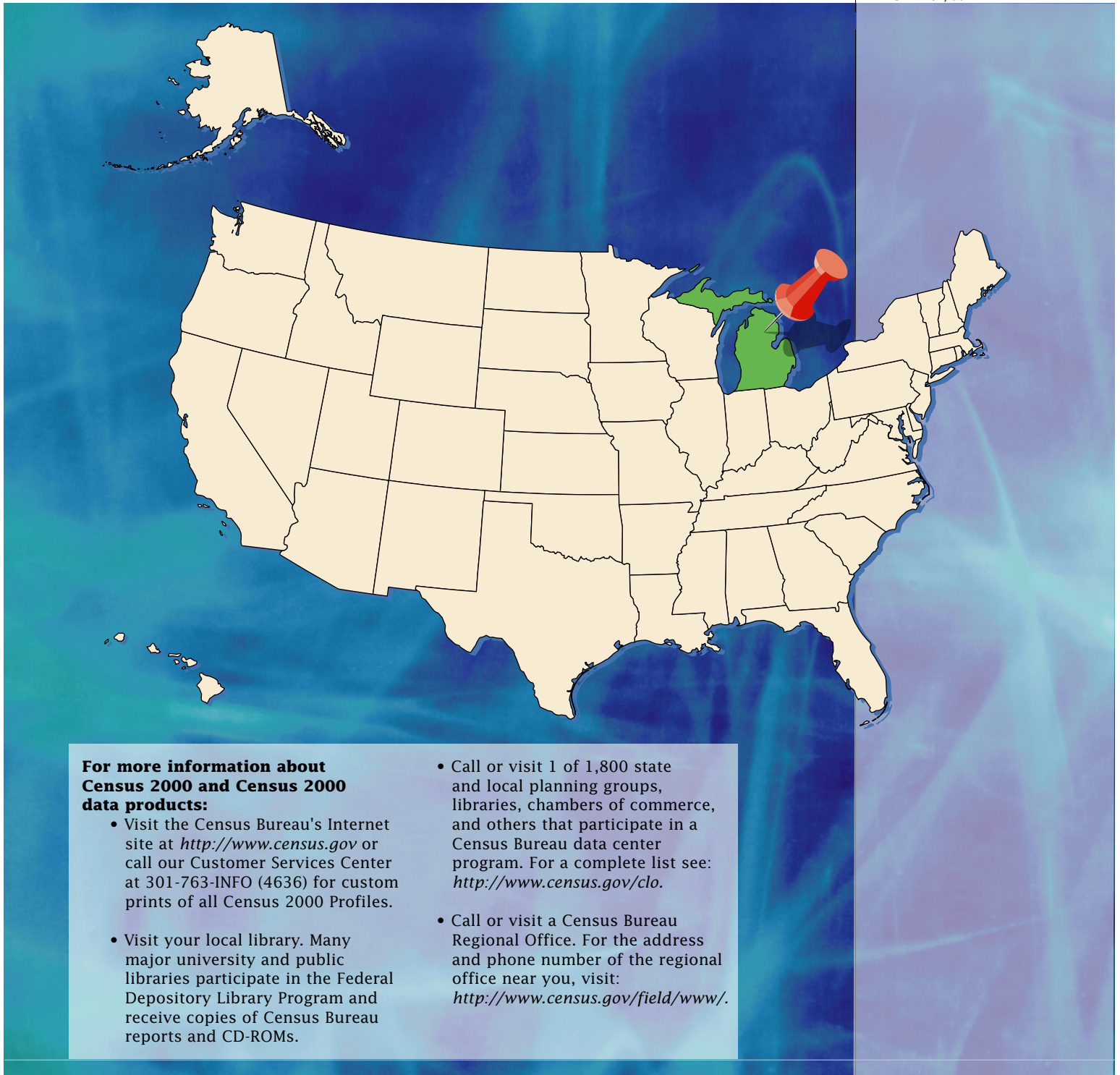

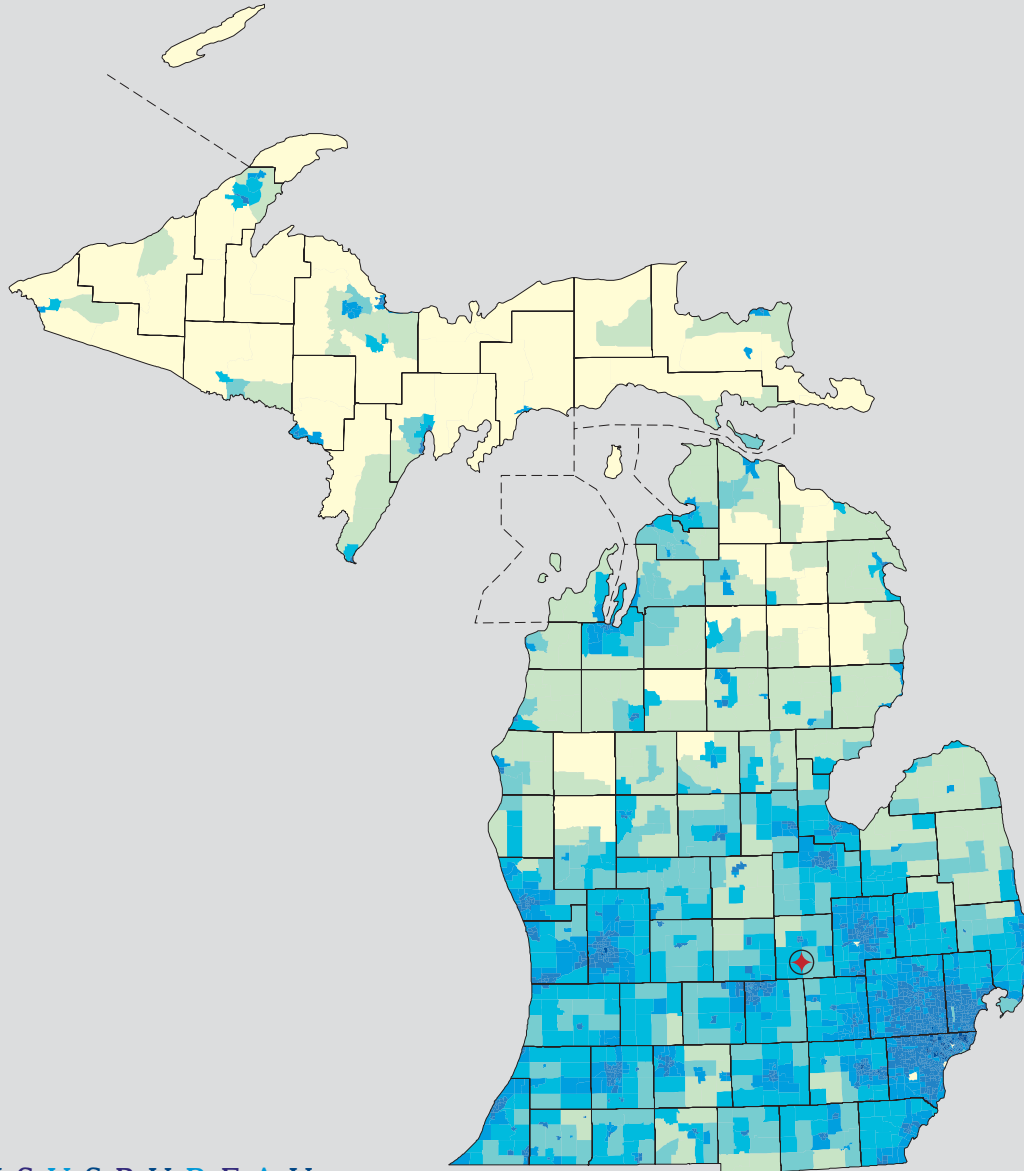

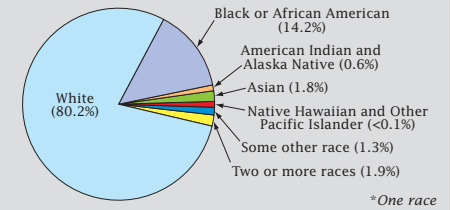

## Population Density by Census Tract

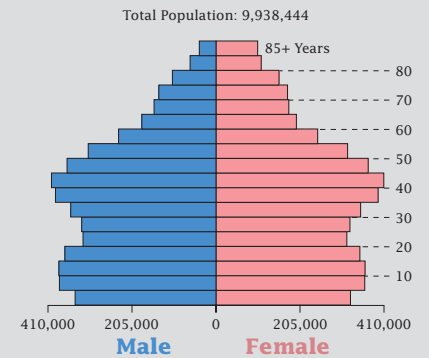


## State Race\* Breakdown

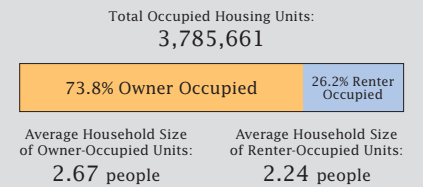

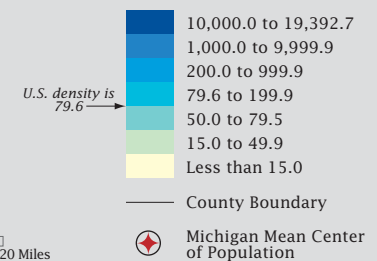
## Population by Sex and Age
