
DISMISSAL ORDER

FIRST CLASS

The Securities and Exchange Commission instituted this proceeding with an Order Instituting Proceedings (OIP) on March 12, 2003, pursuant to Section 15(b)(6) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The only sanction authorized by the OIP is a penny stock bar.

Respondent was never served with the OIP, despite the efforts of process servers hired by the Division of Enforcement (Division) over a period of several months. Thereafter, the Division learned that Respondent died on September 10, 2003, in London, England. On November 20, 2003, the Division submitted a report that, for the purpose of this administrative proceeding, establishes Respondent's death. The report includes a statement of Kenneth Groves, a fingerprint expert employed by the London Metropolitan Police Authority. He compared fingerprints taken from the body of the person believed to be Respondent with fingerprints identified as Respondent's by the Riverside County, California, Sheriff's Department. Mr. Groves concluded that the two sets of fingerprints were made by the same person. In view of this information, it is appropriate to dismiss this proceeding.

IT IS ORDERED that this proceeding IS DISMISSED.
