## • \$2 Million Settlement FHA Modernization Act Passes U.S. House of Representatives

On July 25, the U.S. House of Representatives passed the "Expanding American Homeownership Act," which now goes to the U.S. Senate for consideration. If enacted into law, the act will modernize the Federal Housing Administration (FHA) 32-year old insured mortgage program; thereby helping more low to moderate income Americans achieve their homeownership dream. ### \$2 Million Settlement in Western World Insurance Housing Discrimination Case

On July 31, the Fair Housing Center of Washington and Fair Housing Council of Oregon announced a comprehensive settlement of an insurance discrimination lawsuit involving Western World Insurance Company. The settlement in Nevels v. Western World Insurance Company provides \$2 million in monetary relief and ends nearly four years of • Webcasts: Learning at litigation and administrative complaints alleging violations of the federal Fair Housing Act. The plaintiffs included four adult family home operators from Washington and Oregon whose property and/or liability insurance had been cancelled or non-renewed because they served persons with mental illnesses.

> The plaintiffs' lead counsel remarked on the importance of this court decision for other victims of insurance discrimination around the country. "We believe that insurance discrimination on the basis of disability is widespread, and this well-reasoned opinion will put insurance companies on notice that federal courts will not permit these business practices to continue."
