**Established:** Station Seattle was established in 1989. The station is co-located with Sector Seattle on the waterfront at Pier 36. Station Seattle has three 41-foot utility boats, 2 25-foot RB-HS, and two 25-foot RBS's.

**What we do:** Station Seattle's primary mission is Homeland Security within Puget Sound. Station Seattle provides harbor patrols of the entire Puget Sound in conjunction to providing escorts to Naval and commercial vessels. Station personnel also support numerous other missions including aids to navigation, marine environmental protection and local public relations.

**Accomplished Operations:** Station Seattle's 27-foot Safeboat rescued four

people from a Boeing 307 Stratoliner that crashed in Elliott Bay, near West Seattle, on March 28, 2002. Station Seattle supports safe boating patrols in various marine events in the Seattle area; the largest being the Seafair hydroplane races.
