MEMORANDUM

To: Members, Committee on Natural Resources

Subject: Recall of bills

Pursuant to Committee on Natural Resources Rule 6(e), I hereby give notice of my intent to recall the listed bills from the following Subcommittees:

Subcommittee on Energy and Mineral Resources

H. Res. 44 (Burton), Expressing the sense of the House of Representatives that an effective moratorium by the Executive Branch on offshore oil and gas exploration and drilling should be terminated.

H. Res. 140 (Gene Green), Expressing the sense of the House of Representatives that domestic oil and gas resources are critical to our Nation's security and economy and the Secretary of the Interior should take immediate action to streamline the shallow and deepwater permitting process.

Subcommittee on Fisheries, Wildlife, Oceans and Insular Affairs

H. Res. 80 (Christensen), Expressing support for the goals and ideals of National Marine Awareness Day.

H. Res. 132 (Christensen), Expressing the need to raise awareness and promote capacity building to strategically address the lionfish invasion in the Atlantic Ocean.

H. Con. Res. 15 (Christensen), Expressing the sense of the Congress that the United States Fish and Wildlife Service should incorporate consideration of global warming and sea-level rise into the comprehensive conservation plans for coastal national wildlife refuges, and for other purposes.

Subcommittee on National Parks, Forests and Public Lands

H. Res. 13 (Bartlett), Expressing the sense of the House of Representatives regarding the recognition, protection, promotion, and facilitation of the annual JFK 50 Mile.

H. Res. 84 (Moran), Commemorating 100 years of natural resource conservation achievements made possible through the vision and leadership of Representative John W. Weeks and the enactment of the Weeks Act in 1911.

H. Res. 284 (Grijalva), Honoring wild horses and burros as important to our national heritage.

These bills will be before the Full Committee for any further consideration.

In addition, I hereby give notice that I am recalling **H.R. 1207**, the Marianas Trench Marine National Monument Visitor Center Facility Authorization Act of 2011, from the Subcommittee on National Parks, Forests and Public Lands and re-referring the bill to the Subcommittee on Fisheries, Wildlife, Oceans and Insular Affairs.
