The Anderson's Inc. believes that a limit on vomitoxin at time of loadout is needed on the CBT wheat contract in order to better the contract for all parties involve. As stated in the Federal Register, allowing the "taker" of delivery wheat to request a 5 PPM max, at time of loading is acceptable and should improve overall contract performance.

There are two points I would like to make to help clarify our thought process. First and foremost, vomitoxin at levels in excess of 5 PPM are very rare, and therefore, should not be a significant issue. Secondly, requiring the warehouseman to guarantee 5 PPM at time of loading is significantly different than requesting the warehouseman to include this on the delivery warehouse receipt at time of issue. Currently, vomitoxin cannot be graded as quickly as other factors (i.e. Test Weight) and consequently is not typically graded on every inbound load. A random sampling procedure is used by many commercial grain handlers instead of a load-by-load analysis. This could potentially create a problem if the warehouseman is "required" to certify on the receipt that vomitoxin levels are less than 5 PPM at time of issue.
