	The Department of Defense (DoD) obligated \$67.3M during the week ending July 17, 2009, bringing the cumulative obligation of Recovery Act funds to \$1,493.8M. The \$1,493.8M in obligations include \$1,280.7M for the Facilities Sustainment, Restoration and Modernization (FSRM) program, \$140.8M for the Military Construction Program, \$5.5M for the Energy Conservation Investment Program (ECIP), \$63.1M for the Near Term Energy-Efficient Technologies Program, and \$3.7M for the Expanded Homeowners Assistance Program (HAP). These obligations represent 20.1% of all DoD Recovery Act Funds received and reflect over 1,275 contracts to non-Federal vendors. Of the contracts awarded, over 81% were awarded to small businesses (64% of	Continue to award contracts and monitor execution with a target of \$1.9 billion in military construction and facility repair work underway by August 31.						
1	contract dollars). The Facilities Sustainment, Restoration and Modernization (FSRM) Program had obligations of \$62.7M during the past week, for a total of \$1,280.7M to date. Obligations for FSRM projects by Service this week were \$27.6M by the Army, \$19.3M by Navy,	Publication of the Interim Final Rule for the Expanded Homeowners Assistance Program for public comment in the Federal Register is expected in the next few weeks.						
2	\$11.8M for Defense-Wide appropriations, and \$4.0M by the Air Force.  Army projects included \$7.5M for multiple barracks repairs at Fort Drum, NY; \$0.6M for replacement of emergency lighting at Aberdeen Proving Grounds, MD; and \$17.1M in cooperative agreements by the Army National Guard with multiple states. Army Family Housing did have a reduction of \$0.8M due to the reversal of an erroneous obligation. The \$19.3M in Navy projects included repairs and maintenance projects of \$8.9M at Marine Corps Air Station, New River, NC and of \$3.4M at Camp Lejeune, NC; \$4.8M for Repair of Communications Cables at Camp Pendelton, CA; and \$1.2M for Sanitary Sewer Repair at Marine Corps							
3	Air Station, Yuma, AZ.  The \$11.8M in obligations for Defense-wide FSRM appropriations this week included \$11.6M for modernization of spaces for clinical use and hazardous material remediation at Ehrling Bergquist Medical Clinic, Offutt AFB. Air Force obligations included \$2.4M for energy projects at Offutt Air Force Base, NE and \$1.6M for airfield safety and anti-terrorism projects at March Air Reserve Base, CA.							
6	The ECIP program had \$2.8M in obligations during this past week.  The Near Term Energy-Efficient Technologies Program had obligations of \$1.7M this past week, including \$1.5M for the Air Force's Materials for Green Propulsion project.							
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
