



Florida Hurlburt Field

Facility and Location

Home of the Air Commandos since 1961, Hurlburt Field accommodates the 1st Special Operations Wing, Headquarters Air Force Special Operations Command, and a number of associate units. Originally designated Eglin Auxiliary Field 9, it served as one of the training fields built on Eglin Air Force Range in the 1940s. In 1943, it was named for First Lieutenant Donald Hurlburt who was killed in an aircraft crash there.

Media Sampled and Findings

Groundwater — In 2007, two of four samples detected perchlorate at 0.13 ppb. Prior to 2007, five samples reported no detection.

Wastewater — In 2007, one sample reported no detection.

Appropriate Actions

Not Applicable. All samples were below the EPA and DoD Preliminary Remediation Goal of 15 ppb.
