1. CODE FOR STATES

- Title 43 CFR, Part 12 Subpart C- Uniform Administrative and Audit Requirements for Grants and Cooperative Agreements to State and Local Governments
 - Section 12.76 Procurement (a) States.
 - When procuring property and services under a grant, a State will follow the same policies and procedures it uses for procurements from its non-Federal funds. The State will ensure that every purchase order or other contract includes any clauses required by Federal statutes and executive orders and their implementing regulations.

2. CODE FOR LOCAL GOVERNMENT

- Title 43 CFR, Part 12 Subpart C- Uniform Administrative and Audit Requirements for Grants and Cooperative Agreements to State and Local Governments
 - Section 12.76 Procurement
 - (a) Other grantees and subgrantees will follow paragraphs (b) through (i) in this section.

3. CODE FOR SUBGRANTEES

- State and local Governments 43 CFR 12.76
- 2 CFR 215 40-48 Uniform Administrative Requirements for Federal Grants and Agreements Awarded to Institutions of Higher Education, Hospitals, and other Non-Profit Organizations

Definitions:

- 1. What does CIAP mean by sub-grantee?
 - Subgrantee means the government or other lead entity to which a subgrant is awarded and is accountable to the grantee for use of the funds awarded
 - Subgrant means an award of financial assistance under a grant by a grantee. Does not include procurement purchases.

2. What does CIAP mean by sub-contract?

Sub-contract means a contract under a
 Federal grant. Contracts should be used
 whenever the principal purpose of the award
 is to acquire goods or services for the
 government's own use.

What does CIAP mean by subrecipient?

A subrecipient (subcontractor or sub-grantee)
is a third-party organization that receives
funding from a grantee to collaborate in
carrying out a CIAP project.
