dear Mr. Speaker:

Pursuant to the bipartisan agreement on Central America between the Executive and the Congress, the Congress has now voted to extend humanitarian assistance to the Wicaraguan Resistance at current levels through February 28, 1990. This assistance has been authorized and appropriated but will not be obligated beyond Hovember 30, 1989, except in the context of consultation among the Executive, the Senate Najority and Minority leaders, the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the Majority and Minority leaders, and the relevant authorization and appropriation committees, and only if affirmed via letters from the Bipartisan Leadership of Congress and the relevant Nouse and Senate authorization and appropriations committees.

This bipartisan accord on Central America represents a unique agreement between the Executive and the Legislative Branches. Thus, it is the intention of the parties that this agreement in no way establishes any precedent for the Executive or the Legislative Branch regarding the authorization and appropriation process.
