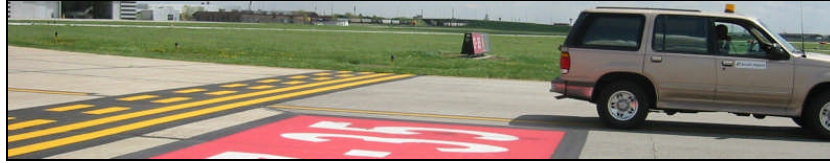

SUBJECT: Airport Construction Safety Plans

Operating an airport is challenging. Operating an airport while it is under construction is even more challenging. How does an airport operator continue to operate the airport safely while construction activities are occurring on the airport? How is airfield construction conducted to minimize disruption of normal aircraft operations and avoid situations that compromise safety to aircraft operations?

Advisory Circular 150/5370-2E *Operational Safety on Airports During Construction* provides guidance on the development of Airport Construction Safety Plans. Submittal of these stand-alone plans with a safety plan checklist signed by the airport sponsor are required for airports in complying with Part 139 and for airport construction projects receiving funds from AIP or PFC programs.
