4	Q.	Please state your name, employer, and business address.
5	A.	My name is Kimberly A. Leathley. I am employed by the Bonneville Power Administration
6		(BPA), 905 NE. 11th Avenue, Portland, Oregon.
7	Q.	In what capacity are you employed?
8	A.	I am an Account Executive in the Bulk Power Marketing group of the Power Business Line
9		(PBL).
10	Q.	Please state your educational background.
11	A.	I received a B.S. degree in Economics with a minor in Mathematics from Willamette
12		University in 1991. My field of concentration was econometrics.
13	Q.	Please summarize your professional experience.
14	A.	From January through December 1990, I worked as the Assistant Economist to the Oregon
15		State Economist in the Office of Economic Analysis, State of Oregon Executive
16		Department. In this capacity, I assisted in the development of the Governor's
17		Recommended Budget.
18		In June 1991, I began work at BPA in the Economic Forecasting section of the
19		Division of Power Forecasting. In that capacity I worked on various forecasting issues and
20		conducted analysis and forecasts of employment, population, income, and other
21		demographic indicators. I assisted the load-forecasting group in integrating my analysis and
22		forecasts into the Pacific Northwest (PNW) load forecasts for use in the Whitebook. I was
23		also responsible for all BPA economic impact analysis involving the PNW high technology
24		industry, the Boeing Company, and the State of Washington.

In 1993, I joined the BPA team responsible for developing BPA's Marketing Plan. In this capacity, I conducted and coordinated analysis as well as developed competitive assessments for BPA's market (customer) segments.

In 1994, I was selected as an Associate Account Executive (AE) and relocated to Boise, Idaho. In this capacity I assisted the AEs responsible for public utility customers in eastern Oregon, southeastern Washington, and southern Idaho. I coordinated and developed load forecasts, economic analysis, and competitive assessments. Further, I served as the liaison between BPA's field offices and the group responsible for BPA's non-generating public customer market segment. In this capacity, I developed power products and rate impact assessment tools.

In July 1995, I returned to Portland, Oregon, as an AE to assist the Senior AE for the west-side investor-owned utilities (IOU). In this capacity, I was responsible for all economic and financial analysis associated with BPA's power and transmission business transactions with Puget Sound Power and Light, Portland General Electric, and PacifiCorp. Further, I led the BPA technical team responsible for the development and reconciliation the first Operating Plan for the Third AC Intertie owners. In addition, I negotiated BPA's 1996 power sales agreement and related agreements with Pacific Northwest Generating Cooperative and its member-utilities.

In 1996, I assumed full responsibility for BPA's power business with several Pacific Northwest IOUs, Nevada and Arizona IOUs, several marketers and five southern California municipalities. In this capacity, I am currently responsible for developing and assessing financial and economic analyses; negotiating and implementing power sales transactions; developing, writing, and implementing contracts; developing and implementing bulk power marketing strategies; and, PBL policy development.

In addition to my current responsibilities as an AE, in April 1998, I assumed the lead responsibility in the PBL for the development and implementation of the proposed
