands and public domain lands authorized by the Mineral Leasing Act of 1920.
574	Commercial Leases. Long-term rights-of-use detailed on project land-use plans for permanent structures (e.g., oil refinery, garage, etc.) associated with a commercial development.
575	Residential Leases. Rights-of-use for a fixed rent for a specified amount of time (e.g., government quarters, housing for project workers, etc.).
576	Acquired Minerals (1947 Act). Leases for the extraction of mineral deposits (e.g., oil, gas, gilsonite, phosphate, potassium, coal, hydrocarbons, oil shale, potash, sulfur, and sodium) from acquired and donated acquired project lands authorized by the Mineral Leasing on Acquired Lands Act of 1947.
578	Agricultural Leases. Rights-of-use for all agricultural activities other than grazing (e.g., farming, feed lots, dairy or poultry operations, grain silos, etc.). See RSC 571 for Grazing Leases.
591	Visitor Fees – Hoover. Entrance, user, and concession fees specific to Hoover Dam and visitor center.
592	Recreational User Fees. Fees from camping, day-use, and Golden Passports. Does not include fees from One-Time Special Recreation Events (see RSC 595) or Concessions (see RSC 596).
593	Rights-of-Way (Non-minerals). Non-mineral rights of passage (e.g., leases, licenses, easements, rights-of-way, etc.) which are not classified under another RSC. Does not include rights-of-use for pipelines to transport minerals; see RSC 549.
594	Cabin Sites. Rights-of-use for a fixed rent for a specified amount of time. Does not include Recreational User Fees (see RSC 592) or One-Time Special Recreation Events (see RSC 595).
595	One-Time Special Recreation Events. Fees from fishing tournaments and other organized events. Does not include Recreational User Fees for camping, day use, or Golden Passports (see RSC 592) or Concessions (see RSC 596).
596	Concessions. Permits for concessions.
597	Special Use Permits. Short-term uses of project lands or facilities that are not classified under existing codes.
598	Communications. Permits for microwaves, telecommunication sites, fiber optic cable, etc.

Land Status Codes	
A	Acquired. Lands where title has been obtained from non-Federal sources by purchase, exchange, or condemnation and whose cost has been charged to the expense of the project.
P	Public Domain. Lands that have never left Federal ownership.
W	Withdrawn. Federal lands withheld from settlement, sale, location of minerals, or entry under the general land laws for the purpose of limiting activities in order to maintain other public values or for a particular public purpose.
N	Land status not applicable.
I	Improved Withdrawn. Withdrawn lands that have been improved at the expense of the project.
D	Donated Acquired. Acquired lands that have been donated to the project at no expense to the project.
