NATIONAL NOTICE TO LESSEES AND OPERATORS OF FEDERAL OIL AND GAS AND SULPHUR LEASES IN THE OUTER CONTINENTAL SHELF

Revised Assessment Matrix

The purpose of this Notice to Lessees and Operators (NTL) is to provide updated information in the BOEMRE OCS Civil Penalties Program. This NTL replaces the assessment matrix provided in NTL No. 2007-N02. The Oil Pollution Act of 1990 (OPA 90) requires the Secretary of the Interior to adjust the maximum civil penalty to reflect any increases in the Consumer Price Index.

In accordance with OPA 90 and the Office of Management and Budget guidelines, BOEMRE has increased the maximum amount of the civil penalty to \$40,000 per day per violation. The assessment matrix below, revised to reflect the increased maximum penalty, will apply to any violation occurring on or after July 30, 2011.

Category A

Threat of injury to humans. Threat of harm or damage to the marine or coastal environment, including mammals, fish, and other aquatic life (threat may or may not involve endangered/threatened species). Threat of pollution. Threat of damage to any mineral deposit or property.

<u>Category B</u> Injury to humans that result in

1-3 days away from work or 1-3 days on restricted work or job transfer. Minor harm or damage to the marine or coastal environment, including mammals, fish, and other aquatic life (harm to aquatic life did not involve an endangered/threatened species.) Pollution caused by liquid hydrocarbon spillage of up to 50 bbl. Minor damage to any mineral deposit. Minor property damage equal to or less than \$25,000. Additional incidents required to be reported under 30 CFR 250.188, except a(6), (b)(1),

Category C

Loss of human life. Injury to humans that result in more than 3 days away from work or more than 3 days on restricted work or job transfer. Serious harm or damage to the marine or coastal environment, including mammals, fish, and other aquatic life (harm to aquatic life involved numerous individuals or involved one or more members of an endangered/threatened species.) Pollution caused by liquid hydrocarbon spillage of more than 50 bbl. Serious damage to any mineral deposit. Serious property damage greater than \$25,000.
