



## Florida NS Mayport

## Facility and Location

Naval Station (NS) Mayport was commissioned in December 1942. The basin was used by patrol craft, rescue boats, and jeep carriers. Reclassified as a Naval Sea Frontier Base in 1943, NS Mayport added a landing field and a fueling facility for submarines. Decommissioned at the end of the war, NS Mayport was reactivated in 1948 and, by 1955, added a master jet runway. NS Mayport served as an advance staging area during the Cuban missile crisis. Station ships have been involved in operations off the coasts of Lebanon and Grenada and in the Persian Gulf. Helicopters joined the fleet at NS Mayport in 1992.

## Media Sampled and Findings

**Drinking Water** — In 2007, one sample reported no detection. Prior to 2007, one sample reported no detection.

**Groundwater** — Prior to 2007, one sample reported no detection.

**Wastewater** — In 2007, one sample detected perchlorate at 0.08 ppb. Prior to 2007, one sample reported no detection.
